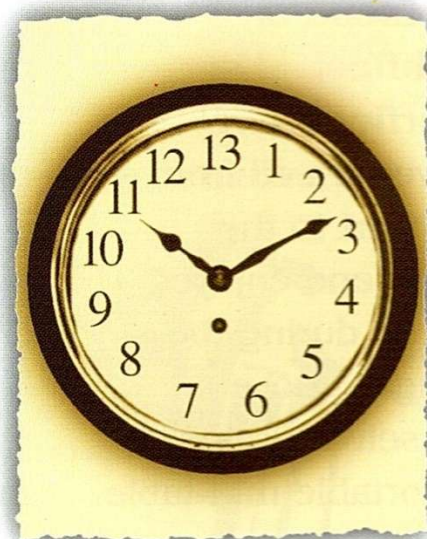

All about

PURFLEET

The Purfleet Football Club was founded as recently as April 1965 which makes it among one of the youngest Senior Clubs in the country. The first competitive game played by the Club was on 24 August 1965 against Canvey Island Reserves in Division One of the Essex Senior League and resulted in a 3-0 win. The Club's ground forms part of the Thurrock Hotel & Oasis Leisure Complex and at first consisted of two pitches and dressing rooms in the main building.

Under this set-up the Club could only compete at Junior Level, and midway through the season the playing area was turned round to give one pitch and the building of dressing rooms started in order for the club to become a self-contained unit away from the main Hotel Complex. At the end of its first season the Club finished third in the League and was granted Senior Status by the Essex County FA.

The next season Purfleet were able to compete in the Senior Section of the Essex Senior League. Their first competitive match as a Senior Club was at home to Witham Town, which Witham won by 2 goals to 0. At the end of the season Purfleet had finished third in the League and were winners of the League Cup defeating Burnham Rammers 2-0 in the final. The Club also had a good run in the Essex Thames-side Trophy, defeating Aveley, East Thurrock United and Orient before going down 1-0 in the Semi-final at Billericay Town.

Planning permission was obtained from the local council for the erection of floodlights and the building of a grandstand. The floodlights went up in January 1968 and the first game under them was an Essex Thames-side Trophy match against Penman which the visitors won by 2-1. An application was made to join the Isthmian League (now the Ryman League) and by the rules of the 'Pyramid' would be conditional on the Club finishing in the top three. Purfleet not only won the League but also achieved the double, retaining the League Cup by defeating Canvey Island 2-1. In their two seasons playing in the Essex Senior League Cup, Purfleet had the distinction of never having lost a game. Ejection into the Isthmian League (then called the Vauxhall Opel League) was obtained at the League's AGM in June 1968 and the Club's new 300-seater stand was made ready for the start of the season.

The first ever Isthmian League game was in Division Two North on 20th August 1968 at Hornchurch and resulted in a 1-0 win. At the end of the season Purfleet finished runners up to Harlow Town and were thus promoted to Division One. Life in Division One proved to be beyond the capabilities of the team, and after struggling for most of the year were relegated back to Division Two North. Season 1969-71 saw the Club have its best run in the FA Vase when it reached the last 32 before going out by 2 goals to 1 at Harwich & Parkeston. Purfleet finished in 7th place in Division Two North and thus ensured a place in the new Division Two following the splitting up of the two Regional Divisions.

Season 1991-92 must go down as the finest in the club's then short history. Champions of Division Two of the Diadora Isthmian League and winners of the Loric Trophy. After losing 2-0 at Witham Town at the end of November, the next 26 League games resulted in 20 wins, 4 draws and just 2 defeats. In the Loric Trophy final, played at Sutton United, Purfleet came from 2 goals down to defeat Egham Town 3-2. Full terracing was installed at the Ship Lane end of the ground which gave covered accommodation for 800 spectators.

This has enabled the Club to obtain an 'A' Grade Ground Grading. Since then further covered accommodation has been added at the M25 end of the ground. Season 1992-93 saw the Club finish 4th in Division One, thereby just missing out on promotion. However it made up for it the following season by finishing as runners-up to Bishop's Cleeve and thus gain promotion to the Premier Division.

In just nine seasons the Club had gone from Junior level playing on a roped off pitch to the Premier Division of one of the country's leading Non-League Competitions.

