Perhaps emphasising the

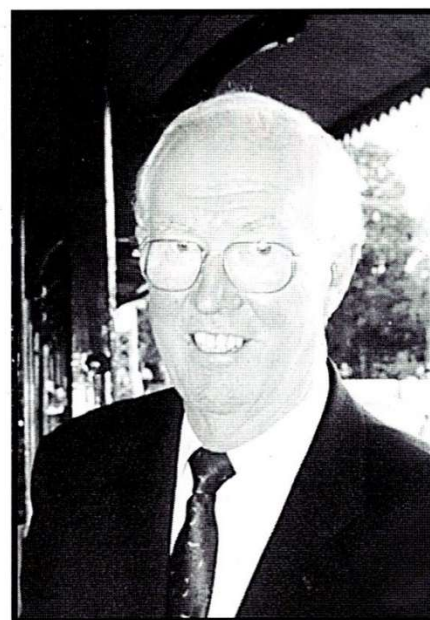
strength of our League, our other finalists this evening are **Northwood** from our First Division.

Recent research finally established that Northwood Football Club was formed in September 1899 with their first fixture being a friendly against Amersham. Their Centenary season has passed them by, but proved very successful.

In 1931 Northwood joined the Harrow & Wealden League and they were immediately successful by winning the Premier Division title in six consecutive years from 1932 to 1937. After the War they were Champions again from 1947 to 1949 and they also won the Middlesex Junior Cup in those three successive years.

It was at this time that the club moved to their current base in Northwood Park having played at several different venues in the early years.

The club hit a slump during the fifties and early sixties and played without much success in junior football but towards the end of the 1960's the tide began to change.

Northwood were elected into the Middlesex Senior League in 1969 and they became runners-up in 1971. During the years that followed, the Woods managed to win the Middlesex League Cup on five occasions and also the League Championship in 1978, completing a double which saw them elected to the Hellenic League.

With help from the London Borough of Hillingdon the club developed their present pitch into suitable facilities and they were quickly promoted to top flight as Division One champions and Hellenic League Cup winners. Floodlights were erected and Senior Status was granted to Northwood in 1981.

Due to increased travelling costs, Northwood switched to play in the London Spartan League in 1984 and they were soon to become one of the competitions top clubs. After one League Cup victory, a runners-up spot and two third places, the Woods completed a League and Cup double in 1992. With this success came considerable ground improvements which allowed them to take a deserved place in the Third Division of the Isthmian League.

After five years at the higher level, following early success by winning the 1993 Associate Members Trophy and several promotion challenges, the Woods made it to Division Two in 1997.

After three seasons in the Second Division, Northwood earned further promotion following an excellent runners-up spot in 2000. They also captured the Associate Members Trophy for the second time and reached their first ever Middlesex Senior Cup Final. Their first season in Division One was also a success.

Northwood also have a huge youth set-up with teams at all age groups playing their football within the confines of Northwood Park. Improvements have been made to the standards in recent years and the club are hoping that this will result in many youngsters developing into first-team players in the future.

Tony Choules - 40-year-old - Tony took charge at Northwood back in November 1997 having had a spell as Assistant Manager at Yeading. Injury ended his playing career early and he cut his managerial teeth at Harefield United and Feltham & Hounslow.



Paul Riordan - Aged 30 - Goalkeeper who joined the Woods in 1999 from Ruislip Manor. Paul also spent several seasons with Hanwell Town and has now made over 150 appearances for the club.

Paul Watkins - Aged 31 - Solid and experienced defender who is good in the air and strong in the tackle. Paul joined Northwood in the summer of 1999 from Southall. Has previous experience at Harefield United and Hayes. Has now made almost 130 appearances for the Woods.

Danny Butler - Strong and composed central defender, aged 29, who joined the Woods in September 1999 from British Airways. Had previous experience with Hayes. Injuries have disrupted the last two seasons but he has recently completed

100 games for the Woods and has also skippered the side.

Gary Williams - Aged 30 - Tall, reliable defender who signed for Northwood back in December 1997 from Uxbridge. Has now completed 280 games for the club and won the Supporters' Player of the Year award in 2001.

