## CENTREVIEW

## WELCOME TO THE HOTEL

This evening it is our pleasure to welcome to The Hotel for the Final of the Full Members Cup the players, officials and supporters of Croydon Football Club. We trust everyone connected with the Croydon club enjoy their short stay in our company and have a safe journey home after the game. We are also pleased to have with us this evening Directors and officials of the Ryman Football League. We would like to congratulate the Croydon club on winning the Championship of Division One and thus gaining promotion to the Premier Division for next season. Croydon averaged exactly two points a game, winning 25 and drawing 9. They suffered 8 defeats. To reach this stage of the competition Croydon have gained wins over Bognor Regis after penalties, Famborough Town, Oxford City, Bromley and Gravesend & Northfleet. As well as reaching the Final of this competition, Croydon also made it through to the Final of the Surrey Senior Cup when yesterday they played Woking, we hope they enjoyed their day and had a successful result. Whatever the result was they will have no doubt picked themselves up and be ready for this evening's encounter. Should after ninety minutes the scores be level, then thirty minutes extra time will be played. If this fails to give a result then the match will be decided by the taking of penalties. We look forward to en enjoyable game played in a sporting manner.

## FOURTH SPOT

Two very good away wins from our last two League games of the season saw us finish in a very creditable fourth position in the League. Congratulations to Colin McBride, David Crown and all the management team and of course all the players for this excellent performance. At Aldershot last Thursday it was the home side who made the early running, but our defence stood firm and keeper Steve Mead was rarely troubled. In the second half we took control of the game and two fine goals from Simon Webb and Paul Coombs gave us a well deserved 2-0 victory. Our first goal came after 58 minutes. A throw on to Martyn Lawrence was touched on to Webb and his long range shot completely deceived Stuart Searle in the Aldershot goal. Our second goal came in the 78th minute when George Georgiou put Coombs through on the right-hand side. Again it was a long range effort from Coombs which gave Searle no chance. On Saturday at Harrow Borough we had to work hard to gain all three points, twice coming from behind. The home side took the lead after four minutes when a cross from Marvin Walker was touched in by John Hurlock. We equalised ten minutes later. A ball from Gary Howard found Paul Coombs who looked offside. He was allowed to go on and firmly planted the ball into the net. The home side regained the lead after 25 minutes when Otis Roberts scored direct from a free kick. Again it took us ten minutes to equalise when George Georgiou scored from a Kevin Marsden cross. The winner came in the 78th minute when Georgiou raced through the Harrow defence and firmly planted the ball past Matt Pollard in the Harrow goal.

## PLUM PRE-SEASON GAME

Arrangements have been made for us to play a Manchester United XI in a pre-season friendly. Paul Parker the ex Manchester United and England full back is now assistant manager at Chelmsford City. A Manchester United side will be coming down to play Chelmsford on Saturday 5<sup>th</sup> August 2000. The next day they will be coming here to Ship Lane to play us with a 2.00 pm kick-off. It has been decided to make the game all ticket. Tickets will shortly be on sale here at The Hotel priced £8.00 (there will be no concessions). We certainly advise anyone who wants to see the game to get their tickets early. A soon as the fixture was announced we have received many enquiries. As well as this fixture arrangements are also being made to play a West Ham United XI. ## WITH US TODAY A SHORT HISTORY OF CROYDON FOOTBALL CLUB

Croydon Amateurs FC was founded on 17<sup>th</sup> April 1953 to provide senior amateur football in the then County Borough at the newly built Croydon Sports Arena in South Norwood. Whilst the idea for a senior club carrying the town's name had been mooted prior to the war, nothing had become of the suggestion and the catalyst proved to be the laying of the running track and the need for the football pitch to be used.

The Club's Founder Chairman was Jack Milsted and he retained the position until retiring in 1990. At the time of its inception, the club had nothing but goodwill and its initial funding was by way of public donations. The Surrey Senior League was specially extended to enable the fledgling club to have somewhere to compete and ten years were spent in that competition. The official ground opening was against Pegasus, the FA Amateur Cup holders and during that maiden season, the Club reached both the County League Cup and Charity Cup finals, playing against Dorking in both games. Dorking won the League Cup, but the Charity Cup was shared in front of a record 1600 crowd at the Arena. During the next nine seasons the Club won both League and Charity Cups and also finished runners-up in the League on a number of occasions, but they were unable to win the Championship.

