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THE MAN IN THE MIDDLE

Today's match referee is Mr. ALFIE BUKSH. Alfie was born in the Fiji Islands and is married with one daughter. Aged 36, he works for the Post Office. He joined the Isthmian League in 1972 and was promoted to the Full List in 1978/9. He is a Football League linesman, and was the referee for the 1980 Middlesex Senior Cup Final between Enfield and Staines Town.

INTRODUCING KINGSTONIAN F.C.

Kingstonian, one of the best known non-league Clubs in the country, were formed in 1885 as Kingston and Surbiton Y.M.C.A. F.C. This name was changed three times in the next nine years to Saxons F.C., Kingston Wanderers F.C. and Kingston upon Thames F.C. Then in 1919 an amalgamation of two clubs, namely Kingston Town and Old Kingstonians, formed Kingstonian F.C.

Kingstonian F.C. were elected to the Athenian League and won the Championship in 1924 and 1926, and eventually joined the Isthmian League at the start of the 1929/30 season.

They won the Isthmian League Championship in 1934 and 1937, and they won the F.A. Amateur Cup in 1933, and were runners-up in 1960. They have also won the London Senior Cup and the Surrey Senior Cup on several occasions.

This season, with one league game to play at the time of writing, Kingstonian are in the top half of the First Division with 55 points from 39 games, having scored 57 goals and conceded 55.

Ken Ballard took over as Team Manager, when Kingstonian were relegated from the Isthmian League Premier Division, and he has moulded together a good attacking side, which has pressed

for promotion in each of its two seasons in Division One, only to finish 5th and 6th respectively. His Assistant Manager is Roy Nairn, and the 1st XI Trainer is Alex Nairn.

GRAHAM YATES - Goalkeeper. He has made over 160 first team appearances since making his debut for K's on 18/8/1979. He previously played for Staines Town, Hayes and Walton & Hersham.

ALAN DAVIES - An experienced defender who made his first team debut on 20/3/1982, having joined the Club from Hillingdon Borough. Previously with Barnet, Q.P.R. and Wycombe Wanderers.

PAUL JABLONSKI - An attacking full back who joined the Club from Sutton United. He made his debut on 25/9/1979 and has made over 150 appearances. Also played for Corinthian Casuals.

IAN ARMSTRONG - Central Defender. He has made nearly 50 appearances since making his debut on 29/8/1981. He joined the Club from Willesden and has become a regular in the team.

SEAMUS HORGAN - A central defender, and the Club's most recent signing. He joined the K's from Dartford and made his debut on 23/3/1982. Previously with Wealdstone.

CLIFF JONES - Formerly a full back, but now a midfield player, he is in his second spell with K's. He made his debut on 16/8/1980 and is nearing his 50th appearance for the Club.

COLIN STAPLEHURST - A midfield player who likes to move forward. He joined the Club from local junior football and made his debut on 11/10/1980. Has recently been out with a bad injury.

JIM BAPTIE - Another player in his second spell with K's. He joined for the first time in 1976 and made his debut on 8/3/1976. He has scored 50 goals in nearly 120 appearances.

ALAN MORTON - An expensive signing from Woking, he is K's leading goalscorer with 24 goals this season. Made his debut on 19/1/1981 and has since made over 70 appearances.

DAVE ALEXANDER - Club Captain. He joined K's for a sizeable fee from Woking and made his debut on 16/8/1980. Has also played for Wycombe Wanderers. He has more than 110 appearances.

JESTER WILLIAMS - A striker with a fine reputation for scoring goals. Joined K's from Staines Town and made his debut on 18/11/1980. Has scored over 40 goals in 75 appearances.

MALCOLM SKINGLE - A striker who has played for Bishop's Stort., Ware Town, Boreham Wood and Hertford Town. He made his debut for K's on 4/10/1980 and has scored 17 goals in 80 appearances.

IAN RAE - A utility player who joined K's from Hampton and made his debut on 27/10/1979. Has made over 130 appearances for the first team, mainly in the defence.

