Introducing ...

Yeading Youth Club was formed in the 1950's and became Yeading Football Club in 1965.

Early days were spent in the now extinct Hayes & District Youth League and the old Uxbridge District Leagues. Minor successes came in the lower divisions of the Uxbridge Leagues but the club really started to blossom after 1965.

As Uxbridge League Premier Champions in 1967, the Ding joined the South West Middlesex League where they twice won the Championship and in 1968/69 won the coveted Middlesex Junior Cup for the first time. 1970/71 saw Yeading win both the Middlesex Junior and Intermediate Cups and during the 1970s they won the latter five times and the former twice.

Promotion to the Middlesex League saw them secure the Championship in their first season, scoring a record 122 goals in the process. Season 1972/73 saw the club sweep all four trophies - League and Cup - in the Middlesex League. The Middlesex Premier Cup was won in 1980/81 and after winning the Middlesex League Championship and the League's Premier Cup six times each, the club won senior status and joined the Spartan League in 1984.

Promotion to the Premier Division was achieved in their first season, and in 1985/86, the club won the League Cup having been just being pipped at the post by Collier Row in the league. That disappointment was soon forgotten as the following season, Yeading went one better securing the League and Cup double in style with a record unbeaten league season.

The same season saw election to the Vauxhall Opel League (Division Two South). In their inaugural season (1987/88) the club finished a respectable tenth. 1989/90 saw success at national level, becoming the first Middlesex club to win the FA Vase, beating Bridlington Town in a replay, at Elland Road, Leeds, after a 0-0 draw at Wembley. A magnificent season was rounded off by winning the Vauxhall Opel League Division Two (South) title.

1990/91 saw the club achieve third place in Division One and the following season the Ding became the first Middlesex Club to win all four County Cups at Junior and Senior level by securing the Middlesex Senior Cup with a 2-1 win against Wembley F.C..

1991/92 again saw success with promotion gained to the Diadora League Premier Division. After a year of consolidation the 1993/94 season saw the club achieve another milestone in their short history, by reaching the First Round Proper of the FA Cup for the first time.

Endsleigh League Division Three side Gillingham were held to a 0-0 draw in the game played at Hayes F.C., but in the replay overcame the Ding 3-1. Relegation was narrowly avoided in 1993/94 but, after the introduction of many new faces the 94/95 campaign, saw an unbeaten 16 match run, including the scalp of Conference side Telford United in the FA Cup.

That win took the club into the First Round Proper for the second successive season. Endsleigh League Division Three side Colchester United were the visitors, this time played at The Warren, the home of Yeading FC. Watched by millions on Match of the Day the Essex side were fortunate to return home with a 2-2 draw but in the replay reality hit hard - the Ding losing 7-1!

The same season also saw Yeading once again win the final of the Middlesex Senior Cup beating Staines Town 2-0 at Uxbridge F.C. and the side finished the Premier Division League campaign in ninth position, the highest in the club's history.

Season 95/96 was one of consolidation with former player Steve Cordery taking over the reins. The following year (1996/97) Cordery then led the Ding to a fifth place finish in the ICIS Premier Division. With almost exactly the same team as the previous season,1997/98 proved to be very disappointing, with Cordery leaving with eight games remaining and the club in relegation problems.

Despite wins over promotion chasing Sutton United and eventual Champions Kingstonian in those last weeks could not save the Ding from the drop relegated, level on goal difference with Bishop's Stortford, but having scored less goals.

A bright spot of season 1997/98 was the FA Umbro Trophy victory over Yeovil Town. After holding Yeovil to a goal-less draw in Somerset in front of a crowd of over 2,000, they won the replay 1-0, but in the second round Southport proved too strong taking a 6-0 win away from the Warren.

The next few seasons saw Yeading struggle to get a team to gel and challenge for promotion back to the Premier Division. Manager's Jim Melvin, Jon Turner and Paul Sweales came and went (the latter two both Vase winners as players with the Ding) before a new management team arrived in March 2001 with relegation looming.

In came joint-managers Naseem Bashir and another former Ding favourite, Johnson 'Drax' Hippolyte who had both previously gained management experience with the reserve side at Premier Division Chesham United.