1963-64 saw the Club elected to the Spartan League where they were destined to spend just a single season. But what a season it turned out to be! They won their first League Championship, winning 29 of their 34 League fixtures and scoring 134 goals in the process. The original clubhouse was also erected during this campaign, having been obtained from a local building site and rebuilt at the Arena.

Amateur football was undergoing changes during this period and the opportunity came for further advancement at the end of that campaign to the Athenian League. Within two seasons, the Second Division Championship had been won and promotion gained to the First Division where four seasons were spent. Unfortunately, the momentum that had sustained the club since its formation was lost and relegation back to Division Two came in 1969-70.

Summer 1970 saw the installation of floodlights and the arrival of South London bookmaker Jimmy Rose as team manager which proved to be a watershed in the Club's fortunes. Two successive promotions saw the Amateurs rise to the Athenian League Premier Division but at the end of the 1971-72 campaign, Rose announced that he would be taking over as team manager of Dulwich Hamlet. Inevitably, a season of struggle ensued in the Premier Division, with the majority of the previous season's first team departing to either Dulwich or Tooting.

With the impending end of amateur status, the club dropped its suffix during the summer of 1973 - it was only due to a Surrey Intermediate League side having the title Croydon FC back in 1953 that it had to be added in the first place. The end of October 1973 and with the club in the nether regions of the re-organised Athenian League First Division - the Isthmian's had introduced a second division that year - Ted Shepherd took over as manager, introduced a much more professional attitude and thus began one of the most successful periods in the Club's history.

After struggling early in the first two months of the season, Croydon revived and finished sixth, ending it by being elected to the Isthmian League Second Division. Founder Secretary George Burrows decided to call it a day at this point being replaced by former first team captain Jim Overall.

Their maiden season at the higher level started poorly, but the team gradually evolved and results picked up, culminating in an appearance in the inaugural Isthmian League Cup Final. However, at this stage, it was restricted to Second Division clubs - Tilbury winning the two legged final.

1975-76 proved to be a history making season as the Club went the whole season undefeated in the League. Forty-two games and yet Tilbury pipped them for the championship. It was only the second time in the Isthmian League's history that this had happened - Ilford were the other club back in 1906-07 and they only had to play ten games in their season.

Thirteen years were spent in the top flight of the Isthmian League - named the Premier Division after one season and whilst not gaining any League honours., the Club competed in a number of County Cup Finals. The Club won the Surrey Senior Cup for the only time in their history in 1981-82 beating Sutton United 2-0 in the final. Prior to that success, Croydon had lost to Tooting in the 1976-77 Surrey final and to Barking in the 1979-80 London Senior Cup Final.

The FA Cup run which culminated in two Second Round matches against Millwall in 1979-80 brought the club national recognition, as did, to a lesser extent, two appearances in the Second Round (last 32) of the FA Trophy in the early eighties. The profits from the FA Cup run were ploughed back into refurbishing the clubhouse, but this was razed to the ground in a fire believed to be arson for which the culprits were never caught.

The departure of Ted Shepherd came during a period when the team appeared to have lost its way and he was succeeded by Barry Webb for the 1984-85 campaign and then Adrian Hill (1985-87) who took the club to its highest ever League position - fourth in the Premier Division - in his first season in charge.

It was at this time that things took a turn for the worse! Like many football clubs, money - or rather lack of it - was the root of the problem and seven seasons of struggle ensued.

During this period, the local authority decided to redevelop the Arena, replacing the eight lane cinder track with a larger, tartan track - unfortunately, this meant that the pitch was further away from the stand thereby further decreasing the match day atmosphere. It also meant a large number of home fixtures being played away from the Arena with the corresponding loss in revenue.

Founder Chairman Milsted, together with two of the Club's other elder statesmen, Alf Haylock (who had also been involved since 1953) and Club President, Charles Waters retired in 1990 and the years that followed under new management culminated in the Club's name being dragged through the gutter and becoming synonymous with all that was bad.

There was little stability either on or off the field. Five Chairmen and eleven team managers, mounting debts and threats of closure are ample evidence of that. It could not have been a happy time to play for the Club. Perhaps the disciplinary record - partly due to the inadequate leadership at the time- is evidence of that.

The nadir was 1993-94 when broken promises concerning money saw the early season team walk out. Joe Fascione took over as manager and produced a team who performed for nothing but fought hard. Again, the mismanagement of the Club caused these players to walk out in frustration. In stepped the current Chairman, Ken Jarvie at the eleventh hour with the players of his Thornton Heath League side, Phoenix Sun, who stepped up nine levels of football to keep the Club's name alive. Not surprisingly, some very heavy defeats followed but the Club survived and gained another place in the annals of the Isthmian League, this time for the most goals conceded.

