The award will be presented to Mick at the League's Banquet and Ball on Saturday, 16th June. The Ryman Football League warmly congratulates Mick on being awarded this deserved honour.

PLAY-OFFS

The Play-off Dates for the Ryman Football League have been agreed by the Board of Directors as follows:

Step 3 - Premier Division Semi Finals - One Game (Tuesday / Wednesday 1st / 2nd May 2007) Club in 2nd place vs. Club in 5th place Club in 3rd place vs. Club in 4th place Final - One Game (Saturday, 5th May 2006) Highest placed club will play at home. Step 4 (First Division) Semi Finals - One Game (Monday, 1st May

2006) Club in 3rd place v Club in 6th place Club in 4th place v Club in 5th place Final - One Game (Saturday, 6th May 2006)

Highest placed club will play at home In the event a team having a match which takes precedence, such as the County FA Senior Cup Final, then the play-off will be rescheduled.

AFC WIMBLEDON STATEMENT The Ryman League acknowledges with surprise the decision of The Football Association in allowing the appeal of AFC Wimbledon and substituting a deduction of 3 points in place of the deduction of 18 points ordered by the League.

The League has deliberately withheld comment on this matter until the outcome of the appeal was known, and now believes that it is appropriate to



.

make a formal statement.

Any decision of the League Board is made in what is believed to be the best interests of all 66 member clubs. This issue is not anything personal against a particular Club but was a decision honestly made by the Board of Appeal of the League.

In this case, the original charge of playing an ineligible player was admitted by AFC Wimbledon which submitted a plea in mitigation to the League Board.

Observers have commented that the action which caused the problem was an honest mistake by a volunteer. While the League does not deny the mistake was honestly made, it does not accept that it was by a volunteer. The Club Secretary is a full time employee of the Club and the League is entitled to expect a comparable level of expertise. The Club through its QC has admitted that the mistake was a "crass error" by the Secretary.

Supporters of the Club have expressed various views, including criticism of the League for not discovering the problem sooner. The League cannot be blamed for this because in completing the registration form for Jermaine Darlington the Club stated "AFC Wimbledon" in response to the enquiry as to the last club the player played for.

The League does not, in any event, have access to the Football Association database and it is therefore only the FA which can discover whether or not a player requires, and has, International Clearance. If, however, the name of Cardiff City FC had been put on the form the League would have been able to enquire of the Club as to why they had answered "n/a" on the form to the question "if last club outside England, has International Transfer Certificate been obtained?".

This demonstrates a weakness in a system over which the League has no control and it is to be hoped that the FA will now implement changes to their own system.

The decision of the FA confirms that the League acted correctly and that it did not misinterpret its own League Rule and that the deduction of 18 points was wholly in accordance with the

Rules; The FA also confirmed that the League correctly interpreted the meaning of "shall" in Rule 6.8, which provides that "Any club found to have played an ineligible player in a match shall have any points gained from that match deducted from its record"

It is therefore difficult to understand how the Appeal Board can make such a finding and then vary the decision of the League. The League will now wait to receive the written reasons of the Board before it can comment further on the decision.

Prior to the introduction of Standardised Rules in 2005 the Ryman League did not require a club to have International Clearance to make a player eligible to play in the League. It is understood that the Premier League and The Football League do not currently include this requirement. It is therefore hoped that the FA will now amend Standardised Rules so that this matter cannot occur again.

The League very much regrets that this whole matter has arisen. The Appeal Board of the League could find no reason to deduct anything other than 18 points and notes that the Appeal Board of the FA has been able to find a reason. It was appropriate that the League Board should follow its own Rules and leave any variation to the Football Association. In this way the League can be said to have acted correctly and in the best interests of all member clubs and it is to be hoped that this will now be an end to the matter.

SEASON 2007/08

The Board of Directors have confirmed that season 2007/08 will start on Saturday, 18th August 2007, and will conclude on Saturday, 26th April, 2008.

This is the same as the Southern Football League has provisionally announced. The Premier League, Football League and Football Conference will commence season 2007/08 on Saturday, 11th August.

ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING The League's Annual General Meeting will take place at Staines Town Football Club on the evening of Monday, 18th June 2007.

ISTHMIAN YOUTH LEAGUE -SEASON 2007/08

In 2005 the Ryman Football League reintroduced a Youth Cup after an absence of 13 years and as part of its commitment to development of a Charter League.