With relegation once again looming, Naz and Drax made some quick moves before transfer deadline and secured the Ding a mid-table finish with just two defeats in twelve games under their charge, topping the league form table in the process.

Following his appointment as Assistant Academy Director at Reading FC, Naz Bashir left the club in December leaving Drax in sole charge of first team affairs but now assisted by coach Erskine Smart and new Assistant Manager Dereck Brown who joined from Chesham United in the summer of 2002.

Meet the players .

Steve Ashley (Defender) Strong centre-back who broke through from the reserve ranks to become club captain inside three seasons. Has suffered a number of injury setbacks, including most of 2001 on the sidelines. His mature head, assurance in defence and regular goals are an asset to any side.

Bobby Behzadi (Defender/ Midfielder) Strong, determined player who joined the Ding in the summer and immediately shone with impressive displays in midfield and at wing-back. Prior to joining the Ding Bobby saw action in the Conference for Hayes and Stevenage Borough.

Luke Blackmore (Goalkeeper) Made his ding debut between the sticks at home to Oxford City at the start of 2003 having signed at the turn of the year from Chalfont St Peter.

Dereck Brown (Assistant Manager /Midfielder) Joined during the close season in 2002 to link back up with former Chesham colleague Drax and make his first real move into management. Still one of the fittest players in the non-league game, Dereck is a former England semi-pro international and Non League Player of the Year. Past clubs include Welling United, Walton & Hersham, Woking, Wembley and Hendon. Spent the last three seasons at Chesham United where he was voted player of the year last time out.

Darti Brown (Midfielder) Hardworking midfielder who rejoined Yeading in March 2003 having spent a brief time with the club a few seasons ago. Joined the Ding from Harrow Borough where he had impressed this season, after beginning the campaign at Wembley. Has also played for Willesden Constantine.

DJ Campbell (Striker) Young



striker who started his career as a trainee at Aston Villa before moving on to QPR. Impressed on the nonleague scene at Chesham United earning him a move to Stevenage in the Conference. Signed for Yeading at the beginning of February 2003.

Dean Harper (Defender) Young full-back who joined the Ding in April 2003 from Spartan Leaguers Hanwell Town. Made his debut at home to Wivenhoe Town.

Danny Hawksworth (Defender) Made his debut for the Ding as a substitute in the opening game of season 2000/2001. Has since proven a mature and competent player playing on either flank or in the middle and has made himself a first team regular. Previous clubs include local rivals, Southall, Uxbridge and Northwood.

Junior Hinckson (Striker) Young, pacy forward who linked up with the Ding pre-season before signing Ryman forms.

Johnson Hippolyte

(Striker/Manager) Took over the managerial reins at the Ding in March 2001 after attaining success with his first taste of management running Chesham United's young reserve side. Originally as joint-manager with Naz Bashir, who left in December 2001. A distinguished career as a striker saw 'Drax' score goals for Hampton, Aldershot Town, Dulwich Hamlet, Chesham United, Chertsey Town, Wealdstone, Chalfont St. Peter, Uxbridge, Hounslow and the Ding. Starred as a player for Yeading in their only FA Cup First Round Appearances in 1993 and 1994. Still starring now as a player, having made a number of scoring appearances from the bench last season.

Matt Hodson (Goalkeeper) In his second spell at the club after returning to The Warren at the beginning of season 2001/02. Began in the Wycombe Youth ranks before spells in the Ding reserves and at Marlow before moving to Hayes, where he made numerous appearances between the sticks in the Nationwide Conference. Forced out by injury at the end of last season, but back to full fitness for a good pre-season before another injury saw him lose his place again. Now back as Yeading's first choice goalkeeper.

Otis Hutchings (Midfielder) Once ranked as one of the most promising youngsters in the non-league game, Otis joined the Ding in the summer and finds himself as one of the elder statesmen of the squad having only just entered his third decade. Great ball-winner and motivator, Otis began his career as a Chelsea trainee and has since seen service with Boreham Wood, Aldershot Town, Walton & Hersham, Tooting & Mitcham, Molesey, Hampton, Dulwich Hamlet and Chesham United. Injury forced him out of much of last season.