Summer 1994 saw the fortunes take a turn for the better and Dickson Gill was appointed to work alongside Ken Jarvie. The initial aim was to put together a team that was capable of holding its own in the Isthmian League Second Division and it finished not too far away from the promotion positions. The Club also reached the Fourth Round of the FA Vase in its maiden season in the competition.

1995-96 saw the Club regain its position back in Division One as runners-up to Canvey Island - a tremendous run in the New Year sealing the promotion place. The Quarter Final of the Isthmian League Cup was also reached for the first time in many seasons, a 120<sup>th</sup> minute penalty at Aylesbury sounding the death knell of the Club's challenge.

The first two seasons back in the First Division were battles against relegation, but last season, a 12 match unbeaten run starting in mid-March saw the club surge up to a final position of 8<sup>th</sup>, their highest placing since their Premier Division days. During the unbeaten run, Croydon's defence set a new club record of 883 minutes without conceding a goal.

The Club also has one of the country's leading ladies clubs under its wing and they did the double in 1995-96, winning the FA Women's Premier League Championship and also the FA Women's Cup, beating Liverpool in a penalty shoot-out at Millwall. Last season saw the women regain the Premier League Championship.

The Youth set-up too has been revived - originating in the seventies, it had several good runs in the FA Youth Cup, reaching the Fourth Round (last 16) in 1977-78 - only to lose to Peterborough. Many more than useful Isthmian League players have come through this set up and it is hoped that it will again produce a sting of players capable of challenging for first team places. Success has been gained in both the Southern Youth League and League Cup over the last five seasons.

1999-2000 has been one of the most successful in Croydon's history. A club record 19 match unbeaten run just after Christmas, saw Croydon take command of the Ryman First Division promotion battle and despite some recent jitters at home, the Trams (as they are now known) have gained promotion back to the Ryman League Premier Division after an 11 year absence and their first Championship title since 1965-66. To put the icing on the cake (and create an almighty end-of-season fixture headache for the beleaguered Match Secretary!), Croydon have also reached the finals of the Surrey Senior Cup (for the first time since beating Sutton United in the 1982 Final at Woking) and the Ryman League Full Members Cup.

## PEN PICTURES OF THE CROYDON PLAYERS

Ken JARVIE (Chairman/Manager) Six seasons on from rescuing the club from almost certain extinction, the 45 year old Scotsman still retains the same enthusiasm and passion in his ambition to make Croydon a force to be reckoned with again in senior Non-league football. As Joint Manager with Dickson Gill, he helped to guide Croydon to promotion to the Ryman First Division in 1995-96, before taking over as sole boss in October 1996. Best not to be approached for 24 hours after either a Croydon, Rangers or Scotland defeat!

THE REST OF THE MANAGEMENT The experienced Colin Turner joined Croydon as Assistant Manager in the summer of 1997 after managerial roles with Carshalton Athletic, Molesev. Dorking, Redhill and Banstead Athletic. John Finch joined Croydon as a player in September 1997 from Dulwich Hamlet after five seasons at Kingstonian and was appointed player/coach in the summer of 1998, Scotsman John Connell was promoted to the first team coaching staff in 1999 having previously coached the youths and reserves. Physio Ian Fairs joined the club three years ago and is assisted by long serving Stuart Wilbrey. Last but not least (although probably shortest!) ex Croydon Athletic manager Micky Taylor joined the club this season as first team scout.

James WASTELL (27) (Goalkeeper) Joined Croydon in March 1999 from fellow Ryman League side Molesey. Previously played in the Vauxhall Conference for Welling United while still a teenager and has also played for Chipstead. Started his Croydon career in spectacular fashion with 7 successive clean sheets.

Danny BOWER A very solid and strong full-back who was one of Croydon's most improved players last season. Has also performed with distinction as an emergency goalkeeper, keeping a clean sheet at Wealdstone in his first game between the sticks for Croydon. Joined the club in September 1998 from Dulwich Hamlet and was previously on Fulham's books..

Marc CROME Solid left sided defender who came up through the youth team ranks to earn a regular first team place toward the end of the 1996-97 season, despite the presence in the first team squad at that time of a certain Kenny Sansom.