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INTRODUCING LEYTONSTONE / ILFORD F.C.

Two long established Clubs amalgamated for the 1979/80 season, and became Leytonstone/Ilford F.C., and have since enjoyed three very successful seasons. The history of the two names goes back into the last century. Ilford F.C. were formed in 1881, and Leytonstone F.C. were formed in 1886, originally named the Cedars Football Club.

Both Clubs found themselves in difficulties in the early seventies and it was Leytonstone who first suggested the idea of amalgamation. In their first season they not only won promotion from Division One of the Berger Isthmian League, but added the London Senior Cup to their achievements, beating the holders, Barking, 3 - 2 at Dagenham. Last season they finished in a respectable fourth position in the Premier Division, with 69 points from 42 games. Only three teams scored more goals than the 78 scored by Leytonstone/Ilford.

This season, the Club are poised to win the Berger Isthmian League Championship, and by the time you read this they could well have clinched the title. Last Saturday they beat Colchester United 2 - 1 after extra time, in the Essex Senior Cup, and next Saturday they travel to Dulwich Hamlet where they will meet Farnborough Town in the Final of the London Senior Cup.

DAVE MALLETT - Goalkeeper. Took over as regular first choice midway through last season. Joined the Club in 1979 from Orient, where he played for the Youth and Reserve teams.

DAVE JACQUES - Defender. Joined the Club from Junior football several seasons ago and has held a regular place at full back. He has also played in midfield on a few occasions.

KEITH HAYZELDEN - Defender. He is another product of local football. He has developed into one of the best full backs in the League. He is the Club's penalty kick expert.

STEVE SCOTT - A 19 year old who joined Leytonstone/Ilford from Cheshunt last season. He is a fine player with a very promising future and has gained a regular place in the side.

MARTIN McCAYNA - Central Defender. He has been watched by scouts from Football League Clubs. Joined the Club from Aveley at the end of 1975. Previously with Southend United.

DEREK WELLS - Defender. A well known face in Isthmian circles, he joined the Club in 1979. He is a London cabbie, and has also played for Walthamstow Avenue and Leatherhead.

DEREK BROWN - Forward. He joined the Club in January 1982 from Dartford, having previously played for Bromley. He is a left sided player and has added width to the attack.

PAUL POWELL - Forward. He is the Club's second highest scorer this season. He scored the all important goal in the Semi-Final replay. He is a product of the Youth and Reserve X1s.

MICKY DINGWALL - Forward. A Club record fee was paid when he joined Leytonstone/Ilford from Barking, last season. He is the Club's leading goalscorer this season with more than 20 goals.

KEVIN STEAD - He has recently broken into the first team squad. He made one first team appearance for Arsenal, and has also played for Tottenham Hotspur. Usually wears number ten.

JOHN BORLAND - Midfield. He joined the Club at the beginning of last season from Enfield. Has also played for Dagenham and Scottish League side, Queen's Park F.C.

JIMMY HOLDER - Utility Player. He is equally at home in defence, midfield or attack. He was the Club's leading scorer and "Player of the Year" last season. Joined from Dagenham.

TERRY HARRIS - Forward. He joined the Club from Enfield at the start of last season. He has also played for Sutton United and Dagenham, but has been injured for most of this season.

HITACHI LIMITED

Hitachi, well known manufacturers of quality radios, televisions and hi-fi equipment, are sponsoring the League Cup for the fourth year running to the value of £6,000. This is broken down to £3,500 cash prizes and £2,500 in products. The Cup Winners collect £600 and the losing finalists £300. The two Clubs also collect £320 each for their semi-final wins. The four winners of the 4th Round matches each receive £110. The eight 3rd Round winners, £50 each, the sixteen 2nd Round winners, £30 each, and the thirty two 1st Round winners £20 each, and the losers £10 each. In addition all twenty four players in the final receive mementoes (total value £550). The four semi-finalists products to the value of £150 each and 4th Round winners and losers products totalling £75 each. The most successful FIRST and SECOND Division Clubs each get goods totalling £375.
