### CARSHALTON ATHLETIC FOOTBALL CLUB

Mill Lane Mission (formed 1903) changed their name to Carshalton Athletic Football Club in the summer of 1907 and continued to play in the Croydon and District League. Carshalton St. Andrews (formed 1897) amalgamated with them at the end of the 1907/08 season from the Southern Suburban League. Their present ground has been used since 1921 after previous pitches in the Wrythe Recreation Ground (1907/14) and Culvers Park (1919/20). The floodlights were officially opened on 13th. December 1967 against Crystal Palace.

Three consecutive promotions were achieved and by 1910/11 election to the First Division of the Southern Suburban League was obtained. Two League Championship's and victories in various local and Surrey cup competitions were achieved and in 1922/23 the Robins became founder members of the Surrey Senior League. After finishing runners-up in both the League and the Charity Cup they joined the London League Division One in 1923 and three seasons later gained promotion to the Premier Division. In 1946/47 Carshalton joined the Corinthian League where consecutive Championship's were won in 1952/53 and 53/54. Athletic were elected to the Athenian League in 1956/57, a year later they reached the Surrey Senior Cup Final for the first time, losing 1-0 to Dulwich hamlet. In the Amateur Cup the "Robins" reached the last eight in 1954/55 and again in 1959/60.

Carshalton remained in the Athenian League, their best season being in 1963/64 when they finished third until 1973 when they became joint founder members of the new Isthmian Division Two. After struggling for two seasons Carshalton just failed to get promotion in their third, however in 1976/77 the "Robins" gained promotion to the Premier Division. That season they also won the Surrey Senior Shield.

1980/81 Carshalton enjoyed their most successful run in the F.A. Trophy when they reached the Third Round Proper before losing to Mossley. They reached the first round proper of the F.A. Cup in 1969/70 and 1987/88, in 1982/83 they progressed to the second round before losing 4-1 to Fourth Division Torquay United.



Since the arrival of Billy Smith there has been a gradual improvement of their form every season. In 1988/9 Carshalton won their first major honour in many years when they defeated Woking 4-2 in the Final of the Surrey Senior Cup at Walton & Hersham's Stompond Lane Ground. This was the Robins first ever triumph in the County Cup and ended Sutton's domination of the competition for the last five years. They also recorded their highest ever final league placing in the Premier Division of fourth.

This feat they repeated last season when they retained the County Cup with a 4-2 win over Dorking at Kingstonian's Kingsmeadow Stadium.

ROBIN BESTE (Striker) Aged 24. Former Chelsea apprentice who had to retire from the professional game following injury. Joined last season from Warlingham.

JIMMY BOLTON (Striker) Aged 28. Joined the club from Harrow for a Club record transfer fee, previously a prolific scorer at Farnborough he also played in the Youth Team at Tottenham Hotspur. Finished last season as second leading goalscorer, despite playing only the second half of the season.

GARY BOWYER (Midfield) Aged 25. Joined Carshalton in 1986/7 and has had previous experience with Crystal Palace, made nearly 100 appearances for the club before joining Whyteleafe for a small fee, he later joined Bromley but has returned to Carshalton this season.

LES CLEEVELY (Goalkeeper) Aged 25. Joined in season 87/88 after spending time with Palace, Farnborough and Epsom & Ewell. A regular first team player since his arrival at the club.

KEVIN FITZGERALD (Defender) Aged 30. Joined the club in the close season from Doring where he was a regular first team player.

CONRAD KANE (Winger) Aged 27. Joined at the start of the 86/87 season from Dulwich. He previously played for Merstham and Bromley. Toured with Middlesex Wanderers at the end of the 84/5 Was Supporters 'Player of The Year' at Colston Avenue last season when he was also leading scorer with 25 goals.

GARY MITCHELL (Defender) Aged 26. Former "Player of the Year", he is one of the club's longest serving players. A product of the Youth Team.

ANDY RILEY (Defender) Aged 28. Joined from Leatherhead at the start of the 87/88 season and also played for Whyteleafe. Was "Player of the Year" at Colston Avenue for two seasons.. Last season gained VOL Representative honours and has taken over as Club Captain this season.

