In 1959 Hampton moved to their present ground, Beveree, which co-incided with a step up into Senior football on joining the Surrey Senior League. The initial seasons were largely uneventful until manager Peter Tagg, an ex flampton player thmself, started to recruit experi- enced players from the more senior leagues. In 1963/4 Hampton won the League Championship and gained election to the Spartan League embarking on one of their most successful periods in their history. They won the League and League on the 1964/5 season the success continued with a league and cup dou- ble in the following two seasons, a league end put heir 1968/9 and a further championship win in 1969/70.
