## Introducing ...

With the continued sponsorship from Coldseal, seeing the Rebels reach the final of the cup competition sponsored by Coldseal's sister company, Bryco, is a great day for all those involved with the club and it is with great thanks to financial assistance that Coldseal have provided the Rebels through their sponsorship that Slough Town FC has been in a position to compete, both on and off the pitch, in these last two seasons.

This season Slough Town F.C. is commencing its second season at Stag Meadow, the home of Windsor and Eton. It is hoped that the club will return to its home town in the near future, and in due time return to the upper echelons of the non league pyramid. This season has seen the club has reach the Second Round Proper of the FA Cup and the Fifth Round of the FA Trophy, and of course, here today in the Bryco Cup Final.

The clubs first season ground sharing also proved to be a fruitful one under the guidance of manager Eddie Denton who saw the signings of Matt Miller, Freddie Hyatt, Glen Harris, Chris Payne and the highly rated Danny Steer during the summer of his first season replace those who had departed, a fourth place finish in the Ryman Division One South was secured meaning the club avoided relegation due to league restructuring.

The striking partnership of Tony Boot and Ian Hodges, who managed 66 goals between them throughout the season, broke a post-war Slough Town goalscoring partnership record. The club also had an excellent run in to the season which saw them only lose four of their last twenty four matches in all competitions from the turn of the year.

Recent times have seen Slough reach the FA Cup first round on three occasions, narrowly losing twice, once against Macclesfield, on penalties after forcing the Division Two side to a replay, and North West Counties League Harrogate Railway, going down 2-1 at Wexham Park in the midst of mixed league fortunes. This season saw the Rebels cause the upset of the First Round by beating Paul Merson's League One side Walsall in their first FA Cup shock in over 20 years.

Since their expulsion from the Conference after the 1997/98 season, the side was rescued by a deal from a consortium headed by Martyn Deaner nine days before the start of the season. The club began that season with a very scratch squad with only five players remaining from the previous Conference squad to begin the season along with a group of hastily recruited players. An astonishing opening game saw the 'Rebels' overcome the favourites for the Ryman Premier Division title, Sutton United, by a single goal in what can only be described as an heroic performance.

The club continued to build on this success and the appointment of Graham Roberts to assist Paul Hardyman with the management of the side, proved to be a turbulent one, but one which brought quality onto the playing fields at Wexham Park. Slough began the 1999/2000 season as one of the hot favourites for the title with the squad that Roberts built, but faded away throughout the season. Steve Browne, Roberts assistant, took over the reigns with Roberts resigning from the managers position, and guided Slough to a comfortable ninth place.

Big name signings took place over the summer as the club prepared for another push at the title, but very public off-field problems appeared to help the Rebels demise as they were relegated from the Premier Division from the first time in their history. In the following season, a poor start cost them dearly, despite a tremendous effort from the squad, and around March time, the club's bid for promotion faded.

With the regionalization of the Ryman Division One came renewed hope. A pre-season campaign was arranged and a squad full of proven ability was being formed. The Rebels topped the table once during the season, and were always around the two available promotion spots, but it proved a step too far. A bright partnership between Sammy Winston and Tony Boot was a big highlight for the travelling 'Barmy Army', as they managed 67 goals between them in all competitions.

At the end of 1997-98 the 'Rebels' were semi-finalists once again in the F.A. Trophy losing 2-1 on aggregate to Southport. Finishing in eighth place after completing the double against Kidderminster Harriers on the final day of the season the consortium decided that they could no longer fund the club, and with ground improvements required for Slough Town to stay in the division, the club was relegated from the Conference instead of Telford United.

#### Meet the men from Slough ...

Michael Parkin - Young keeper who has impressed management and fans alike with his displays in the pre-season following his release from Torquay United. Has taken his chance to prove his considerable value to the team following an injury to first choice keeper Shaun Allaway earlier in the season and is providing excellent competition to Shaun for the first team keepers spot despite his young age.

Shaun Allaway - Signed for the Rebels after leaving QPR earlier in the season. Shaun made his name while at Reading where he was transferred to Leeds United for a fee of around £200,000. Has become a popular player with supporters with his excellent shotstopping ability. Made his debut in the FA Cup First Round defeat of League One side Walsall.

