OUR VISITORS By MICHAEL KNOX (Bucks Free Press)

In the past few seasons no two Isthmian League teams have played more open and attractive football than Sutton and Wycombe—and it is fitting that they should meet in this first Hitachi Cup Final to be played over two legs.

It is therefore sad that Larry Pritchard, who has graced both sides during a distinguished football career, will be unable to play. Larry, now 38, broke an arm during the semi-final against Bognor—and there is now serious speculation that the Sutton assistant manager may have played his last senior game. If so, his talented midfield skills will be badly missed.

Also in that game Paul McKinnon broke his nose, and although he is now fit again, he will find it difficult to regain a first team place for which there is plenty of competition.

For instance, Micky Joyce, scorer of 40 goals this season, is not a certainty to start the game. A twisted ankle followed by a back strain caused him to miss several matches, and with the team playing so well of late he has had to sit on the substitutes' bench.

The man in form is former Dagenham striker Ricky Kidd, who scored twice in their recent 4-0 victory over Tooting & Mitcham in the Surrey Senior Cup Final. It has been quite a cup year for Sutton, who will play Woking in the London Senior Cup Final after their semi-final victory over Welling.

They are likely to have three pairs of brothers in the first leg tonight. There are the Sunnucks, winger Ray and full back Andy, sons of former Wycombe player Alan Sunnucks; defenders Nigel and Mark Golley; and the well-known John and Tony Rains. The Rains brothers used to play at the back, but John has switched most successfully to the role of prolific striker and has scored 20 goals—though he still retains his favourite No. 4 shirt.

Sutton's previous best performance in the Hitachi Cup was in season 1979-80 when they lost 2-3 in the final to Enfield at Harrow Borough.

The second leg takes place at Sutton on 30th April, and while the Wanderers complete their league programme and travel to Italy, Sutton find themselves with a number of matches left—and playing three games a week on occasions.