Mark Buchanan - Young 21-year-old defender who answered injury calls and was promoted from the reserves last season. Mark won a regular place and looks to have a promising future.

Dave Nolan - Age 30 - Dave made his Northwood

recently created history by making his 400th appearance for the club and has also scored a total of 80 goals.

Gavin Hart - Age 26 - Skilful midfield player, who joined the Woods in the summer of 1999 after spells at Tring Town and Ruislip Manor. Has now made over 150 appearances and can play anywhere in the midfield.

Andy Cook - 27-year old midfield player who joined the club in December 2000 having been in the Army and soon won a regular place. Andy was with Watford as a youngster and has been amongst the goals this season.

Ryan Ashe - Summer 2001 recruit who joined the club after a couple of seasons with Chertsey Town. Ryan is a 22-year-old midfield player and previously played at Ruislip Manor.

Wayne Carter - 21-year-old - midfield player and another summer signing who quickly won a place in the side. Wayne joined after a season with Wealdstone and was previously with Hayes.

Scott Fitzgerald - Age 22 - Young, pacy striker who progressed through the youth sides. Made his debut early in 1999 and while continuing to progress, has made 190 appearances and scored over 80 goals.

Lawrence Yaku - Age 27 - Nigerian born striker who joined Northwood in the summer of 1999 from Ruislip Manor and had an astonishing first season which saw him break several scoring records. He has continued ever since having now netted over 140 goals in just under 190 matches.

Andy Felton - 24-year-old goalkeeper who joined in the summer of 2001 from Ruislip Manor. He has already been called upon on several occasions including the Woods FA Cup tie at Kettering Town where he gave a good account of himself and has been a regular deputy for Riordan.

Chris Moore - Only 22 but a striker with plenty of experience at Uxbridge in recent years. A one-time Brentford YTS player who joined the Woods in March 2001 and has soon been amongst the goals for the club. Cup-tied tonight.

Luke Eldridge - 23-year-old midfield player who joined the club from Brook House in January 2002 and has been a regular member of the squad ever since.

Alan Hamlet - Experienced defender who joined the Woods from Uxbridge in December 2001 but was ruled out with injury before finally making his first-team debut last month.

Other squad members include midfielder Scott Pearsall and utility man Craig McIntosh while the management team includes coaches Gerry Henry, Gary Farrell and John Toogood.

HAMPTON & R B

Hampton FC was formed in 1921 from an amalgamation of a number of local junior sides. They spent their early days in the Kingston & District and South West Middlesex Leagues. In 1969 Hampton moved to their present ground, Beverley, which co-incided with a step up into Senior football on joining the Surrey Senior League. The initial seasons were largely uneventful until manager Peter Tagg, an ex-Hampton player himself, started to recruit experienced players from the more senior leagues. In 1963/4 Hampton won the League Championship and gained election to the Spartan League embracing on one of their most successful periods in their history.

They won the League and League Cup at their first attempt and despite a change of manager in the 1964/5 season the success continued with a league and cup double in the following two seasons, a League cup win in 1968/9 and a further championship win in 1969/70. In the eight years in the Spartan League they never finished lower than fourth.

Ex Brentford professional, Roy Philpott, who took over as Manager from Tagg, inheriting much of his championship winning side, built a side around experienced players such as Ken Merry, Lance White and Roger Blackmore and younger talents such as record all time goalscorers Peter Allen and Syd Carter. A number of notable victories were achieved against Isthmian and Athenian League sides during this time which led to Hampton making repeated applications to join the Athenian League. Their overtures, however, were rebuffed with a number of sides finishing lower than them being elected over their heads. All the time the club was developing the Beverley ground with new terracing, stands and clubhouse. In 1967 Hampton was also the first Spartan League side to erect floodlights which allowed them to compete with more illustrious opposition in the new midweek Floodlight League.

