## BISHOP'S STORTFORD



MARTIN TAYLOR (Goalkeeper) Age 27. Martin, who was signed from Epping Town is now in his fifth season at Rhodes Avenue and has made nearly 300 appearances. He had previously played for Charlton Athletic and Woodford Town.

PAT JACKMAN (Defender) Age 21. Joined Bishop's in February 1988 after spells with Kingsbury and Leytonstone-Ilford. He has represented London Youth and Camden Schools.

GRAHAM TAMBLYN-JONES (Defender) Joined the Blues last season from college. Has previously played for Croydon and scored his first goal for the club against Harrow in October.

PHIL HOPKINS (Defender) Age 28. The longest serving player at Rhodes Avenue having joined from Walthamstow Avenue during the 83/4 season Began his career as an apprentice at Colchester United and has also played for Chelmsford City.

BILLY HARRIGAN (Defender) Another player who joined in the early part of last season from Leytonstone Ilford. He has also played for Walthamstow Avenue.

PAT RYAN (Midfield) Pat worked his way through from the Reserves to make 40 appearances last season. He is now a regular first teamer. Scored seven times this season.

JULIAN BEDFORD (Midfield) Was spotted playing in an Herts. F.A. team and signed at he beginning of the season. Went straight into the first team as has so far scored four times. He was previously with Cuffley in the Herts. County League.

SCOTT YOUNG (Striker) Signed for the Blues from Wycombe last December. Now established as the leading scorer with nine goals. He has also played for Colchester Utd.

DEVON GAYLE (Striker) Age 28 Joined the club from Woodford in June 1987. He has previously played for Dagenham, Walthamstow Avenue and Hendon and has gained representative honours with the Vauxhall-Opel League. Scored six times this season.

LINCOLN MANDERSON (Midfield/Striker) Age 29. Signed for the Blues at the beginning of October and made his debut against Aylesbury United. His previous clubs include Dagenham and Leytonstone Ilford.

DAREN WENT (Central Defender) Joined the club at the end of last season and made his first team debut at the beginning of the current campaign. Has since established himself as a first team regular.

#### MARK KUENE (Defender/Midfield)

Recent signing from Division two North side, Witham Town. Mark made his debut at the end of January and has impressed in his first few appearances.

#### TERRY MILBOURNE (Midfield) Age 23.

Prior to joining Bishop's Stortford at the beginning of last season, Terry had four years at Cambridge City where he gained a Southern League First Division winners medal. He began his senior career with Harlow Town. He recently regained his first team spot after being out through injury.

#### JOHN NEAL (Striker) Age 23.

John signed for the Blues from Barking at the beginning of January, making his debut at Basingstoke. He was leading scorer at Barking this season with 11 goals and was also leading scorer at Dagenham last season. He began his career at Millwall and was an England Schoolboy International. He has scored four times so far for the Blues.

#### PETER RISLEY (Midfield/Defender)

Peter was signed from Vauxhall League Division Two North side Ware and made an impressive debut at Hendon at the end of last December. He has quickly established himself in the first team.

#### CLIFFORD SPENCE (Defender)

Another recent signing who made his debut at home against Kingstonian in February. Previously with Doncaster Rovers.

#### TERRY MOORE (Manager)

In his playing days Terry Moore appeared in goal for Bishop's Stortford in both the '74 Amateur Cup Final and the '81 FA Trophy Final, becoming the first player to pick up winners medals in both competitions. He re-joined the club in January 1987 as Assistant to the then Manager, John Radford and was promoted to Team Manager at the start of the current season.

#### TONY BASS (Assistant Manager)

In his playing career Tony Bass played for Dagenham, Hendon, Bishop's Stortford, Ilford, Enfield and Billericay Town. He won 15 England Amateur 'caps', was in the Gt. Britain Olympic Team and also represented both leagues and various counties. He won Amateur Cup Final medals with Hendon and Bishop's Stortford. On the managerial front he was previously Manager of Aveley and Reserve Team Manager at Leytonstone Ilford, Dagenham and Barnet.

Introducing ...

BISHOP'S STORTFORD FOOTBALL CLUB



Since its foundation in 1874, the club has participated in the Herts. County, Spartan, Delphian, Athenian and currently the Vauxhall (Isthmian) Leagues. Things began modesty enough when, in February of the first year, thirty local people gathered together and formed the club, which would play to Football Association rules.

