Aveley Football Club were first formed in 1927 and competed in several local leagues with success until the outbreak of War in 1939.

In 1946 the club re-formed and joined the Thurrock Combination. "The Millers" lifted the Essex Junior Cup in both 47/8 and 48/9, the latter being their last season as a junior club.

Season 1949/50 saw the Essex County Football Association grant Aveley senior status and they were elected to the Second Division of the London League. Within a year they were members of the Division One, where they soon became Champions.

In 1952 the purchase of their present "Mill Field" ground was completed, and in 1955 they were elected to the Delphian League.

No success came in the Delphian League, although the League Cup was won in the 1961/2 season.

1963/4 saw the amalgamation of the Athenian, Corinthian and Delphian Leagues, forming a new Athenian League with three divisions (Premier, One and Two). Aveley found themselves placed in Division Two, but won promotion in 1968/9 when they finished as runners-up. Two seasons later the club enjoyed probably their best ever success when they won the Athenian League Division One championship as well as reaching the quarter-final of the F.A. Amateur Cup.

After two seasons in the top flight of the Athenian League Aveley were elected to the newly formed Isthmian League Second Division. In their first season they finished a promising fifth, however, this trend was not to continue as the next eleven seasons saw the "Millers" permanently fixed to a low mid-table position. At the end of the 1985/6 campaign they finished in bottom place and were relegated to the Division Two North.

Their first season in the Division saw them finish in 5th. place, but a disastrous season followed, finishing in 21st. place. Fortunes improved with 9th. place last season, and they have just completed probably their best campaign since their very first season in the league, which although these notes were prepared prior to last Saturday's results, it is to be hoped that the Club achieved its goal this season of promotion back to Division One.

During their Isthmian years the club have lifted three trophies. In 1979/80 the Essex Thamesside Trophy was won, in 1982/3 the Hornchurch Charity Cup found its way to Millfield as did the East Anglian Cup last season, where the club triumphed after a very good 3-1 win over Cambridge City in the Final.

ST. ALBANS CITY



Formed in April 1908, St. Albans City Football Club are now in their sixty-seventh consecutive season in the Vauxhall Football (Isthmian) League. Saints early days saw them compete in both the Herts. County and Spartan League's. After winning the Spartan League championship twice the club moved up to the Athenian League for a highly successful three year stay. The Championship came to Clarence Park in 1921 and 22 with the runners-up spot being achieved in their final season. Saints rapid rise up the amateur ladder continued in 1922 with the move into the Isthmian League.

Saints, or "Citizens" as they were then known, soon justified their election to the new league and were league champions at the first attempt this despite losing their opening three fixtures. A year later Saints successfully defended their title and again finished top in 1928. Sadly that proved to be the last time the club won the title with their best placing since those days being second in 1955, and third in 1971. Coupled with

success in the Isthmian League in the twenties the club also enjoyed many excellent Amateur Cup runs. Three times in four years the club reached the semi-final stage but were unsuccessful each time. In 1970 the club once more tasted defeat at the semi-final stage and in doing so became the only side to reach the semi-final of the competition four times without going on to play a Final.

The advent of sponsorship to the Isthmian League in 1973, and the addition of an extra division, didn't exactly work in St. Albans favour. At the end of the first season City, along with Corinthian-Casuals, became the first clubs to be relegated. Nine years later the Saints were again visiting new grounds when a second relegation was suffered. For the 1983/4 season Saints turned to their former striker John Mitchell who played in the 1975 FA Cup Final for Fulham. Mitchell rebuilt the side with local players and within twelve months had secured Saints their first ever promotion within the Isthmian League.Just two more seasons were needed before Saints reclaimed their Premier Division place, achieved with a remarkable 7-1 win at Lewes on the last day of the 85/6 season.

Mitchell stepped aside to take a seat on the board a year later and John Lacy took over in the hot seat as the club's first full-time manager. Lacy departed after a mediocre season to be replaced by Doug Parkin in the summer of 1988. Again this full time appointment did'nt work out and at the end of January last year Parkin left the club. For the current season the club has returned to having a part time manager, Peter Lawrence, who was faced with a massive re-building job following the departure of many players last summer. By the end of the year Lawrence had used 36 players in his bid to find the right blend.