Danny Jordan (Midfielder/ Striker) Local lad who first impressed at Uxbridge forcing his way into the first team after a highly successful spell in the reserves. A move to Spartan League Brook House followed where he continued his prolific scoring. Danny arrived at The Warren in February 2002 after a brief spell with Hillingdon Borough.

Dwane Lee (Defender/Midfielder) Creative midfield player who has been attracting the attentions of pro clubs in recent seasons. First made an impression in the young Yeading reserve side in 1998, before making his first team debut in November of that year. Since then has gone from strength to strength creating chances, scoring goals and grafting hard in midfield. In recent games has shown his versatility by converting to centre back, where his height is an obvious advantage.

Ashley Leenders (Striker) Young, pacy forward who rejoined the Ding in March 2002 from Windsor & Eton. Has also played for Harrow Borough, Edgware Town, Wealdstone and Hampton & Richmond Borough. Recently returned from a long injury lay-off.

Carl Levene (Midfielder) Rejoined the Ding in October 2002 from Egham Town having made the move there from Maidenhead United and Harrow Borough since leaving the Warren last. Has also seen service with Boreham Wood, Northwood, Wembley and Kingsbury Town.

Nick Leach (Defender) Tall central defender who spent two seasons on the books at Wycombe Wanderers playing 6 times in the Nationwide League before being released and trying his hand at non-league with Dulwich Hamlet, Aylesbury United and Chesham United. Joined the Ding in September 2002, making his debut as a sub at Thame United in the league.

Ryan McIntosh (Midfielder) Ryan linked up with the Ding in preseason 2001 and made an immediate impact with a goal in each of his first two games. Full of natural ability and a wizard at dead ball situations, Ryan was previously with QPR. Made his competitive debut at home to Wealdstone in 2001.

Matt Miller (Striker) Signed for the Ding during the summer of 2001 having previously been with Hampton & Richmond Borough. Made an immediate impact netting 33 times in Ding colours in his first season and winning the coveted Players' Player Trophy. Jonathan Mills (Midfielder) Skillful wide player who signed at transfer-deadline March 2002 from Buckingham. Joined the Robins in August 2001 from Bedford Town having spent his formative years with Cambridge United. Made a handful of appearances at the end of last season before an impressive pre-season campaign to secure a first team spot.

Keith Newby (Midfielder) Tenacious midfield dynamo who originally joined the Ding in March 2001 on loan from Harrow Borough, before a permanent move to The Warren in the summer of that year. Newbs had joined Boro at the start of season 2000/1 from Chelmsford City. Has also gained experience at Cambridge City and Cambridge United.

Kevin Randall (Defender) Central defender who impressed in pre-season when he arrived at The Warren, making his full debut in the opening league game of 2002/03 at Hertford Town.

Emond Protain (Defender) Leftsided player who joined the Ding in the summer of 2002 from local rivals Harrow Borough. Had signed for Boro from Wembley in the summer of 2000, before making an impression in the Capital League side at Earlsmead then in the first team.

Nevin Saroya (Defender/ Midfielder) Nev made a name for himself as a Brentford trainee where he impressed boss Ron Noades enough for first team selection. At six-foot-three tall his presence in the air is immense but he is also very strong with the ball at his feet. His footballing talents are already worldrenowned having featured in Vinnie Jones' side in the film Mean Machine.

Erskine Smart (Coach) Experienced player who has seen service with Harrow Borough, Farnborough Town, Hendon, Enfield, St Albans City, Kingstonian, Dulwich Hamlet and Walton & Hersham. Joined the Ding in January 2002 on the coaching side.

Errol Telemaque (Striker) Skillful forward who originally signed on loan from Conference side Hayes just before transfer deadline 2001, before making the move permanent in the close season that followed. Scored twenty goals in all competitions last season despite a number of injuries. Previously made a name for himself at Stevenage Borough.

Leon Woodruffe (Defender / Midfielder) Defensive midfielder who re-joined Yeading in October 2002 from Hendon. Signed for Hendon in December 2001 from local rivals Harrow Borough, having previously appeared for Yeading, Hampton & Richmond Borough and Wembley.

Introducing ...

Canvey Island Football Club had another recordbreaking season last term when they reached the Third Round Proper of the FA Cup for the first time.