The season also saw Purfleet have its best ever run in the FA Cup reaching the Third Qualifying Round and in the FA Trophy making it through to the First Round Proper before going out 2-0 at Huddersfield. In its first season in the Premier Division the Club had to be content with 16th place scoring 76 goals, only four other clubs bettered this total. However 90 goals were conceded at the other end. In a hectic last eight days of the season the Club played a Third Round, Semifinal and Final of the Essex Thames-side Trophy, together with its last Diadora League fixture, in the final against Chelmsford City at New Whittle Road a 2-0 success gained Purfleet the prestigious Thames-side Trophy.

The following season, 1995-96 saw the Club again finish



in 16th place in the now ICS League. However, it was in the two national cup competitions where the Club had its best success. It reached the Fourth Qualifying Round of the FA Cup going out at Ruislip & Diamonds in a replay. Some revenge was gained as in the same ground. A trip to Macclesfield in the Second Round saw the Club go out 2-1 to the eventual winners.

After a somewhat poor start to the 1996-97 season the Club finished the season in eighth place in the League. However early exits were made from both the FA Cup and FA Trophy. The Club had its best run in the Essex Senior Cup before going out in the Semifinal to a strong Southern United side at Roots Hall. The trophy cupboard was not entirely bare as the Club won the Carlsberg Fair Play Award for the Premier Division.

Over the close-season further ground improvements were made with the installation of a new enlarged directors box and full terracing on the North side of the ground. A pre-season friendly at the start of the season against an almost full West Ham United First Team Squad saw a new ground attendance record of 1,578. The start of the 1997-98 season saw the appointment of Colin McEldine as manager, taking over from Gary Calder who had been in charge since January 1991. McEldine inherited just three players from the previous season's squad and turned to his former club, Essex Senior League side Concord Rangers for quite a number of his players.

Purfleet finished in 10th place in the League and were runners-up in the Essex Senior Cup to Dagenham & Redbridge, going down 2-1 in a very entertaining game played at Ship Lane. The following July West Ham United

were once again the visitors for a pre-season friendly and an almost full First XI attracted a new ground attendance record of 2,572. At the game the Club were very pleased to announce a major sponsorship with the local Lakeside Shopping Centre. The discussion and negotiations leading up to the sponsorship were featured on the BBC Television documentary 'Lakesiders'.

Season 1998-99 saw the club finish fourth in the League, just being piped for third spot by local rivals Dagenham & Redbridge on goal difference. The Semifinal of both the Essex Thames-side Trophy and Puma Cup were reached, but rather surprisingly home defeats were suffered in both competitions to teams from lower Divisions within the Ryman League. Last season, after a poor start, the Club again finished fourth spot in the League.

The finals of the Essex Senior Cup, Full Members Cup

Martin CARTER (Midfielder). Aged 25. Now in his fifth season with the Club having signed from Ebbw Vale in August 1996. Has also played in the Conference with Welling United. Spent some time playing in Finland. A busy player who likes to get involved. Has over 250 First Team appearances behind him.

Jamie SOUTHERN (Midfielder/Defender). Aged 24. Signed at the end of August 1997 from Chelmsford City for his third spell at Ship Lane. First came to the Club in October 1995 from Dagenham & Redbridge. After a few months left to play in Hong Kong for a while before moving on to Grays Athletic. Began his career with Southend United. A very determined player who has made over 190 First Team appearances.

John PURFLEET (Defender). Aged 27. Signed at the start of season 1997-98 from Billericay Town. Previously with West Ham United where he was a regular member of their reserve side. A very reliable defender who has over 160 First Team appearances behind him.

Martyn LAWRENCE (Midfielder). Aged 28. Followed manager Colin McEldine from Concord Rangers during the summer of 1997. Began his football at Southend United before moving on to Southern Manor, Barking and then Billericay Town. Has now made over 150 appearances for the Club. A tireless worker.

Garry HOWARD (Midfielder). Aged 28. Signed at the start of last season from Dagenham & Redbridge. Began his career with Great Wakering Rovers before moving on to Brighton & Hove Albion and Chelmsford City, before returning to Great Wakering. Moved to Billericay Town at the start of the 1994-95 season, staying until March 1997 and the move to Dagenham & Redbridge.

Steve PASHLEY (Defender). Aged 22. One of the few Purfleet players to have progressed through the youth and Reserve set-up. First came to the Club in 1995 as a member of the success Youth/Reserve side. Gained County Youth honours. A serious injury kept him out of the game for some time, but is now a valuable member of the first team squad.

