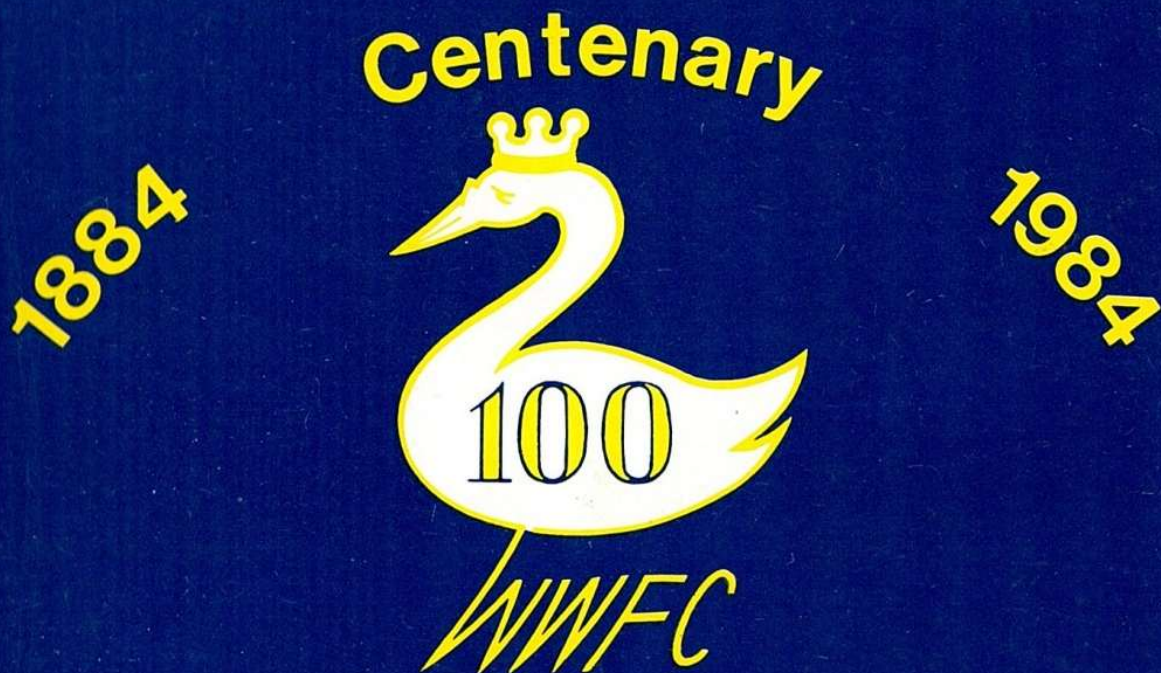

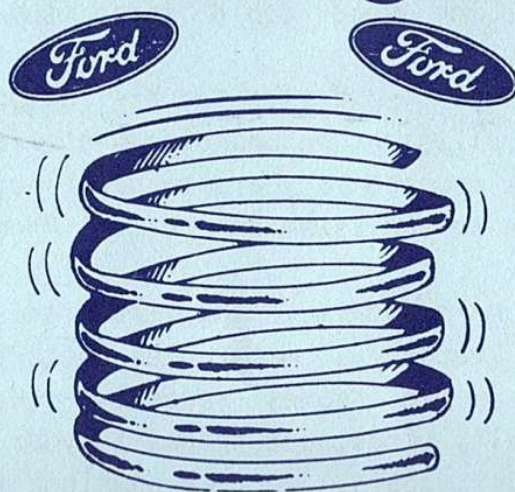

Hitachi League Cup

The Isthmian League first introduced a League Cup Competition in season 1974-75 when a competition was set up for Division Two clubs only. Tilbury were the first victors, beating Croydon 3-1 on aggregate in a two-legged final. The next season saw the trophy open to all Isthmian members. Wycombe reached the semi-final of the then called Subsidiary Cup but Slough Town knocked 'The Blues' out after extra-time at Loakes Park. 'The Rebels' went on to win the Cup beating Tilbury 4-1 at Hayes. 1976-77 produced a Hendon v Barking final, with the 'Dons winning 1-0 at Harrow Borough.

Hitachi took up sponsorship of the Cup during the 1977-78 season and have remained ever since with today's game marking the final tie to be played under the Hitachi banner.