On the way they beat five teams including two from the Second Division of the Football League, Wigan Athletic at the JJB Stadium, and Northampton Town in front of a full house at Park Lane and five million television viewers on 'Match of the Day Live'. Burnley finally knocked them out in a memorable game at Turf Moor.

For the second season running the team finished runners-up in the Ryman Premier League, despite winning thirty games and scoring 108 goals.

In defending the FA Trophy the team had a fine run before narrowly losing away to the eventual winners, Yeovil Town. The team did, however, end the season with silverware when winning the Essex Senior Cup, beating Dagenham & Redbridge in the final.

The previous season saw the team win the FA Trophy by beating Forest Green Rovers from the Conference League 1-0 in the final in front of over 10,000 people at Villa Park and thousands more watching live on television. To win the FA Trophy they had to beat four Conference League teams in succession - Stevenage Borough, Telford United, Chester City and Forest Green. In previous rounds Canvey defeated Harlow Town, Northwood and Bilston Town.

Earlier in the season the Club had another great FA Cup run and after beating Braintree Town, King's Lynn and Cambridge City they were drawn against Port Vale from the Second Division of the Football League. In an exciting match at Park Lane they drew 4-4 after being 4-2 down with only two minutes left to play. However, even better was to come as they went to Port Vale and beat them 2-1 after extra time.

They were then drawn at home to Football League neighbours Southend United. To accommodate the number of people wishing to see the game, Canvey agreed to transfer the match to Southend's Roots Hall ground. A capacity crowd of 11,400 people saw the game, with record gate receipts for a game at Southend, and Canvey were narrowly beaten.

These tremendous cup runs took their toll in the League. With a large number of matches being postponed on opponents grounds because of waterlogged pitches, it meant they had to complete the season with ten league games in fifteen days and consequently dropped points that may have taken them to the league title and a place in the Conference League. However, it was still a fine performance to finish runners-up in their second season in the Premier Division.

The Club was founded in 1926 but the early records of the Club were lost in the devastating East Coast floods of 1953. The Club has enjoyed a meteoric rise up the football pyramid during the last ten years since Jeff King, a former Canvey player, became manager in 1992. The Club was then in the Essex Senior League and in 1993 the team won the League title and reached the semi-final of the FA Vase.

The Club gained promotion to the Isthmian League in 1994 and won promotion from Division Three and Division Two in successive seasons. In 1995/96 after beating Conference team Hednesford Town in the FA Cup they reached the First Round Proper and drew 2-2 with Brighton & Hove Albion at Park Lane in front of a ground record crowd of 3,400. The replay was lost at Brighton with a gate of over 7,000. As well as winning Division Two the team were also winners of the Carlton Trophy and Thameside Trophy.

In 1996/97 the team found life difficult in Division One and were relegated. Glenn Pennyfather, a former Football League and Canvey player, was appointed as first team coach for the following season and Canvey became Division Two champions on the final day of the season.

Season 1998/99 was another exciting one for the supporters as the Club won the Division One championship and the Essex Senior Cup beating Leyton Orient in the final.

1999/2000 was the Club's first season in the Premier Division and they finished a very creditable fifth in the league and retained the Essex Senior Cup defeating Purfleet 2-0 in the final.

Last season the Club again made considerable ground improvements, including a new terrace at the Park Lane end, and the ground achieved Conference League grading.

Meet the players ...

Ashley Harrison -

Goalkeeper who rejoined the Club in 1999 after a spell with Dover Athletic. Was an important member of the FA Trophy winning team and was almost ever present over the last two seasons.

Danny Potter - Goalkeeper signed on the eve of the new season. Previously played for Chelmsford City, Heybridge Swifts and Exeter City.

Gavin Cowan - A promising young defender who was signed from Braintree Town, where he was captain, in December 2002.

Micky Bennett - Signed in 1999 from Brighton & Hove Albion where he had been 'Player of the Year'. Strong, quick skilful player who is

equally at home in midfield or defence. Has also played League football for Leyton Orient, Cardiff City, Millwall, Charlton Athletic, Brentford and Wimbledon.