Jon KEELING (Midfielder). Aged 24. Signed from Tibury at the end of February 1998. Another player who spent some time with manager Colin McEldine at Concord. Likes to run with the ball. For the last two seasons has been the Supporters Player of the Year. Represented the League in the game against the FA in November.

Nicola ADAMS (Midfielder). Aged 23. Signed from Boreham Wood at the beginning of November. Began his career at Barnet for whom he made 19 League appearances scoring one goal. Has also played for Billericay Town.

Colin SIMPSON (Forward). Aged 24. Recently signed from Chesham United. Spent last season at Billericay Town. Has also had a spell at Hendon and Sutton United. Was originally in the full-time game with Watford and Leyton Orient.

Martin BUGLIONE (Forward). Aged 32. Joined the club at the beginning of November from Asford Town. Scored on his debut against Altrincham Town. Has also played for Hampton and Boreham Wood as well as professionally in Scotland.

Martin LING (Midfielder). Currently on loan from Leyton

Orient, where he is youth team coach. Has also played for Ekeby City, Southern United and Swindon Town. While at Swindon played in the Division One Play-off at Wembley.

Gregg HEIGHWAY (Midfielder). Aged 19. Joined the Club

in October from Colchester United. Coming on as substitute against Grantham Town. His appearances have been mainly on the bench.

Colin McBRIDE (Manager). Appointed Purfleet manager in July 1997. Played in the Club's first ever game in August 1965. Went on to make over 250 First Team appearances. Before coming to Purfleet saw managerial experience at Aveley and Concord Rangers.

All about GRAVESEND & NORTHFLEET

ANDY FORD - MANAGER: Appointed Manager in September 1997, Andy had a football League career spanning almost 15 years. He played for a number of League clubs including Swindon, Southend United and Gillingham, where he was club captain. After retiring from football he concentrated on building his own business before moving back into the game via Youth Team football. Andy collected his first managerial trophy at the end of last season when the club were successful in lifting the Kent Senior Cup.

PHIL HANDFORD - ASSISTANT MANAGER: An experienced and skilful midfield player during his footballing days. He began his career at Gillingham, making 32 First Team appearances and a further 16 on loan to Wimbledon and Crewe. In 1986 he played for Maidstone United in the Conference, and then joined Wellington United, helping to establish them in the top flight of non-league football. He joined Sittingbourne for £15,000 in 1992 and then a year later moved to Margate. Phil joined the 'Fleet' as Reserve Team Coach in 1998, leading the side to Suburban League promotion in their inaugural season. He became Assistant Manager in the 1999/2000 season.

JAMIE TURNER - GOALKEEPER: Signed at the beginning of this season from Kent League side, Deal Town, Jamie has claimed the 'Number One' shirt at the club with some imposing performances in the early part of the season. At 20 years of age, Jamie has a big future in the game.

DARREN SMITH - GOALKEEPER: Began his career with Gillingham under the Youth Training Scheme before joining the 'Fleet' in 1996. Darren made a number of first team appearances in his first full season at the club and became regular first team 'keeper' during the 1998/99 season. Darren has established himself as a solid member of the squad, making 20 First Team appearances last season.

CRAIG WILKINS - DEFENDER: Craig started his playing career as a striker in Maidstone United's Youth Team and then in the Kent League for Maidstone Invicta. He joined Tonbridge at the start of the 1995/96 season, scoring goals regularly in the Dr Martens League. He joined the 'Fleet' during the 1997/98 season and has since converted to a central defensive role where he has proved highly successful with his pace and aerial power. In recent seasons Craig has won the Supporters and Players Player of the Year Awards - a big favourite with 'Fleet' supporters.

FRANCIS DUKU - DEFENDER: Francis joined the club in August 2000, having played for Dulwich Hamlet last season. He began his career with Reading as a youngster before moving into the Ryman League with Collier Row & Romford and Maidstone United. A strong, uncompromising and highly influential player. He has recently attracted interest from a number of Football League clubs.

JIMMY JACKSON - UTILITY: Joined the club in July 1994 when released by Charlton Athletic after spending three years at the Valley as a trainee. Local lad Jimmy soon adapted to life in non-league football

and has become a key member of the side, often attracting the attention of Football League scouts. The 24 year-old is the club's 'free kick specialist' and can play anywhere on the left side of the park. Jimmy is one of the most consistent players at the club and is a firm favourite with the crowd. He made his 500th appearance for the 'Fleet' on the first day of the current season.