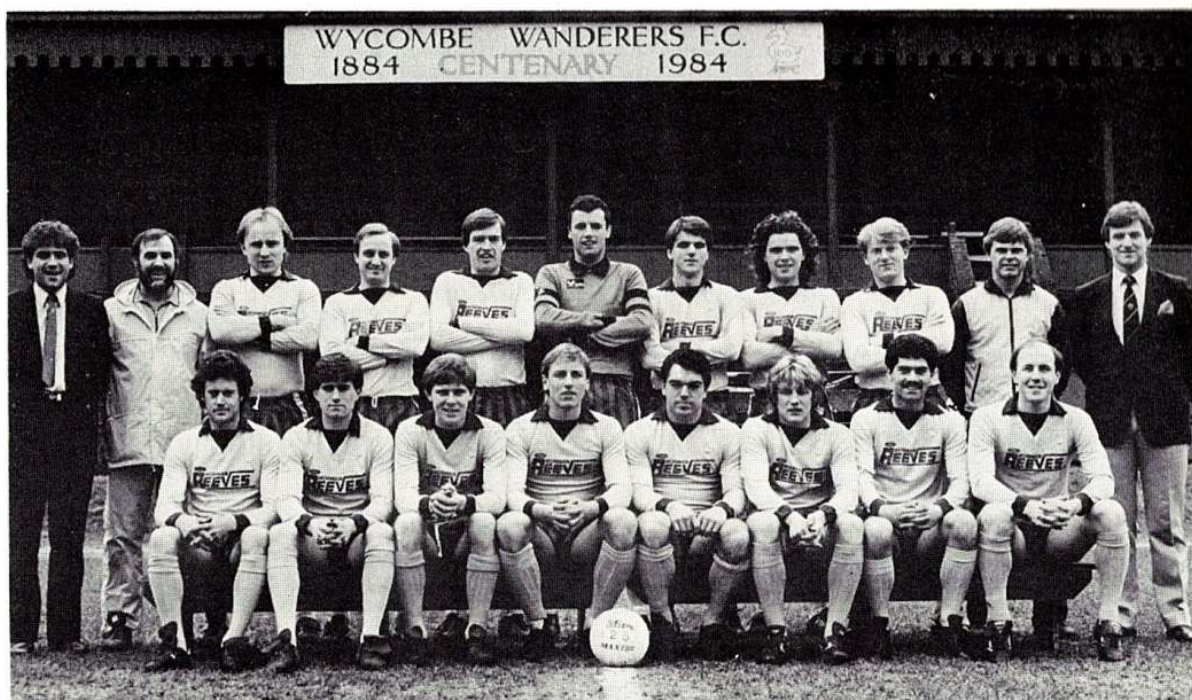

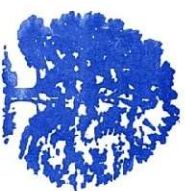

TOM HAMMOND - 26 year old keeper, should have made 400 appearances by this game for his only senior club, first played for 'Boro as a 16 year old in season 75/76.

RICHARD WALDEN - Captain of the side, vastly experienced having played 650 league games for Aldershot, Sheffield Wednesday and Newport County where he was in the side which reached the Cup Winners Cup quarter final.

KEITH BAKER - Experienced left back who joined 'Boro this season, previous clubs include Staines, Egham and Southall.

BRIAN BROOME - 24 year old highly competitive midfield player who had a short spell at Wycombe at the start of the season, but soon rejoined 'Boro, has netted nearly 30 goals this season.

TONY DOHERTY - Defender who joined 'Boro at the start of the season gained experience with Everton, Cardiff and Wigan Athletic before moving into non-league football.

TONY CARTER - Young lionhearted centre back who has now played over 100 games.

ROBIN GOSNELL - Strong and competitive midfielder or defender who returned to 'Boro this season after a year away at Slough and Hungerford, was with Farnborough for three seasons prior to that making over 150 appearances.

KEITH MORRIS - 'Boro's top goalscorer with over 30 goals this season within sight of Brian Langfield and Richard Parkin's club record of 34 goals. Has now made over 100 appearances for the club, won all of 'Boro's end of season awards last year.

TOMMY JONES - Skillful young midfield player who returned to Farnborough midway through last season after a brief spell with Woking. First came to 'Boro in the latter part of 1982-83 season after being released by Chelsea, has now made over 100 appearances.

BRIAN LUCAS - Hard working midfielder who joined 'Boro at the start of this season from Football League neighbours Aldershot. 23 year old Brian was born locally and spent all of his early football career with "Shots" making nearly 150 1st team appearances for them.

DAVID STEELE - Young midfielder who has progressed through the 'Boro's youth and reserve teams. 50 plus senior appearances in a six year period with the club.

CHRIS HODGE - Versatile midfielder or defender who was with Southampton before joining Farnborough at the start of the 1980-81 season.