Eventually in 1971/2 the Athenian League relented, admitting Hampton, Straines and Addlestone to Division 2. The side had begun to change with new stars such as ex England amateur international Hugh Lindsay and goalscoring phenomenon, Peter Farron, grabbing the attention. Promotion was narrowly missed by finishing third but the following season their second place earned them election to the newly formed second Division of the Isthmian League, the only Athenian Second Division side to be accorded the honour.

Life in the Isthmian ranks proved tougher and the side finished only a moderate 12th in their first campaign. After 10 years as Manager, Roy Philpott decided to resign and was replaced by ex Dulwich Hamlet coach, Ted Murphy who did well on a limited budget and life in the Isthmian League Division 1 proved comfortable although results were unspectacular. It was evident that the team was running out of the club in the late 70s when Murphy resigned in 1979 and was replaced by ex Hampton player and Assistant Manager, Ron King. King's tenure was short lived and after a disastrous run he too resigned to be replaced in October 1980 by ex Maiden Vale manager, Roger Charnand. Charnand was obliged to tighten the purse strings and pinned his hopes on a much younger side but Hampton rarely looked like promotion candidates despite unearthing such talents as Dwight Marshall who later went on to have a successful professional career at Luton and Plymouth.

Player/Coach and ex-Sutton Utd defender, Steve Rogers took over in 1985/6 and guided Hampton to their best ever finish, 5th place, and a closely contested League Cup semi-final with Sutton which Hampton narrowly lost after drawing over two legs. Hampton also

reached two London Senior Cup Finals losing to Kingstonian and Fisher Athletic. However, after a disastrous start to the 1986/9 season when Hampton won just one of their first 15 league games, Rogers resigned and left for local rivals Watford & Herts as a player in November 1986 before becoming their manager at the end of the season. Former manager, Ted Murphy stepped in on a temporary basis before being replaced by Feltham manager Brian Laming. Hampton narrowly avoided relegation after spending most of the season in the bottom three escaping with the lowest ever total for a club not relegated. However, the following season they could not repeat the same feat of escapology and were relegated to Division 2 after 18 consecutive years in Division 1 (their first ever relegation).



The 1990/1 season saw another relegation as the bottom 11 teams were relegated to the new Division 3. Hampton finishing 12th. Brian Laming decided to resign at this stage and was replaced with Tony Beadle, a former Reserve Team manager. Beadle, however, quickly gave way to player/manager, Mark Fewings in December 1991 who managed to gain promotion back to Division 2 after Hampton finished 4th, taking advantage of club movements elsewhere in the league. 1991/2 was a season of mid-table consolidation but the 1993/4 season relegation was narrowly avoided again when new manager Paul Reynolds led the side to 13 consecutive defeats, not surprisingly causing him to be resign with player, Steve Chesham, seeing out the season as caretaker. These were perhaps the most troubled years at the club but a new era of stability and achievement arrived with the appointment of ex-Cove manager Chris Botley in tandem with Chairman Bob Hayes for the 1994/5 season. Chris guided Hampton back into Division 1 in 1996 and to 4th place in Division 1 the season

thereafter. In 1998/9 Hampton finished 3rd after a nail-biting run-in winning promotion to the Premier League for the first time in their history. But life at the top proved difficult with a limited player budget and the team struggled all season, again narrowly avoiding relegation on the last day of the season. Chris Botley was sacked in March and his assistant Tony Combe saw out the season as caretaker. Ex Yeading boss, Steve Cordery, himself briefly a Hampton player, took over for 1999/2000. This co-incided with the arrival of new Chairman Victor Searle who is now looking to drive the club forward to new heights. However, 1999/2000 again proved a difficult campaign despite an influx of new players with Hampton (now rechristened Hampton & Richmond Borough) hovering just above the relegation

zone for most of the season but eventually pulling clear to finish a best ever 13th. 2000/01 proved to be a breakthrough season with the club climbing to 4th in the league before eventually finishing a best ever 9th. Hampton also reached the First Round proper of the FA Cup for the first time ever losing narrowly to Barnet 2-1 at Underhill after leading for most of the game.

Stuart McKenzie - Highly experienced 36 year old keeper who joined from Farnborough Town in the summer of 2001. Stuart played in the Conference for the Hampshire side and helped them to win the Ryman League title in 2000. Has also played for Yeading. A valuable addition to the Beverley squad.