Steve Daly - The Rebels clubcaptain who signed for Slough from fellow Ryman League side Boreham Wood in February 1998, at which point the club went on to keep six consecutive clean sheets in the League coinciding with Daly's debut for the Rebels. One of the first names on the Rebels teamsheet. Had a spell on loan with Hayes two-seasons ago. Steve made his 200th competitive first team appearance for Slough in the fourth match of the season at Tonbridge, and is expected to be making his 250th Slough appearance in this match.

Michael Murphy - Lives in Slough and was at one time of Millwall's books. Initially turned out for the Rebels in the Conference before moving on. Was signed from Windsor and Eton last October, and has become a stalwart in the centre of the defence alongside Steve Daly. Has also been utilized to great effect down the left flank, either at full back or wing back. Capable of scoring from distance as he has proved on a number of occasions this season having found the target five times.

**James Saulsbury** - Young defender who has joined the club from Thame United following an impressive 2003/4 season with the Oxfordshire club. Has impressed during the pre-season for Slough with intelligent distribution of the ball and good reading of the game

and has continued this good form throughout the 04/05 season for Slough becoming a vital member of the Rebels back line. Has also chipped in with two goals, both from the penalty spot. Picked up five awards at the recent Presentation Evening for the club including Players Player. **Danny Steer** - Joined the club

**Danny Steer** - Joined the club from Eastleigh on a two year contract after impressing manager Eddie Denton during the clubs preseason campaign. Dangerous down the left flank, has the ability to put in dangerous crosses from the wing or from set pieces. Works hard up and down the line for the team. Started 27 times for Slough in the 03/04 season scoring once, against Corinthian Casuals. Has been blighted by injury this season, but has still contributed enormously to a successful Rebels season so far.

Josias Carbon - Young attack minded full back who joined the club in the summer of 2004 following on from his release from Oxford United. Enjoyed a loan spell with the Rebels during the 2003/4 season which suitably impressed the management to snap him up. Despite playing as wing back, Josias is regularly found on the scoresheet at Slough with nine goals to his credit this season so far.

#### Darron Wilkinson -

Experienced player who joined from Woking during the 2000/1 season. Also has experience while playing for Hayes, who during his time there achieved their highest placed Conference finish. Tough tackling, no nonsense midfielder who has also filled in at right back and looked equally comfortable. Darron had made 115 appearances for Slough at the end of the 03/04 season. Despite Darron's role, he has also managed to chip in with some vital goals during his time with the club scoring twice.

Veli Hakki - Midfielder resigned from Boreham Wood, a move welcomed by fellow players and Slough fans alike. Creative player who originally signed for the club from Dulwich Hamlet by former manager Steve Browne for a small fee. Very capable on the ball of both picking out passes and also drifting past players. Another young player with a very bright future ahead of him. Has started 82 games for Slough, scoring seven times by the end of the 03/04 season.

**Sam Shepherd** - 23 year old midfielder who joined the club during the summer of 2004 from neighbours Oxford City. Has proved to be an excellent midfielder enforcer, although his opportunities have been limited this season due to injury. Another youngster with a bright future ahead of him as he continues to develop under the guidance of Micky Lewis and Eddie Denton.

**Christian Metcalfe** -Experienced Ryman League midfielder returning to the club after a season long spell with Northwood during their Ryman Premier League campaign in the 2003/4 season. Vocal midfielder who can boss the midfield. Has the ability to both put the boot in when required with some ferocious tackling, but can also play the creative pass. Has formed a formidable partnership with Darron Wilkinson in the centre of the Slough midfield. Made 38 appearances for Slough in the 2001/2 season, and scored his first Slough goal at Hampton & Richmond in a Ryman Premier Division match earlier this season.

Glen Harris - Local Slough boy who joined the club from Hayes during the summer of 2003/4, having played conference football in the past from the Middlesex club. Comfortable at playing centrally or on the right wing, Glen really found form toward the end of the 03/04 season, combining his form into an excellent run experienced by the team. Works hard on the pitch for the team and continues to cause problems for the opposition. Made over thirty starts for Slough in the 03/04 season and scored eight times. Has added an additional fourteen goals this season from midfield.

