WELCOME TO CHURCH ROAD

Good Afternoon everyone and a very special welcome to Church Road from Hayes Football Club, supporters and all concerned. Today's game is the natural highlight of the Berger Isthmian Football season and it is our great pleasure to welcome for this occasion the players, officials and supporters of two fine football teams. We also extend a warm welcome to all other visitors especially the representatives from Hitachi Sales (United Kingdom) Limited.

We at Hayes are delighted that Slough Town and Walthamstow are the two competing teams today insofar that although it may not be wise to suggest that we have favourite clubs nevertheless if we were to have favourites both our visitors would be amongst them.

Hitachi have again sponsored the competition to the tune of $\pounds 6,000$ the details of which appear elsewhere in this programme and we are of course delighted not only with their continuing sponsorship but also their continuing interest in our league.

This is the second time that we have had the pleasure of staging the final, the first time being in the 1975/6 season when Slough Town were also finalists and got their name on the Trophy by beating holders, Tilbury 4-0.

Today's finalists have already met twice this season in the league, Slough winning both games however I am sure Walthamstow will be out to rectify this today. We know that they are well capable of doing this by the way they played in our two semi-final games a few weeks back. Finally we hope that the weather will be kind to us and that we shall witness a fine game in keeping with the high traditions that have been set for the Hitachi Challenge Cup Final.

WELCOME TO SLOUGH TOWN

Slough Town were formed in 1890 as Slough United by an amalgamation of Slough Albion and the Young Men's Friendly Society F.C. who took over The Swifts. The present name was adopted in 1947. Originally they played in the Southern Alliance followed by the Great Western Suburban League and eventually became founder members of the Spartan League. They played in this league until the beginning of the Second World War and during the hostilities played in the Herts and Middlesex League. At the end of the war they helped found the Corinthian League, winning the championship in the 1950/51 season.

In 1963 they entered the Athenian League and won the 1st Division Championship in 1964/65 season thus gaining promotion to the Premier Division. They took the League title in 1967/68 along with the championship of the Wycombe Floodlight League.

In 1970/71 the club won the Senior County Cup as well as reaching the semi-final stage of the Amateur Cup. The next season they again won the championship plus the league cup, and the Berks and Bucks Senior Cup and the Premier Midweek League for good measure.

In 1972/73 they again did the double and lost 0-1 in the Amateur Cup Final to Walton and Hersham.

Entering the Second Division of the then Rothmans Isthmian League in 1973/74 season, they gained promotion into the First Division by being runners-up to Dagenham, they also won their section of the Premier Midweek League.

In the 1975/76 season Slough Town were back on the cup trail again when they won the Rothmans Subsidiary Cup (now the Hitachi Cup) by beating Tilbury 4-0 in the final. They also reached the 3rd round of the F.A. Trophy losing 0-2 away to Runcorn.

Further honours came in the 1976/77 season when the senior cup was regained and Slough progressed into the semi-finals of the F.A. Trophy, however Dagenham barred their path to Wembley by winning 6-2 on aggregate.

This year apart from reaching this final they have already won the county cup and have looked strong contenders all season for the league title.

WELCOME TO WALTHAMSTOW AVENUE

Walthamstow Avenue were formed in 1900 and have played in the Isthmian League since 1939, a status achieved like many of the present clubs in the league, via the well worn paths of the Spartan and Athenian Leagues. The name of Walthamstow Avenue is synonymous with success. Twice winners of the coveted but now defunct Amateur Cup, eight times winners of the London Senior Cup and countless wins in the Essex Senior Cup are just a few of the honours won by this great club. They have also won the Isthmian League Championship three times and been runners-up six times, the most recent being last season. Added to this they have achieved the rare distinction for a non-league club (amateur at the time) of reaching the 4th round proper of the F.A. Cup, and have appeared many times in the earlier rounds.

Their league form this season hasn't been up to their normal high standards but that will no doubt be rectified next season. In the league last year they only succumbed at the last possible moment in their attempt to win the title in a nail biting finish with Enfield. They still managed to win 24 of their 42 fixtures.

PREVIOUS WINNERS (1974-1977 called League Cup)

1974/5	Tilbury defeated Croydon in a two-legged match.
1975/6	Slough Town achieved a 4-0 victory over holders, Tilbury at the scene of today's game.
1976/7	Hendon beat Barking 1-0 at Harrow Borough to become the first winners of a magnificent new trophy which is kindly donated by Mr P Walsh the Slough Town President.
1977/8	Dagenham defeated Leatherhead 1-0 with a Mal Harkins goal on Dulwich Hamlet's ground.
1978/9	Enfield defeated Hayes at Slough Town's ground Nicky Glover scoring for Enfield after 30 minutes, Bobby Wiles replying for Hayes five minutes later and the winner coming by virtue of an own goal by Hayes player John Ward.
1979/80	Enfield again win the trophy becoming the first team to hold the cup twice.

HITACHI LIMITED

Hitachi, well known manufacturers of quality radios, televisions and hi-fi equipment, are sponsoring the League Cup for the third year running to the value of £6,000. This is broken down to £3,500 cash prizes and £2,500 in products. The Cup Winners collect £600 and the losing finalists £300. The two clubs also collect £320 each for their semi-final wins. The four winners of the 4th round matches each receive £110. The eight 3rd round winners, £50 each, the sixteen 2nd round winners, £30 each, and the thirty two 1st round winners £20 each, and the losers £10 each. In addition all the twenty four players in the final receive mementoes (to a total value of £550). The four semi-finalists products to the value of £150 each and the 4th round winners and losers products totalling £75 each. The Second Division club to go the furthest in the competition get goods totalling £375 as does the club from the First Division.