JON WARDEN (Midfield) 30 year old who joined in 85/86 from Tooting. Has also played for Croydon. Leading scorer in 1985/6, he is now the clubs second longest serving player with nearly 300 appearances.

GARY WILGOSS (Midfield/Striker) Aged 27. Joined in December 1986 for a small fee from Whyteleafe. A regular at Carshalton last season and was voted "Manager's Player of the Season" for his consistency.

BOBBY GREEN (Defender) Aged 37. Vastly experienced player who joined Carshalton from Hampton in 1988. His previous clubs include Dulwich Hamlet, Corinthian Casuals, Tooting & Mitcham and Sutton Utd. Bobby was a first team regular all of last season.

JOHN RAFFINGTON (Central Defender) Aged 30. John was a regular at the heart of the defence all last season and has now made over 400 appearances for the club. He was voted joint 'Player of the Year' in 1986/7 and now the Robins longest serving player.

STUART LAWSON (Defender) Aged 18. A former Youth Team player who is on the verge of a regular first team spot.

NEAL NORMAN (Midfield/Defender) Aged 26. Joined Carshalton last season from Fisher Athletic, Neal has also played for Farnborough and Dulwich Hamlet.

## Introducing ... ..

#### WOKING FOOTBALL CLUB

Woking F.C. were formed in 1889 and played at Wheatsheaf Common and four other grounds before moving on to their present Kingfield Sports Ground in 1923. They started their competitive career in the West Surrey League and having won the Championship four times in 1895/6, 1897/8, 1904/5 and 1907/8, they were elected to the Isthmian League in 1911 and have been members continually ever since. Their highest placing was in 1956/7 when they finished as runners-up to Wycombe Wanderers despite scoring over 100 goals.

In 1980/81 they finished bottom of the Premier Division but survived relegation due to Enfield and Dagenham's leaving to join the Alliance Premier League, no teams being demoted that year.

They have been more successful in cup competitions however and in 1958 they won the last FA Amateur Cup Final to be televised live when they defeated Ilford 3-0 before a 70,000 crowd at Wembley. At this time "cardinals" forward line featured England Amateur Internationals, Charlie Mortimore, Geoff Hamm, Reg Stratton and Roy Littleton. Twenty years later Woking attracted national attention when reaching the Second Round of the FA Cup and holding Third Division promotion outfit Swansea City to a 2-2 draw at the Vetch Field. Sadly they lost the replay 5-3 after extra time before a capacity 6,500 crowd. The following season they reached the semi-finals of the F.A. Trophy, losing to the eventual winners, Dagenham. On the local front they have won the Surrey Senior Cup on five occasions and been runners-up thirteen times.

The early 1980's were traumatic times for the club as they were relegated from the Isthmian premier Division in 1983 to Division Two (South) in 1985. Their fortunes however, improved and after narrowly missing out on an immediate return to Division One, they made no mistake in 1986/7 when they scored 110 goals in their 38 League games. They were third in Division One in 1988 and in 1989 a home draw in their last game against Lewes, cost them promotion. Home form cost them dear as of their total 82 points 49 were collected away from Kingfield.

Woking began last season as favourites for a promotion spot and after two near misses they did not let down their ever growing band of supporters a third time. They were runners-up in the Vauxhall League First Division and so promoted with Wivenhoe Town.



The 1990/91 campaign although successful in terms of league points, has been dominated by the F.A. Challenge Cup campaign which has seen the Surrey club progress to the Fourth Round where they met mighty Everton and after quite a tussle with the Merseysiders, lost only to a Kevin Sheedy goal. During the run, they gained the very respectable scalp of West Bromwich Albion, at the Midlands side Hawthorns ground.

In cup competitions, the F.A. cup apart they reached the First Round of the F.A. Trophy, losing 2-0 at Kettering Town and have already won the Surrey Senior Cup, defeating Kingstonian at Sutton United's Gander Green Lane on Easter Monday.

TIM READ (Goalkeeper) Cost a club record £7,000 fee when signed from Worthing at the start of this season, having caught the eye with a spectacular performance against Woking last season.