Mark DICKINSON A strong central defender and occasional striker, re-joined Croydon in November

1994 after a brief spell with the club in season 1993-94. 'Geordie' as he is known, was previously with Whyteleafe and Crawley Town and has now made some 200+ appearances for Croydon. After retiring at the end of the 1997-98 season (including the ceremonial burning of the boots), Geordie watched the World Cup during that summer and changed his mind!

Ali REEVE A fiercely competitive defender or midfield player who joined the club in July 1994 from Dulwich Hamlet. After missing much of his first season with the club through injury, Ali has been a regular in the first team place ever since and is a key influence in the side.

Graham HARPER Right-sided midfield player who joined Croydon at the beginning of this season, after being released by Portsmouth last season. A good crosser of the ball and has also scored some important goals this season, including a hat-trick at Staines.

Chris DICKSON Skilful left-sided midfield player who originally joined Croydon in July 1994 from Dulwich Hamlet, spending three seasons with the club before moving on to Tooting & Mitcham. Rejoined Croydon in October 1998. Formerly a junior at Tottenham, Fulham, Wimbledon and Brentford and has won Scottish U-19 International caps.

Ben JUDGE A product of the youth team Ben has played in all positions including goalkeeper during his 200 odd games for the club but is now firmly established in the heart of Croydon's defence. Scores a few goals and is lethal from 70 yards as Bromley's goalkeeper will testify! A former Crystal Palace schoolboy, Ben's consistency last season helped him to claim a clean sweep of the club's Player of the Season awards.

Eben ALLEN Skilful and pacy striker who joined Croydon in February 1999 from Molesey. Previously with Yeading, Dulwich Hamlet and Hayes. Made an immediate impact scoring four goals in his first four games for Croydon before injury curtailed his season. Has been back amongst the goals this season and is Croydon's leading goalscorer.

Jamie NDAH Skilful striker who joined Croydon at the beginning in August 1998. Spent one and a half seasons with Torquay United making a number of League appearances and has also appeared for Barnet, Rushden & Diamonds, Kingstonian and Dulwich Hamlet. His appearances for Croydon have been limited by work commitments.

**Barry KINGSFORD** A hard working midfield player, joined Croydon in August 1999 from Premier Division Carshalton Athletic, with whom he had been with wince youth team days.

Nic McDONNELL A very sharp and exciting striker who joined the club halfway through last season after being released by Farnborough Town. A glut of goals for the youth team earned Nic an opportunity in the first team and he is another player who looks to have a very promising future. Scored 6 goals in 5 games while on loan at Tonbridge including a hat-trick on debut.

Richard VERCESI An experienced hard working midfield player or striker who joined Croydon in January 2000 after being released by Leatherhead. Has played Conference football for Welling United and was also formerly with Banstead Athletic.

Simon LIDDLE An experienced striker who joined the club in November 1999 from Corinthian Casuals, making his Croydon debut against Bognor Regis in the same month. Previous clubs include Dulwich Hamlet, Banstead Athletic and Canvey Island.

Craig DUNDAS A strong 19 year old midfield player or striker who joined the club last season from local football. Broke through into the first team ranks towards the end of last season, making his debut in February 1999 and has a very promising future ahead of him.

Karl SIMPSON A skilful left-sided attacking midfield player who made some 20 odd appearances for Norwich City's first team in the Nationwide league over the last two seasons. Recently moved south to start a teacher training course and signed for Croydon in August 1999.

**Desmond BOATENG** Midfield player who joined Croydon in March 2000 from Walton & Hersham. Previous clubs include Crawley Town, Egham Town and Yeading.

## A BRIEF HISTORY OF PURFLEET FOOTBALL CLUB

The Purfleet Football Club was founded as recently as April 1985 which makes it among one of the youngest Senior Clubs in the country. The first competitive game played by the Club was on 24 August 1985 against Canvey Island Reserves in Division One of the Essex Senior League and resulted in a 3-0 win.

The Club's ground forms part of the Thurrock Hotel & Oasis Leisure Complex and at first consisted of two pitches and dressing rooms in the main building. Under this set-up the Club could only complete at Junior Level. and midway through the season the playing area was turned round to give one pitch and the building of dressing rooms started in order for the club to become a self-contained unit away from the main Hotel Complex.

At the end of its first season the Club finished third in the League and was granted Senior Status by the Essex County FA The next season Purfleet were able to compete in the Senior Section of the Essex Senior League. Their first competitive match as a Senior Club was at home to Witham Town, which Witham won by 2 goals to 0. At the end of the season Purfleet had finished third in the League and were winners of the League Cup defeating Burnham Ramblers 2-0 in the Final. The Club also had a good run in the Essex Thamesside Trophy, defeating Aveley, East Thurrock United and Orient before going down 1-0 in the Semi-final at Billericay Town.