Ryan Spencer - In his second season at the club after joining from neighbors Hayes. Ryan is a versatile player who is capable of playing in a number of positions and has featured at right back. right midfield and central midfield during his time with the club, looking equally comfortable in each position. At the start of the season, Ryan had started 66 games for Slough despite missing the back endof the 03/04 season with a serious injury sustained at Marlow, chipping in with eleven goals with six more goals added already this year following his 30 starts for the club so far this season.

Leigh Mason - Young tenacious midfielder signed from Flackwell Heath after a number of eye catching performances in the Capital League side. Has now made the step up into the first team and continues to impress with his reading of the game and ball distribution. Is comfortable playing in a number of positions across midfield and has an excellent engine.

Ian Hodges - His 39 goal haul in all competitions last season, which included 36 league goals, made Ian the Ryman League Division One South's highest scorer for 2003/4. Despite interest from professional clubs during the summer, Ian has pledged his future to the Rebels. Has shown his dedication to the team this season by playing at centre back, where he looks equally comfortable following a series of commanding performances in the Rebels back line.

Matt Miller - Joined the club in the summer of 2003 from Yeading and signed on a two year contract. Popular player with the Slough fans who has a very good goalscoring record at this level and a bright future ahead of him. Matt has been blighted by a series of minor injuries this term, but has continued to put in a series of impressive performances in the Capital League. Works hard and will always cause problems for opposing defences.

**Matt Seedel** - Young striker who has progressed through the reserve side at Slough continuing to impress. Put in a number of eye catching performances for the Capital League side and was scoring nearly a goal a game during last season. Made his breakthrough into the first team toward the end of the 03/04 season and has continued to improve and impress the management and fans with his close control. Has hit nine goals this season so far.

Matt Murphy - Former Oxford United, Bury and Kettering player who is as equally at home in midfield as he is up-front. Strong with the ball at his feet and also in the air, Matt's intelligent use of the ball is often the catalyst for Slough attacks. Has impressed since his arrival during the early part of the season and has become top scorer for the club so far this season hitting over 20 goals already this season.

Daniel Cann - Young striker snapped up by the club following his release from AFC Bournemouth. Pacy and tricky on the ball, Dan provides the front line with an added dimension and has the ability to change games with his skill. Scored his first goal for the Rebels in their recent Ryman Premier Division match at Folkestone Invicta.

## Introducing ...

During the summer of 1999, the club adopted the new title of Hampton & Richmond Borough FC, having been known as Hampton FC since its formation in 1921 after meetings involving several local clubs within the Hampton area.

The club is the only Senior Association Football club within the boundaries of the London Borough of Richmond upon Thames in South West Middlesex. Hampton's formative years were spent in local Junior Leagues, the Kingston & District and the South West Middlesex. Hampton were Champions of the KDL twice in the early 1930s. In 1959 Hampton acquired the lease to their own ground, known as Beveree, and were able to make the step up into Senior Amateur Football. Hampton became members of the Surrey Senior league (despite being on the North Bank of the Thames in Middlesex!).

In 1964 Hampton claimed the Surrey Senior Championship and secured a move up the ladder into the Spartan League, where in just seven seasons, the Beavers won four league titles and a runnersup spot plus frequent league and cup doubles as Hampton became a powerhouse in the local area. Hampton had ambitions to progress further but were thwarted in their attempts to join the Isthmian League. The club had already installed floodlights by 1967.

Instead, in 1971, an invitation to join the Athenian League was accepted, but within two years the Isthmian League undertook a period of expansion andabsorbed a number of Athenian teams into its membership, including Hampton who in 1973 became founder members of the newly formed Isthmian League Second Division (which until the recent North/South re-organisation revamp was the First Division).

Hampton stayed at the same level, achieving a highest position of fifth, until 1990 when a series of poor seasons saw the Beavers slump to the Third Division. However a remarkable transformation occurred and between 1994 and 1998 Hampton swept through the divisions to gain promotion to the Premier Division. Hampton, still to all intents and purposes, a small village club, found the adjustment to the higher levels of the Isthmian Premier Division a constant battle to remain competitive. Much to many pundits surprise, Hampton not only survived the first season, finishing 19th ,but improved over the next two seasons to finish a creditable 9th in the 2000/01 season. During this season of all seasons, Hampton also made it through to the First Round Proper of the F A Cup for the first time in their history. Hampton were drawn away to Football League side Barnet and were leading by a 1-0 score line with just five minutes to go when the league side struck back with two late killer goals.