STEWART MITCHELL (Full-Back) Joined Woking from Windsor in the summer of 1989. Attacking player who has also played for Slough and Maidenhead Utd..

ADIE COWLER (Defender) Now in his second spell at Woking having re-joined from Addlestone in season 1985/6. Versatile player who normally plays as a sweeper. Is the present Club Captain.

BRADLEY PRATT (Defender) Joined towards the end of last season from Farnborough Town. A towering defender who has also played for Camberley, Bracknell and Egham Town.

LLOYD WYE (Defender) 23 year old left-sided defender. Now in his seventh season at Woking having progressed from the Youth side. Has captained Woking on a number of occasions. Was at one time a Southampton junior.

MARK FRANKS (Defender) Experienced player, aged 29. Used by Woking as an attacking full back/winger. In his second spell at Woking rejoining a year ago from Windsor. Has also played for Maidenhead Utd.

SHANE WYE (Midfielder) Elder brother of Lloyd who also came through the Woking Youth team. Moved on to Chertsey and also had a short period at Hayes before rejoining two seasons ago:

TERRY WORSFOLD (Forward) Re-signed from Dorking this season after a spell where he was leading scorer for the "Chicks". In 88/9 he was Woking's leading scorer. Scored in the FA Cup tie at West Brom.

LANCE PEDLAR (Forward) Tall striker signed earlier this season from St. Albans City after an initial loan spell. Was St. Albans' top scorer last term.

DERECK BROWN (Midfield) Signed earlier this season from Hendon. Previously with Wembley.

TIM BUZAGLO (Forward) The striker whose hat-trick at West Brom earned the FA Cup headlines. He has been a prolific scorer since moving up from local football in 1986. Has represented Gibralter at cricket.

MARK BIGGINS (Midfield) Signed for a four figure fee from Windsor in 1987. Stylish player who has also played for Hanwell, Feltham, Maidenhead and St. Albans City.

TREVOR BARON (Defender) Signed from Windsor & Eton in 1986. Strong centre-back who scores his fair share of goals, he has also played for Slough, Marlow, Chertsey and Burnham.

ANDY PARR (Forward) Recently returned to the club for his second spell at Kingfield.

RICHARD BUZAGLO (Forward) Younger brother of Tim, he has recently returned to the First Team squad after a half a season out through injury.

## ISTHMIAN LEAGUE ANNOUNCES NEW SPONSOR

From next season the Isthmian competition will be known as the Diadora Football League, following the announcement of a €400,000 sponsorship from the Italian sports shoe and clothing company.

The agreement includes championship and goalscoring awards as well as rewards for clubs who are most successful in the F.A. Cup, F.A. Trophy and F.A. Vase. Teams will also qualify for merchandising materials and discounts on the company's products.

The announcement was made at London's Hilton Hotel by the Chairman of Diaco – the company's UK distributors – Sebastian Coe. It officially comes into effect on June 1st. and lasts for an initial two years, with an option to renew for a third. It will be the largest at its level in non-League football.

League Chairman and Managing Director Alan Turvey says: "Securing such a prestigious sponsorship in a difficult economic climate is extremely pleasing. We are confident that we will play a significant part in promoting the name of Diadora and their products in the UK."

Seb Coe told the news conference: "Diadora is a company that believes wholeheartedly in the encouragement of sport at all levels. We know that non-League football provides the spring board for many of our up and coming young soccer stars."

Among those at the launch was lain Dowie. The former Hendon player who was sold to Luton, and recently transferred to West Ham where he has helped the team win promotion to Division One of the Barclays League.

The details of the sponsorship package were presented to the member clubs at a special meeting last week. they received favourable comment, and work is now being put in hand to provide the clubs with materials in time for the start of next season.

A new sponsor is now being sort for the Isthmian League Cup (currently known as the AC Delco Cup) and the Managers of the Month award - which have been sponsored by HUnting Gate Homes.

Chairman and Managing Director added: "I think our new sponsors' foresight in supporting community football in such a positive manner should be applauded. Now our clubs can continue to enjoy the best rewards available for football at our level."