Planning permission was obtained from the local council for the erection of floodlights and the building of a grandstand. The floodlights went up in January 1988 and the first game under them was an Essex Thamesside Trophy match against Pennant which the visitors won by 2-1.

An application was made to join the Isthmian League (now the Ryman League) and by the rules of the 'Pyramid' would be conditional on the Club finishing in the top three. Purfleet not only won the League but also achieved the double retaining the League Cup by defeating Canvey Island 2-1. In their two seasons playing in the Essex Senior League Cup, Purfleet had the distinction of never having lost a game.

Election into the Isthmian League (then called the Vauxhall Opel League) was obtained at the League's AGM in June 1988 and the Club's new 300-seater stand was made ready for the start of the season. The first ever Isthmian League game was in Division Two North on 20<sup>th</sup> August 1988 at Hornchurch and resulted in a 1-0 win.

At the end of the season Purfleet finished runners up to Harlow Town and were thus promoted to Division One. Life in Division One proved to be beyond the capabilities of the team, and after struggling for most of the year were relegated back to Division Two North.

Season 1990-91 saw the Club have its best run in the FA Vase when it reached the last 32 before going out by 2 goals to 1 at Harwich & Parkeston. Purfleet finished in 7<sup>th</sup> place in Division Two North and thus ensured a place in the new Division Two following the splitting up of the two Regional Divisions.

Season 1991-92 must go down as the finest in the club's then short history, Champions of Division Two of the Diadora (Isthmian) League and winners of the Loctite Trophy. After loosing 2-0 at Witham Town at the end of November, the next 26 League games resulted in 20 wins 4 draws and just 2 defeats. In the Loctite Trophy Final, played at Sutton United, Purfleet came from 2 goals down to defeat Egham Town 3-2.

Full terracing was installed at the Ship Lane end of the ground which gave covered accommodation for 800 spectators. This has enabled the Club to obtain an "A" Grade Ground Grading. Since then further covered accommodation has been added at the M25 end of the ground. Season 1992-93 saw the Club finish 4<sup>th</sup> in Division One thereby just missing out on promotion. However it made up for it the following season by finishing as runners-up to Bishop's Stortford and thus gain promotion to the Premier Division. In just nine seasons the Club had gone from junior level playing on a roped off pitch to dhe Premier Division of one of the country's leading Non-League Competitions. The season also saw Purfleet have its best ever run in the FA Cup reaching the Third Qualifying Round and in the FA Trophy make it through to the First Round Proper before going out 2-0 at Enfield.

In it's first season in the Premier Division the Club had to be content with 16<sup>th</sup> place scoring 76 goals, only four other clubs bettered this total. However 90 goals were conceded at the other end. In a hectic last eight days of the season the club played a Third Round. Semifinal and Final of the Essex Thames-side Trophy together with its last Diadora League fixture. In the final against Chelmsford City at New Writtle Road a 2-0 success gained Purfleet the prestigious Thames-side Trophy.

The following season, 1995-96 saw the Club again finish in 16<sup>th</sup> place in the now ICIS League. However it was in the two national cup competitions where the Club had its best success. It reached the Fourth Qualifying Round of the FA Cup going out at Rushden & Diamonds in a replay. Some revenge was gained as in the FA Trophy a First Round victory was obtained on the same ground. A trip to Macclesfield in the Second Round saw the Club go out 2-1 to the eventual winners.

After a somewhat poor start to the 1996-97 season the Club finished the season in eighth place in the League. However early exits were made from both the FA Cup and FA Trophy. The Club had it's best run in the Essex Senior Cup before going out in the Semi-final to a strong Southend United side at Roots Hall. The trophy cupboard was not entirely bare as the Club won the Carlsberg Fair Play Award for the Premier Division.

Over the close-season further ground improvements were made with the installation of a new enlarged directors box and full terracing on the North side of the ground. A pre-season friendly at the start of the season against an almost full West Ham United First Team Squad saw a new ground attendance record of 1,578.

The start of the1997-98 season saw the appointment of Colin McBride as manager, taking over from Gary Calder who had been in charge since January 1991. McBride inherited just three players from the previous season's squad and turned to his former club, Essex Senior League side Concord Rangers for quite a number of his players. Purfleet finished in 10<sup>th</sup> place in the League and were runners-up in the Essex Senior Cup to Dagenham & Redbridge, going down 2-1 in a very entertaining game played at Ship Lane.