Konnie Givan - 18 year old left sided defender who has recently broken into the First Team squad after impressive displays for the Youth and Reserve sides. Spent eight years in Chelsea's junior system.

Mark Pitter - 25 year old defender signed from Chesham Utd in the summer of 2000. Had 3 months on

loan with Hampton in 1999/2000 but spent much of the time injured. Can play in either a right back or centre back position. Also played at Brentford and Hayes and was a Welsh Youth International.

Alex Rodrigues - Young central defender, a product of the successful youth team on 2000/01 now moving up to the senior squad.

Tony Houghton - 25 year old left back who joined the club from Dulwich Hamlet at the start of the 2000 season. Has missed most of the current season through injury.

Paul Dicker - 34 year old defender signed in October 2001. Previous experience with Yeading, Harrow and Wealdstone.

Steve Onuma - 20 year old right back signed in October 2001 and making his debut against Boreham Wood. Steve is a product of the West Ham Academy.

Aidan O'Brien - 24 year old central defender who joined in December 2001 from Harrow Borough. Previous clubs include Oxford University, Oxford United, Newcastle United, South Shields, Welwyn Utd, Hayes, Aylesbury Utd and Barnet.

Steve French - 22 year old right back previously with Woking for a number of seasons. Missed much of the season so far through injury but now establishing himself in the side.

Craig Maskell - 35 year old forward who joined in September 1999 after being released by Leyton Orient. Very experienced league professional with Southamption, Huddersfield, Reading, Swindon and Brighton. Scorer of over 130 league goals. Has recently signed a further two year contract as player/coach. Can operate in midfield or up front and has scored 27 times in 2000/01 making him the leading marksman in the Ryman League.

Richard O'Connor - 23 year old midfielder signed in the summer of 2001 from Leatherhead. Previously with Wimbledon before joining Leatherhead last season. Look out for a thunderous shot!

Darren Deegan - 20 year old wide midfielder previously with Farnborough Town who joined the club in the summer of 2001.

Kephael Nade - 20 year old French striker signed from Troyes in August 2001. Attracted the attention of the club after playing against Hampton in a pre season friendly for QPR.

Gavin Rose - 19 year old Midfielder signed in December 2001 from Gravesend & Northfleet where his chances were limited by injury to just one substitute appearance. Also featured for Bromley and Oxford City.

Ryan Hillary - 18 year old former Youth Team player now on the verge of the first team with a couple of substitute appearances.

Kasey Ibe - Young forward signed in November 2001 from Leatherhead. A member of Craig Maskell's Academy squad who has already impressed with goals in all his starts so far.

Piston Mennella - 19 year old defender/midfield player signed from Brentford in the Summer of 1999. Known as 'Fish'. Had a loan spell at Chertsey last season when on the fringes of the first team. Needs to address his poor disciplinary record, which has earned him six red cards in his short Hampton career but is now establishing himself in the centre of midfield.

Steve Cordery - Formerly took over the reins in the Summer of 1999 after being appointed in March of the previous season. Briefly a Hampton player in the 1983/4 season but best known as the former player/manager of Yeading. Steve has now put together a young squad which is just starting to gel and may just start to surprise one or two teams.

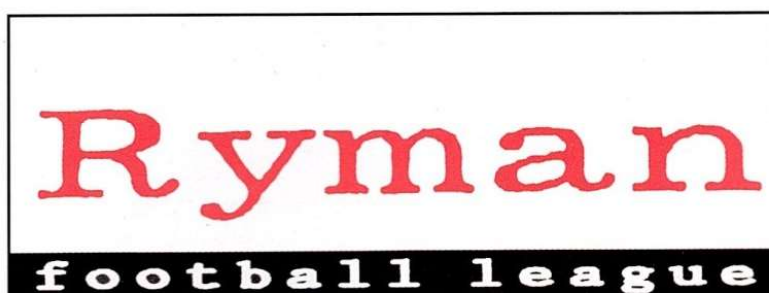