Despite having had a very lean time in the various cup competitions over the past seventeen years, the club does boast a very successful past. Since winning their first cup on March 5th. 1909 (Herts. Charity Cup) a total of 79 cup final appearances have been made prior to today. Of these 47 have been successful including 35 in the two Hertfordshire cups. Other successes include; Mithras Cup (2), London Senior Cup, Wycombe Floodlit Cup (2), Victory Cup (2), Liege Cup, AFA Cup, St. Albans Hospital Cup and the Hitchin Centenary Cup. St. Albans have twice reached the Second Round Proper of the F.A. Challenge Cup (1968 and 1980) before going down in replays to Walsall and Torquay United respectively. Saints best F.A. Challenge Trophy run came in 1982 when they again reached the Second Round.

Since winning the Division One championship in 1986 Saints have had to settle for winning honours for their off the field activities. For the 1987/8 season the clubs matchday programme, "The Saints Report", was voted the best non-league programme in Britain (a year after coming fourth). In successive seasons the programme was voted the best in the Vauxhall League and for the past six seasons, in a local poll, it has been voted the best in Herts.

St. Albans City have close ties with youth football in the area and, through their numerous Sunday Youth sides, have over 300 players on their books for the current season. In 1986 the club founded a midweek youth league which caters for the youth teams of such clubs as Hendon, Chesham, Hitchin and Enfield.

For the 1989/90 season the club has a new chairman in Bernard Tominey who is a senior vice-president with Hilton International. Also new to the Board is Chris Long the founder of Sport Aid, and amongst the new vice-presidents are former England captain Bobby Moore OBE, and boxer Dave 'Boy' Green.

In September 1989 St. Albans staged a charity match for the dreamflight charity which raises money for terminally ill children. Thanks to appearances by such players as Best, Moore, Ardiles, Beckenbauer, Keegan, Hurst, Peters, Chivers, Clemence and Jennings over £20,000 was raised for charity.

PAUL O'REILLY (Goalkeeper) One of five goalkeepers used by the Saints this season. Played for Saints Reserves five years ago but only made his First XI debut this season after returning from local football. A D.J. with Chiltern Radio.

MATTHEW HOWARD (Defender) Summer signing from Brentford who at just nineteen has made a very big impact at Clarence Park. Still trains with the Third Division club.

ANDY COX (Defender) Recently appointed City captain and has reacted well to the task although just twenty years old. Signed for Saints from Division Two side Berkhamsted Town at the start of last season. One of Saints most consistent performers.

STEVE OLIVER (Midfield)

Saints longest serving player with over 220 games under his belt. Signed in 1983 when the club were in Division Two, but in between has had spells with Vauxhall Motors and Hitchin Town.

JOHN COLFER (Midfield) Local player who returned in the summer after a spell at Hitchin. Started the season as skipper, but has struggled to regain his place after suspension.

NEIL HENRY (Midfield) Summer signing from Hendon who has improved steadily through the season. As a youngster he was on the books of Watford.

LANCE PEDLAR (Forward)

Recent signing from Chelmsford City where he played in the side that won the Division One South championship last season. Very strong striker whose other clubs include Dunstable, Wealdstone, Hounslow and Wembley.

LAURENCE WARD (Defender) Joined the club in March 1990 after service with both Dover and Folkestone. A 22 year old who is a quantity surveyor by profession.

KEVIN MUDD (Defender)

Made his debut on the same day as Ward after transferring from Enfield. This 24 year old scaffolder previously played for Mount Grace (Potters Bar) in the Herts. County League and Old Albanians.

MICK O'SHEA (Midfield) 29 year old who made his debut for St. Albans back in December 1985. His previous clubs have been Finchley, Hertford Town, Boreham Wood and Tring Town. He is employed in the computer industry.

JEREMY ARNULL (Forward)

Joined at the start of the current season after service with Sutton United and Exeter University. 23 year old P.E. teacher at Finchley High School. He won representative honours with England Universities.

MARK BARNARD (Defender) Made his debut for City in February 1988. This 22 year old who is a draughtsman has previously played for Hitchin Town and Chesham United.

ROB SMALE (Forward)

A planning consultant with British Airways, Rob, who is 30 is in his second spell at Clarence Park having returned to the club from Hayes. He first made his City debut in August 1983 and his only other club is Pegasus (Welwyn Garden City).