Ben Chenery - A defender who joined the Club in December 2000 from Kettering Town and will go down in Canvey folklore for scoring the winning goal in the FA Trophy final. Started his career at Luton Town before joining Cambridge United where he made 96 appearances.

Craig Davidson - Returned to the Club in the close season after a season with Braintree Town. He is a left sided defender who originally joined Canvey in 1999 from Billericay Town. Previous clubs include Aldershot Town, Southend United and Dagenham & Redbridge.

Kevin Dobinson - A utility player signed in the close season from Chelmsford City. He was their captain last season and made a total of 120 appearances for the club.

Ross Johnson - A central defender signed in September from Dagenham & Redbridge. He previously played for Colchester United and prior to that made over 150 appearances for Brighton & Hove Albion.

Steve Ward - Pacy defender who has become a supporters' favourite with many fine defensive displays since joining from Ryman Leaguers Grays Athletic in 1996. Recently made his 300th appearance for the Club.

Mark Brennan - A midfield player signed from Billericay Town in November. He began his career at Ipswich Town before moves to Middlesborough for £375,000, Manchester City £500,000) and Oldham £200,000). He has made over 380 Football League appearances and also played for Dagenham & Redbridge. **Chris Duffy** - A tall, athletic midfield player who joined Canvey from Northwich Victoria in 1999. Played in the 1996 FA Trophy final for Northwich and in the 2001 final for Canvey. Previously with Crewe and Wigan.

Scott Forbes - A midfield player signed in the close season after two seasons with Southend United where he was 'Player of the Year'. Previously with Saffron Waldon and Bishop's Stortford.

David Gregory - Signed for the Club in the close season from Colchester United who he joined in 1995, making 264 appearances and scoring 26 goals. Can play in midfield or defence and began his career at Ipswich, where he played 16 first team games (scoring a hat-trick on his debut), before joining Peterborough. Elder brother of striker Neil.

Matt Jones - A midfield player signed in the close season from Dagenham & Redbridge, where he made over 100 appearances. A former England schoolboy international, he went on to play for Southend United, Heybridge Swifts, St Albans and Chelmsford City.

John Kennedy - A key midfield player for Canvey over the last two seasons, he was voted 'Man of the Match' in the FA Trophy final. Signed from Ipswich Town where he came up through the youth system and made eight first team appearances. Played this season for the England semi-pro team against Italy and scored.

Spencer Knight - A left sided midfield player who was signed from Harrow Borough in November 2001. His previous clubs include St Albans, Arsley and Luton Town.

Jeff Minton - Joined the Club in August 2002. A very experienced Football League player, his clubs include Tottenham, Brighton, Rotherham and Leyton Orient. Played for Port Vale in the thrilling 4-4 FA Cup draw with Canvey in 2000, scoring twice.

Steve Parmenter - A midfield player who has also played up front for Canvey. Signed in 1998 from Kingstonian. Spent two years at Bristol Rovers, making 18 Football League appearances, and also played for Yeovil Town. A Wales Under 21 international.

Lee Protheroe - A midfield player or defender signed from Aldershot Town in the close season. Joined Aldershot from Enfield in 2000 and previously played for Yeading and Ruislip Manor.

Ollie Berquez - A striker who was signed from Braintree Town in December 2002. He was previously with Chelmsford City, Billericay Town and Dagenham & Redbridge.

Lee Boylan - Signed in August 2001 and scored 43 goals for the Club last season, winning the Ryman League 'Golden Boot Award'. Previous clubs include West Ham United, Trelleborg, Kingstonian, Exeter, Hayes and Heybridge Swifts. Last season's Supporters Club 'Player of the Year'.

Bertie Brayley - Signed for Canvey in August 2002 after previously playing for Swindon Town and QPR. Was a member of West Ham's 1999 FA Youth Cup winning team, scoring three goals in the two-legged final against Coventry City.

Neil Gregory - Signed for Canvey in February 2000 from Colchester United, who had paid a record £350,000 for his services. Previously played for Ipswich Town, Peterborough United and Torquay United. Made 119 Football League appearances scoring 29 goals. Scored 25 goals for Canvey last season including the winning goals in the FA Cup ties against Wigan Athletic and Northampton Town.
