OUR VISITORS by Michael Knox (Bucks Free Press)

Sutton United are making their third visit to Loakes Park this season and there is probably no other Isthmian League team that the Wycombe Fans would rather see so often. Barrie Williams's men are renowned for their attractive play and good sportsmanship.

In their first visit on the very first day of the season, Wycombe beat them 1-0 to win the Dylon Charity Shield. There followed an exciting 2-2 draw in the league game. So they will be hoping to go one better again this time. Of course the teams met in last year's final when Sutton won 1-0 away in the first leg at Loakes Park and drew 1-1 in the second to complete a memorable treble of cup triumphs. Their other successes in 1982-83 came in the London and Surrey Senior Cups. They have already retained the Surrey Cup this season with a 4-0 victory over Epsom & Ewell, but their hopes of completing another treble were dashed when they went out to Kingstonian in the London Senior semi-final. After their cup successes of last season, they aimed to concentrate their efforts this time to winning the league, but that bid has been scuppered - like Wycombe's - through a series of injuries. Happily most of them have cleared up now and Mr. Williams and his assistant Larry Pritchard can field a virtual full strength side for this final. If anything, he has an embarrassment of riches from which to select. One man certain to play is goalkeeper Dave Collyer, now 38, who is rumoured to be packing up at the end of this campaign. His likely back four is the

regular line-up of Tony Rains, Steve Bangs and Mark Golley plus recent signing from Portsmouth, John Roles at left back. There is also a chance that John Rains, now back from injury, will force himself in there somewhere. In midfield we could find Nigel Golley, Ricky Kidd and Mick Stephens, but 20 year old Steve Tutt will be fighting for a place.

There is a similar problem up front where there are four players vying for three positions. Leading scorer Micky Joyce (25 goals) is doubtful after missing the last three weeks with an ankle injury. Speedy Steve Galloway and classy winger Ray Sunnucks seem certain to play, possibly alongside another experienced player Paul McKinnon.

Sutton's squad looks strong enough to make it really tough for Wycombe to give Mike Keen a winning send-off.

Talking of send-offs these are my last programme notes after six years as Sports Editor of the Bucks Free Press. I'm about to join my old colleague Stuart Earp on the Oxford Mail, but still hope to 'pop in' to Loakes Park from time to time. I've thoroughly enjoyed my time reporting on the club (I hope I can say the same thing for my readers!) I've always tried to put my personal point of view and I'm sure that has started some arguments. Wycombe are still one of the great names in non-league football and I wish them all success in their Centenary Year. Goodbye.

THE MANAGER WRITES

After four years as Wycombe's Manager this is probably as important game as any during my spell here. It is important to me that I should leave the Club on a winning note. After losing in the final last year it would be nice for the players to win a trophy in what has been otherwise an indifferent season.

I will be glad to take with me some fond memories of the times I have had while team manager of the Wanderers. I especially remember the games against Bishop Auckland and Hyde both in our F.A. Trophy semi-final year. We completely ripped Bishop's apart and played possibly some of our best football; and against Hyde we played with passion and determination, with good goals and Howard Kennedy's winner from a free-kick, all made it a great night for the club. That cup run was full of exciting play and only marred by the fact that we did not reach Wembley.

Last year's league win was also a great all-round performance by the squad and looking back, to win nine out of the last ten games was an achievement in itself and only soured by being called the 'best of an ordinary bunch'. I can only think that the Isthmian League contained great teams only during the early seventies.

I only hope that the players of the last two very good seasons will be remembered along with other good teams of the past.

Also I must remember the winning of the English Schools Trophy by a very good district team which gave us some excellent games during their success. It is nice to see many of them now having success at a higher level.

I would like to thank all those palyers who have played under me and wish them great success at which ever club they play for in the future. I hope they will always have faith in their own ability and continue to see football as a game to be enjoyed with humour, comradeship and hardwork. Also a big thank you to all the staff. To all the supporters who have travelled home and away during my spell as manager, I hope you see as many good, entertaining games in the future as the players, staff and myself have tried to give you in the past few years. To the officers of the club I must say that I was disappointed not to be included in the plans for the Club's Centenary year. Also to take a look at the top of Division Three of the Football League; it might pay to be ambitious.
