In 1897 three local clubs merged, Aylesbury Town, the Printing Works and the Night School, and Aylesbury "United" was formed writes Dave Gamage. Nicknamed "The Ducks" from the world renowned Aylesbury Duck, they joined the Spartan League in 1908 after spells in the South Eastern and Bucks Contiguous Leagues. In the first year they won the Western Division then beat Luton Clarence to lift the Spartan League title outright.

In 1913/14 Aylesbury lifted the Berks. & Bucks Senior Cup, then after the First World War when the Spartan League was extended they won the Division One West title in 1928/29. Relegation followed in 1933 although a return was made in 1935 by finishing second to Jurgens Purfleet. The "Ducks" dropped down again in 1938 but bounced back a year later as Division One Champions.

They became founder members of the Delphian League in 1951 and earned national fame by reaching the F.A. Cup First Round. In fact Aylesbury went down into the history books as being the only Delphian side ever to reach the First Round Proper. Finishing Runners-Up in 1952/53, they went one better twelve months later to win the League Championship.

 The Delphian League merged in 1963 with the Corinthian and Athenian Leagues and Aylesbury remained for thirteen years during which time they were Division Two Runners-Up in 1967/68. In

1976 a decision was made to turn Semi-Professional and United were elected to the Southern
 League Division One South. They were runners-up in 1979/80 and a year later an exciting run in

• the F.A. Trophy took them to the Quarter Finals.

In 1983 Trevor Gould (brother of Wales boss Bobby) was appointed Manager and in his second year the Club gained promotion to the Southern League Premier Division. However, their Turnfurlong

Ground was sold for re-development and they spent a season playing "home" games at nearby Tring
Town and RAF Halton. A worthy eighth place in the league was capped by winning the Berks. &

Bucks. F.A. Senior Cup for only the second time in their history.

Aylesbury gained promotion to the GM Vauxhall Conference by winning the Beazer Homes
(Southern) League Premier Division title in 1987/88 on goal difference from Dartford, and in June
1988 they entertained the full England team in a unique friendly. The new ground's record crowd of

6,031 packed in to see the National side play Non-League opposition for the first and only time to date.

The step up to the Conference proved too great and United were relegated after just one season. They joined the Isthmian Premier Division for 1989/90 and a successful campaign saw them gain their first victory over League opposition, beating then Division Four leaders Southend United 1-0 in the F.A. Cup at Buckingham Road. A year later Aylesbury became the first non-League side to feature

• in a 90 minutes live broadcast when their F.A. cup tie at home to Walsall was shown throughout Europe on BSkvB.

In 1992 Trevor Gould moved to a coaching role at Coventry City and the following two seasons fell
 short of success. In the summer of 1994 Steve Ketteridge, a member of the "Southend beating" cup

team, was appointed Manager and 1994/95 saw United have one of the best home records in the Division, eventually finishing fourth.

• But it was in Cup competitions where they made the headlines that season. In the F.A. Cup United

fought their way from the First Qualifying Round to the Third Round Proper before going down 0-4 to Premiership side Queens Park Rangers at Loftus Road. Their impromptu "Duck Walk" to

· celebrate a goal at Kingstonian in the Second Round has since been shown throughout the world.

To complete a memorable 1994/95 campaign Aylesbury lifted the Diadora League Cup beating
 rivals Slough Town in a Final penalty shoot-out. In September 1995 two goals by John Caesar gave

• the League Cup holders United a 2-1 victory at Champions Enfield to capture the 1995 Isthmian

· Charity Shield. In March 1996 Steve Ketteridge resigned and the team is now guided by Gary

Phillips the former Barnet goalkeeper and one of game's great characters.

The origins of senior football in Maidenhead can be traced back to October 1870 with the formation of Maidenhead FC. who subsequently played their first ever fixture, a friendly with Windsor Home Park on Saturday 17th. December 1870, a game that ended goal less. In 1871 the Club moved to their present ground at York Road and have never been away, thus eclipsing by three years Northwich Victoria's claim that they have the world's oldest continually used football ground !

The Club were one of the 15 entrants for the first ever FA Cup competition in 1871/2 and apart from 1876 when they decided against entering "to save the expense and keep disengaged for other matches" - they have entered every competition since. The

Club also entered the first Berks & bucks Cup Competition (1878/9) and the first FA Amateur Cup (1893).

Maidenhead entered the Southern League in 1894, but competing with the likes of Watford,

• Brentford, Fulham and Brighton proved to be too demanding and during their eight years in

- membership they finished last on three occasions and never finished out of the bottom three in the
  Second Division.
- They had a couple of seasons in the West Berks. League at the turn of the century before entering the
   Great Western Suburban League where they remained until the Great War.

Immediately after the War they amalgamated with the other club in the town, maidenhead Norfolkians and in 1922 entered the Spartan League where they remained until 1939, winning the

title three times. In 1936 the Club reached the semi-final of the F.A. Amateur Cup losing 4-1 to Ilford

• at West Ham in front of a crowd of 18,000. In the quarter finals they had beaten then mighty Southall

- at York Road in front of a record 7,989 crowd. A little earlier Jack Palethorpe had established a club
  record of scoring 66 goals in 39 games during the 1929/30 season he later went on to score for
- Sheffield Wednesday in the 1935 Cup Final.

Following the Second War the club became founder members of the Corinthian League. After a long period of mediocrity the club began to improve under Len Townsend and Jimmy price and the six

seasons between 1956 and 1962 saw the Corinthian League title won three times and they were
runners-up another twice. They also reached the 3rd. Round of the Amateur Cup losing at home in

front of a post-war record 5,597 crowd to West Auckland Town. It was also a period of development
at the club with York Road's acres of railway sleepers that formed the terraces being replaced by

at the club with Fork Road's acres of fanway sleepers that formed the terraces being replaced by
 concrete.

In 1963 the Club were invited into the Athenian League having failed to enter the Southern League.
 success did not follow, but a momentous 1970/1 season saw extended runs in both the F.A.
 competitions. The last sixteen was reached in the Amateur Cup with 4,000 watching the ultimate

• match - a defeat at the hands of Hendon.

In 1973 the Club entered the Isthmian League and after a settling in period, promotion was narrowly
 missed to the top flight in both 1979 and 1980. A lucrative sponsorship deal helped finance another
 promotion drive in 1985, but within two years the Club was relegated and had their unique 500 seat

grandstand destroyed by fire in an arson attack. The Chairman was also removed at an unprecedented AGM.

In May 1996 a management team of Martyn Busby, who was at Q.P.R. for many seasons, and Alan
 Devonshire, the former West Ham and England player was installed. They brought a vast amount of

· playing and coaching experience to York road. The summer was a busy one, with several players

leaving and many new ones arriving. With a better blend it was hoped that the club could finish in the
top half of the table for the first time since 1991 and indeed at the end of September the club was top

of Division One with Chuck Agudosi leading the ICIS League scoring charts. Unfortunately a bad run of results late in the year saw the Magpies plunge from 4th. to 18th. place despite the influx of

several new players. A return to form saw a run of fifteen games with just three defeats. Alan
Devonshire is now in sole charge and tonight is the Club's first cup final since 1971.