AARON BARNETT - UTILITY: Aaron signed for the club in March 2000 from local rivals Erith & Belvedere having previously spent some time at Charlton Athletic. Aged 22, Aaron is a natural athlete and can play in almost any position on the football field. He



never gives less than 100% and is particularly strong in the air. A player who will undoubtedly play at a higher level.

NICK HEGLEY - MIDFIELD/FORWARD: Nick began as a trainee at Coventry City before signing for the 'Fleet' at the end of 1998/99 season. An extremely quick and promising young wide player who is an exciting prospect for the future. Nick scored 15 goals for the club last season and is currently building himself a reputation as one of the league's top goal scorers.

SCOTT LINDSEY - DEFENDER/MIDFIELD: An uncompromising player who never gives less than 100%. He began his career with Scunthorpe United before moving into non-league football with Gooles, Stafford Rangers, Burton Albion, Tamworth, Sutton Coldfield and Dridlington Town. He moved south in 1994 and was given another opportunity in the

Football League with Gillingham where he made 14 appearances. Other clubs include Leyton Orient, Dover Athletic and Canvey Island. Scott is club captain and is now in his second season with the 'Fleet'.

LEE SPILLER - MIDFIELD/FORWARD: A skilful and hardworking attacking midfielder player who began his career as a trainee at Gillingham. Originally joined Gravesend in 1995 before moving to Kent rivals, Margate, in 1996 where he drew the attention of several Football League clubs. He won the Supporters Player of the Year Award for the Thanet club in the 1998/99 season. The 'Fleet' re-signed him in May 1999 for a four figure fee. Lee was voted Player of the

career as a schoolboy at West Ham United before moving to Swindon Town as a YTS player, during which time he played for the Youth Team in the South Eastern Counties League. After two seasons he moved to Gillingham where he had a relatively short stay before signing for 'The Fleet' at the start of the 2000/2001 campaign. Danny is a local lad and is following in his father's footsteps having played for the club during the 1980s.

ROBERT OWEN - MIDFIELD: Played for Gillingham Youth as a schoolboy and eventually went on to play for the Reserve Team at Priestfield. At 18 years of age he moved to Doc Martens League, Sittingbourne, where he spent three seasons. He had a brief spell at Tonbridge Angels before returning to Sittingbourne. He signed for Gravesend during the 2000/2001 season and has quickly established himself as a regular first team player.

MITCH CRAWLEY - MIDFIELD: Played for Dartford Youth as a schoolboy before moving on to play for the First Team in the Doc Martens League. He spent five years at Dartford before moving to 'The Fleet' during the 1998/1999 season. He has developed his game over the past couple of seasons and is now an accomplished member of the first team squad. He is extremely comfortable in possession and is a fine passer of the ball.

PAUL BOOTH - FORWARD: Paul signed for Maidstone United as a schoolboy before moving to Tonbridge Angels and then on to Tunbridge Wells. Paul is strong, quick and good in the air and it is these attributes that had led him to score 16 goals in eight games at 'The Wells' before being snapped up for 'The Fleet' by manager, Andy Ford, in the early part of the 1998/1999 season. Paul travelled to Australia last season where he did some football coaching before moving back to rejoin the club at the beginning of this season. Paul has the undoubted ability to become one of the top strikers at this level.

DARREN SMITH - MIDFIELD: Darren began his career as a schoolboy at Doc Martens League, Sittingbourne FC. He progressed into the first team squad by the age of eighteen eventually establishing himself as a regular first team player. During season 1998/1999 he was signed for 'The Fleet' by manager, Andy Ford, only to return to Sittingbourne later that season. He was signed for the second time in March 2000 and has since established himself as a regular selection for the first team. Darren is another of the band of youngsters at the club, he is a skilful, hard-working, attack minded player who's game has developed immensely since moving into the Ryman League.

MATT LEE - DEFENDER: Matt began his career as a YTS player at Charlton Athletic and was subsequently offered a two year full-time professional contract at The Valley. He joined 'The Fleet' during the 1999/2000 season before leaving the club to travel and then having a brief spell at Sutton United. He rejoined the club at the start of the 2000/2001 season and is rapidly building himself a reputation as one of the quality defenders in the league.

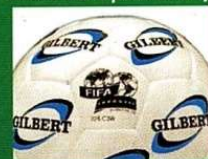