Last July West Ham United were once again the visitors for a pre-season friendly and an almost full First X1 attracted a new ground attendance record of 2,572. At the game the Club were very pleased to announce a major sponsorship with the local Lakeside Shopping Centre. The discussion and negotiations leading up to the sponsorship were featured on the BBC Television documentary 'Lakesiders'.

Last season the club finished fourth in the League, just being piped for third spot by local rivals Dagenham & Redbridge on goal difference. The Semi-final of both the Essex Thames-side Trophy and Puma Cup were reached, but rather surprisingly home defeats were suffered in both competitions to teams from lower Divisions within the Ryman League.

While the Club, since it's formation has been happy to be located within The Hotel, it's aim has always been to have a club house of it's own. At the conclusion of last season work began on the building of the 'Purfleet Club House' which it is hoped will be ready by the end of the year.

It is hard to believe that the Purfleet Football Club is only just over 14 years old and what it has achieved both on and off the field in this very short time is surely a unique achievement.

Steve MEAD (Goalkeeper) Aged 29. Singed from Essex Senior League side Concord Rangers in August 1997. Made his debut against Wivenhoe Town in the Guardian Insurance Cup on 9<sup>th</sup> September 1997 and then went 391 minutes before conceding his first goal. Won the Puma 'Safe Hands Award' during January of last season. An ever present in the League, missing only one game all season. Now has over 150 First Team appearance behind him.

Jimmy McFARLANE (Defender) Aged 33. Started his Purfleet career in August 1991 having signed from Clapton. Was with the Club until August 1996 before moving on to Concord Rangers. Re-signed before the start of season 1997-98 and has taken on his old role as Club captain. Has made over 330 First Team appearances and is now the Club's record appearance holder. Likes to join the attack for set pieces. An ever present for League games last season. Represented the Ryman League in the game against the FA X1 at Dulwich in December.

Martin CARTHY (Midfield) Aged 25. Signed in August 1996 from Erith & Belvedere. Has also played in the Conference with Welling United. Spent some time playing in Finland. A busy player who likes to get involved. Has over 200 First Team appearances behind him.

Jamie SOUTHON (Midfield/Defender) Aged 24. Signed at the end of August 1997 from Chelmsford City for his third spell at Ship Lane. First came to the Club in October 1995 from Dagenham & Redbridge. Gained County Youth honours. A serious injury kept him out of the game for some time, but is now a valuable member of the First team squad.

Mark BARRY (Defender/Midfield) Aged 22 Signed on loan from Canvey Island at the beginning of September, a deal which has now become permanent. Previously with Billericay Town.

Jon KEELING (Midfield) Aged 22. Singed from Tilbury at the end of February 1998. Another player who spent some time with manager Colin McBride at Concord Rangers. Likes to run with the ball. Last season's 'Supporters Player of the Year'

Kevin MARSDEN (Defender) Aged 22. Summer signing from Romford. Had previously played for Hornchurch and East Thurrock United. Quickly adapted to this level of football

Simon WEBB (Midfield) Aged 22. On loan from Leyton Orient until the end of the season. Previously with Tottenham Hotspur. Opened his Purfleet goal account in the recent League game against Canvey Island.

Paul COOMBS (Forward) Came on loan from Basingstoke Town at the end of October 1998, a move which has now become permanent Joined Basingstoke in October 1991 from Farnborough Town. Was also at Aldershot during their League days. At Basingstoke scored over 150 goals in more than 300 appearances.

Graham DORRELL (Midfield) Signed at the start of last season from Burnham Ramblers, had previously played for Great Wakering Rovers. Has had a number of injuries this season but beginning to get back to full fitness and staking a claim for a First Team place.

Danny CURRAN (Forward) Aged 19. Came on loan from Leyton Orient in January, a move which has now become permanent. Normally starts on the bench, but very likely to grab a goal when called on to the field

Stuart COCHRANE (Midfield)) Aged 19. Came up through the Purfleet Youth side before moving to Hornchurch. Re-joined the Club at the start of the season has had a number of games as substitute and had his first start in the recent Essex Thames-side Trophy win over Barking.

Colin McBRIDE (Manager) Appointed Purfleet manager in July 1997. Played in the Club's first ever game in August 1985. Went on to make over 230 First Team appearances. Before coming to Purfleet saw managerial experience at Aveley and Concord Rangers.