Our Visitors

FARNBOROUGH TOWN FOOTBALL CLUB

Although Farnborough Town are one of the youngest clubs in the Isthmian League their short history reads as a catalogue of honours and remarkable feats. They were formed in 1967 and played their first competitive match on 31st August 1968 at Queens Road (Boro's old ground) in the Surrey Senior League. The game resulted in an amazing 7-6 victory over Surbiton Byron, a score that was to set the scene for Boro' in the coming years.

The appointment of current team manager, Ted Pearce, in 1970-71 was a turning point for the Club. In his first season he guided them into the Premier Division of the Surrey Senior League and the following season a high placing in the Premier Division was sufficient for them to be accepted into the Spartan League for what was to become four years of total domination - winning the League Championship in four consecutive seasons and winning the Spartan League Cup for the last two of those seasons.

Facilities at Queens Road were preventing any further progress but, with the help of local businessmen, a new ground was developed at Cherrywood Road and the Club were accepted into the Athenian League. The 'Boro immediately won the Division Two Championship in 1976-77 and were accepted into the newly expanded Isthmian League. They finished 3rd in their debut season but season 1978-79 saw promotion gained as Division Two Champions, finishing ten points clear of runners-up Camberley Town.

As a Division One side Farnborough gained entry into the F.A. Trophy for the first time and so ended their entry into the F.A. Vase, a competition in which they had never failed to reach the last sixteen and had reached the semi-finals on two occasions (1975-76 & 1976-77). On each occasion they lost to Vase dominators, Billericay Town.

Farnborough have completed six seasons in Division One of the Isthmian League and prior to this season their best placing was 3rd in 1982-83 where heavy involvement in cup competitions finally cost them the chance of going up, missing out by just one point to runners-up Harlow Town and eight behind Champions Worthing.

The 'Boro certainly have a Cup record to be proud of. They have won their County Cup, the Hampshire Senior Cup on three occasions (1974-75, 1981-82, and 1983-84) and reached the final on another three occasions. They were London Senior Cup finalists in 1981-82, losing in a replay, 3-4, to the team of the season Leytonstone & Ilford despite holding a 3-1 lead with 20 minutes left.

In the F.A. Cup the Club have reached the First Round Proper on three occasions. In 1980-81, after battling through the qualifying

competition, culminating in a stirring 1-0 victory in the Welsh Valleys at Merthyr Tydfil in the 4th Qualifying Round they were then drawn away to Alliance side Yeovil Town. After a brave performance on Yeovil's slope they lost narrowly, 1-2, with the winning goal being scored with just a couple of minutes left. Last season they once again fought through the qualifying competition, defeating Wick, Tonbridge and Kingstorian before travelling to Weymouth in the final qualifying round. A 1-1 draw earned 'Boro a home replay and the Alliance outfit were defeated 3-2 to give them yet another away tie this time at Barking. However two goals on the break were enough to give the home side a 2-1 victory. This season Farnborough met professional opposition for the first time in the F.A. Cup. Fleet, Totton, Hungerford and Chippenham were all eliminated before the Isthmians travelled to Fourth Division Hereford United in the First Round. A crowd of 3,711 saw 'Boro hold the home side to a goalless first-half but they finally bowed out by a 3-0 scoreline.

In today's competition, the Hitachi Cup, 'Boro have a good record for a club that has never competed in the Premier Division. In 1981-82 they reached the semi-finals where they met their London Senior Cup finalists to be, Leytonstone & Ilford. This time the tie was concluded after three games. Losing the home leg 0-1, winning the away leg 2-1 and losing the replay at Leytonstone by the only goal of the game, an unfortunate own goal. The following season they reached the quarter-finals, losing in another replay 0-1 at Bromley who were to be Wycombe's eventual semi-final victims. Last season they had a surprise exit in the First Round at home to Corinthian Casuals.

Farnborough hope to complete, today, the 'double' of the Division One Championship and the Hitachi Cup. 'Boro finally clinched promotion and the Title with a 2-0 success over relegated Clapton at Cherrywood. The match also marked the hundredth league goal of the season for 'Boro and thus following promotion partners, Leatherhead, in achieving a century of goals. It is the first time that a club has reached this target in Division One since the league was formed in 1973.

Since becoming the first club to defeat Sutton United in the Hitachi Cup since Leytonstone & Ilford back in January 1982, they have completed their league programme dropping just 8 points in the final 14 games. Included in this run was an amazing 10-1 victory over relegated Hertford Town. Even more incredible is the fact that the score was 1-1 after 25 minutes but 6-1 at half-time.

The last two league games of the season ended unhappily with defeats at the hands of Tilbury home 0-3 and Woking - away 1-2.
