This afternoon sees the completion of the Isthmian League fixtures for the 1978/79 season, and what better way to finish a campaign than with the Final of the Hitachi Challenge Cup Competition.

On behalf of the League, a very warm welcome is extended to all our visitors to the Wexham Park Stadium, especially the representatives from Hitachi Sales (United Kingdom) Limited and, of course, the officials, players and supporters of the two competing clubs - Hayes FC and Enfield FC. We also extend our thanks to the officials of Slough Town FC for allowing us to use their ground and facilities.

The Isthmian League Challenge Cup Competition was commenced in 1974/75 season as a subsidiary cup open only to Second Division clubs. The initial winners were Tilbury who defeated Croydon in a two-legged final. The following season the competition was open, as an option, to all clubs in the constitution and again Tilbury reached the final, only to lose on this occasion to Slough Town. In 1976/77 season entry became compulsory to all league clubs. Hendon became the third winners when they beat Barking 1-0 on Harrow Borough's ground in a very exciting final.

In 1977/78 season the competition was sponsored by Hitachi Sales (UK) Limited and renamed the Hitachi Cup Competition. It is thanks to the giant Japanese electrical concern that the League Cup Competition has expanded out of all recognition since its inception five seasons ago. Dagenham were the first winners of the Hitachi Cup, achieving a 1-0 victory over Leatherhead at Dulwich Hamlet in another very exciting final.

Hitachi have sponsored the competition again this season to the tune of £6000 in cash and equipment. Details of this seasons awards appear on page 5 of this programme. Back in September, the forty clubs from Divisions One and Two entered the First Round. The Twenty winners clashed in the Second Round to produce ten successful clubs to join the twenty-two Premier Division sides in the Third Round. Harrow Borough were the last of the non-premier Division sides to be eliminated when they lost to Hayes at the semi-final stage.

Enfield and Hayes have already met three times this season. Both league matches ended in 1-1 draws, whilst Enfield gained a narrow 1-0 London Senior Cup win when the sides last met at Church Road in January.

And finally, we hope that the weather will be kind to us and that we shall witness a keen and interesting game in keeping with this competition and that when you leave you will have enjoyed seeing our Hitachi Challenge Cup Final.

TERRY MOORE

Joined Enfield just after the start of last season from Walthamstow Avenue. Played for Clapton, Hitchin, Bishops Stortford and Ilford. Won FA Amateur Cup Winners medal with Stortford in 1974 final. Aged 31.

MARK WRIGHT

In his third season at Enfield having joined them from Millwall. Previously with Chelsea and Charlton. Over 150 appearances for the club. Aged 25.

JOHN TONE

Joined Enfield From Clapton in March 1975. Over 200 first team appearances for the club. Aged 25.

TONY JENNINGS

The Club Captain, Tony joined Enfield in March 1974 from Hendon. Won Amateur Cup Winners medal with Hendon in 1972. Has made over 350 appearances for Enfield. Aged 28.

TONY GIBSON

In his second spell at Southbury Road having re-joined from Ilford. Tony has played in two Amateur Cup Finals for Enfield in 1972 and for Bishops Stortford in 1974. Has made over 300 appearances for the club. Aged 26.

KEITH ELLEY

Re-joined Enfield last season from leytonstone. Spent four years as a junior at Tottenham and two years at West Ham in their youth side. Aged 21.

MICKY O'SULLIVAN

Enfield's longest serving player having joined the club at the start of the 1973/74 season from Slough. Has made over 350 appearances for the club. Aged 28.

TONY BASS

In his second season at Enfield having joined from Leytonstone. Formerly at Dagenham, Hendon, Bishops Stortford and Ilford. A former England Amateur International. Aged 31.

STEVE KING

Joined Enfield in October 1977 from Leytonstone after five seasons with the Granleigh Road club. Aged 23.

JOHNNY BISHOP

In his third season at Enfield having joined from Southern League club Hillingdon. Played for that club in the 1971 FA Trophy Final. Aged 29.

NICKY GLOVER

Joined Enfield in September 1977 from Tooting after three seasons with them. Has also played for Bexley United, Gravesend, Leytonstone and Kingstonian. Aged 29.

- NEIL BUNKER Defender who signed for Hayes from Boreham Wood last season. Hitchin and Bishops Storford are his previous clubs. Strong in the air and always dangerous in the opponents penalty area.
- ALAN CARRINGTON Defender who is the club's longest serving player with well over 250 appearances. Signed from Walthamstow Avenue five seasons ago. Aged 27.
- LAURIE CRAKER A midfield player who joined the club from Watford, having previously played for Dartford.
- GARY GILBERT A young forward who has broken into the first team this season. Possesses a powerful shot.
- JOHN HARRISON Signed from Dartford in January 1979. A small 21 year old midfield player.
- ALLAN JARRETT Goalkeeper. Only ever present in the side this season. Joined Hayes from their near neighbours Southall and was previously at Wembley.
- MICK McGOVERN Joined the club from Harrow during the summer of 1977. Previous clubs include QPR and Swindon. Former midfielder who is now a most accomplished defender.
- PAT MORRISEY Signed from Dartford in November 1978. A midfield player. Previously with Watford, Coventry and Aldershot. A very experienced player. Aged 31.
- BOBBY WILES A busy midfield player who joined from Walthamstow four seasons ago.
- COLIN NORMAN A recent signing from Tilbury. A striker who was formerly with Southern League Dartford.
- RON NELSON An 18 year old forward in his first full season of Isthmian League Football. Has scored 10 goals so far this season.
- DAVE HATTON A midfield player in his early 20's. Signed from Wembley during the last close season. Always ready to join the attack.
- JOHN WARD Like Dave Hatton, came to Church Road with manager Martin Hackett from Wembley at the start of the season.

Our Hosts: Slough Town F.C. -

Our hosts, Slough Town, were formed in 1890 as Slough United by the Amalgamation of Slough Albion and the Young Mens Friendly Society FC who took over The Swifts. Present name was adopted in 1947. Slough joined the Isthmian League in 1973 and achieved promotion to the top division in their first season. Their previous leagues have been the Southern Alliance, Great Western Suburban League, Herts & Middx League, Spartan League, Corinthian League and the Athenian League. On eight accasions Slough have won the Berks & Bucks Senior Cup and they have been beaten finalists on three accasions.

This season Slough will finish in the top five of the Premier Division. Harrow Borough defeated them 2-0 in the Fourth Round of this competition, and in the FA Trophy they lost away to Maidstone 3-1 in Round Two.