Unfortunately, the next three seasons saw a gradual slide back down the table, until relegation in the 2002/03 season, when the Beavers finished last. Hampton & Richmond Borough, aware that proposed re-organisation of the national game involving changes to the Conference were in the offing, made the bold step of asking Alan Devonshire, of West Ham and England fame, to take over the reins. Moulding together virtually a brand new squad of players, Mr Devonshire piloted the side to a promotion spot to cement a return to the Isthmian (Ryman) Premier Division at the first opportunity. The next step, now, is a place in Conference South.

On 29th September 2003, Hampton & Richmond Borough became a Limited Company after 80+ years as a Members Club with the fervent hope that sound financial management off the pitch will continue to be reflected by success on it.

#### Meet the men from the Beveree ...

Alan Devonshire was appointed at the beginning of July 2003 and was given the task of restor-ing the club to the Premier Division at the earliest opportunity. Mr Devonshire, who had great success in his previous post at Maidenhead United (and it was to his credit that so many of his former players elected to make the move to Hampton with him), was equal to the task and guided the Beavers into a promotion place. Mr Devonshire had an outstanding career with West Ham United and England as a slim, silky smooth winger with great pace (he may no longer be slim, but Alan tells me his touch hasn't deserted

him!). Alan still turns out for the occasional Charity game and is regularly asked to sign all types of Hammers memorabilia that seem to turn up with every postal delivery.

Carl Taylor has also made the jump from Maidenhead to Hampton and is responsible for all the training sessions and warmups. Carl is usually very fit and the players know that he won't ask them to do anything he can't (trouble is, he CAN do everything!). Age, however, may be catching up with him as during the latter part of last season, 'Benno' was seen hobbling around with the help of a walking stick! Physio: Adrian Jenkinson After a full season at Beveree Adrian is settling into his first involvement in football but, at times, is still finding the pace a little slower than in his previous experiences. Bearing in mind that Adrian spent 12 years in the Ambulance Service and was then was Physio for the Guildford Ice Hockey Club, he's probably thinking 'this is different!'

Sarah Morford, whose fatherin-law is the club's groundsman and also a former club physio, acts as cover for Adrian Jenkinson Goalkeepers Adrian Blake; yes he's back, the youngest 40 year old in the Ryman League. With experience at too many clubs to mention, Adrian has returned after a short absence to give cover at the important position of keeper.

**Kieron Drake**: Hampton's first choice keeper this season, 26 year old who starred between the posts in both encounters last season when he was playing for an opposing side, Marlow. Kieron also spent three seasons each at Basingstoke Town and Maidenhead United.

Matt Elverson: 30 year old who signed from Kingstonian during the summer. Matt had two spell with Ks and has also played for Walton & Hersham, Carshalton Athletic, Hayes and Basingstoke Town.

Graham Harper: 28 year old who certainly grabbed Devo's attention when he scored twice for Whyteleafe against the Beavers last season. 'Leafe's Player of the Season last year, previously played for Lewes and Croydon.

**Alan Inns**: 22 year old, came as a midfielder but was instantly recruited into the back four, at the

start of the 2002/03 season. Alan has played for Wokingham and Oxford City. Alan, over the past two seasons, has become a regular in the first team, either in the back four or in midfield. Last season Alan picked up a hat trick of awards, Supporters Player of the Year, Players Player of the Year and Manager's Player of the Year.

Jamie Jarvis: 33 year old, a dominating centre-back but is also adept enough to play midfield or even as a striker. Jamie has also had previous experience at Hayes, Grays Athletic & Maidenhead United. In the past Jamie had a reputation as an intimidating player but last won the Club's Sportsman of the Year Award! (he's really a pussy cat at heart).

**Orlando Jeffrey**: 26 year old, centre-back who was a regular in the back four last season. Previously with Maidenhead United and Burnham. Orlando is apparently a member of the Old Bill, (no, not the TV Series), and can often be spotted in the vicinity of Notting Hill, driving NOT walking!

**Rob Paris**: 25 year old defender who became a rock at the heart of Hampton's defence last season. Rob has also played for Beaconsfield SYCOB, Aylesbury United & Maidenhead.