The club firmly established itself in the area and subsequently moved into the Herts. County League. From there the club rose rapidly, entering first the Spartan and then the Delphian and Athenian Leagues in which competitions they won their first major championships, and led to them being invited to join the Isthmian League in 1971.

This was the beginning of great things for Bishop's Stortford as, in probably their best ever season, 1973/4, they won

the F.A. Amateur Cup in its last year of competitive existence, as well as the London Senior Cup and the Herts. Senior and Charity Cups. Although a more modest period followed, the "Bishop's" were once again in the limelight when, in the 1980/l season they won the Isthmian Division One Championship to regain their Premier status after three years absence and topped off a fine season by lifting the F.A. Challenge Trophy at Wembley, thus being the first club to be winners of both Amateur Cup and F.A. Trophy. The Bishop's also fought their way through from the Preliminary Round of the competition that year.

The following season was more than satisfactory, with the first team regaining the Herts. Charity Cup and adding the East Anglian Cup to the Honours Board. The reserve also won their league championship.

Season 1982/3 will long be remembered by players and supporters alike as the "Bishop's" went further in the F.A. Cup than at any time in their long history before finally bowing out to Middlesbrough in the Third Round, but only after a replay. They also took the scalp of Third Division Reading during that cup run. Once again the Herts. Charity Cup was retained and they were finalists in the East Anglian Cup.

In 1985/6 opposition from the Football League again visited the Rhodes Avenue Stadium in the Football League in the form of Peterborough, a draw was obtained, but the replay was lost by a 3-1 scoreline. A year later Colchester Utd. were visitors in the same competition and yet again a draw was obtained, only for defeat to follow on the League side's ground. The club did win the County Senior Cup however, defeating Letchworth 2-0 at Hitchin.

Last season the club finished in seventh place and won the Vauxhall League AC Delco Cup, defeating Farnborough Town 1-0 in the Final at Hayes. In today's competition, the semi-final stage was reached and a draw in front of a crowd of over 1,000 was recorded against Barnet. In the second leg the North London side were 4-0 winners.

HYDE UNITED FOOTBALL CLUB



Although the present Hyde United club was formed in March 1919, another club simply called Hyde F.C. had been in existence since 1885, but had folded two years before the "Tigers" were formed due to the lack of players, most fit men being members of the armed services at the time. During their 32 year existence the original Hyde F.C. were largely remembered for the 26-0 F.A. Cup beating they received at the hands of Preston NE at Deepdale in 1887 - still the record for a competitive match in England.

Hyde recovered to become one of the strongest clubs outside the Football League in the North West, winning the Manchester League title in 1901. A few years later they joined forces with Hyde St. George's and ended their days playing in the Lancashire Combination.

The new club, formed immediately after the war, joined the Manchester League and had instant success, lifting the championship in 1921 and by 1930 had won the title five times. This success allowed them to move into the Cheshire County League in 1930 and they picked up their first trophy four years later when they won the league cup.

The decade after the Second War proved to be the golden years for the club, the "Tigers" were the first Cheshire Senior Cup winners in 1946 being the first of many trophies that arrived at Ewen Fields in the next decade. They won the League Cup in 1953 and the "double" a year later. 1955/6 saw them retain the League championship and they finished runners-up in 56/7, 57/8 and 59/60.In 1954 they reached the first round of the FA Cup, losing 5-1 to then Football League team Workington away from home.

In the 60's the club made steady progress and were founder members of the Northern Prem. in 1968. However, after only two years they resigned and returned to the Cheshire County League where they spent the rest of the decade, winning the league cup in 1973.

The 80's started with them finishing runners-up in 1981 and the championship a year later, this allowed them back into the N.P.L. and in the first year back (81/2) they finished runners-up to South Liverpool in the NPL League Cup and scored 91 goals in the League. They returned to Maine Road, Manchester for the 85/6 Final and emerged as 1-0 victors over Marine in a close game.

The following summer Hyde took the step of installing an artificial surface at their Ewen Field ground, now known as the Tameside Stadium, and during that season won the Lancashire Floodlight Trophy.

1987/88 was also a successful season finishing runners-up in the N.P.L. and also retaining the Floodlight Trophy. Last season however, topped even that with the club finishing runners-up in the N.P.L. and beaten finalists only on penalties to Barnet in the Clubcall Cup. As well as that the club also reached the semi-finals of the F.A. Trophy where they went down to the eventual winners. Telford Utd. They also reached the semis of two other cup and the performances earned them the "North West Team of the Year" award.