Following discussion with member clubs, the Board of Directors have now confirmed that the Isthmian Youth League will be formed for season 2007/08.

It is clear from the positive applications received from member clubs that an initial Youth League, based on the area of the League south of London, is a practical proposition for next season.

The Youth League, which will also be open to clubs from other senior leagues, will commence in September 2007.

The Board are certain that once the Youth League has been established, it will grow from strength to strength.

PLAYER REGISTRATIONS

The registration of players in the League drew to a close at 5.00 p.m. Saturday afternoon, when despite a full League programme being played, this did not prevent a steady flow of telephone calls and a few more registrations during the afternoon.

At the closure, 2,781 players have been registered in the League this season. This is slightly up on the previous season's total of 2,724.

685 players have been

transferred/changed clubs or have had their registrations cancelled - twelve months ago the figure was 614.

END OF SEASON PROMOTION & RELEGATION

The Football Association have confirmed the procedures relating to promotion and relegation at the conclusion of season 2006/2007. Set out below are the details of how this will operate, taking into account the changed structure for this season.

Therefore, the following procedures will apply:

Step 1 and Step 2

The clubs finishing in the bottom four places at Step 1 at the end of the playing season will be relegated to a feeder pool and placed in the most geographically appropriate division at Step 2. They will be replaced by the clubs finishing in 1st position in each of the divisions at Step 2 together with a further two clubs which win a series of play off matches involving those clubs finishing in positions 2 to 5 in each of the divisions at Step 2.

Step 2 and Step 3 The clubs in the bottom three places in

each of the two divisions at Step 2 at the end of the playing season will be

relegated to a feeder pool and placed in the most geographically appropriate division at Step 3. They will be replaced by the clubs finishing in 1st position in each of the divisions at Step 3 together with a further three clubs determined by a series of play off matches involving those clubs finishing in positions 2 to 5 in each of the divisions at Step 3. The promoted clubs will also be placed in a feeder pool and placed in the most geographically appropriate division at Step 2.

Step 3 and Step 4 The clubs in the bottom three places in each of the three divisions at Step 3 at the end of the Season 2006/2007 will be relegated to a feeder pool and placed in the most geographical appropriate division at Step 4. These nine clubs will be joined by an additional club, this being the club finishing fourth from bottom in the three divisions at Step 3 with the lowest points gained per game played. This club will also be allocated to a feeder pool. They will be replaced by the

club finishing in 1st position in each of the divisions at Step 4 together with a further five clubs to be determined by a series of play off matches involving those clubs finishing in positions 2 to 5 in each of the divisions at Step 4. The promoted clubs will also be placed in a feeder pool and placed in the most geographically appropriate division at Step 3.

Step 4 and Step 5

The clubs in the bottom two places in each of the five divisions at Step 4 will be replaced by the ten most suitable clubs from the leagues at Step 5 as determined by the LC. Each of these leagues will nominate the club finishing in 1st position subject to meeting the entry criteria and wishing to be considered for promotion. In the event of the 1st placed club not being nominated, the club finishing in 2nd position can be nominated subject to the same criteria. Both the clubs relegated from Step 4 and the clubs to be promoted from Step 5 will be placed in a feeder pool and allocated to the most geographically



In the event of there being in excess of ten eligible clubs seeking promotion from Step 5 it may be necessary to arrange a series of play-off matches, the procedures of which will be determined by the LC.

Clubs seeking promotion from Step 5 to Step 4 must make application in writing to The Football Association, copied to their existing league, by 30th November in the relevant year. The application must be accompanied by the agreed grading fee, as determined by the LC, which is non refundable. The Football Association will arrange for ground grading visits to take place before 31st March in the relevant year. A final list of clubs eligible to be considered for promotion will be published by 15th April. Final promotion will be subject to the criteria outlined in the paragraph above.

"My life has changed so much in a short space of time," said Miller, who has been recalled from a loan with Darlington with defenders Richard Naylor (injured) and Dan Harding (suspended) out and doubts over the availability of skipper Jason De Vos and David Wright.

De Vos and Wright trained yesterday although Miller could still feature at some stage tomorrow.

He added: "To be playing football every day for a living is a dream scenario, if a little surreal."

Nobody was more surprised than Miller when his big chance came - one he has taken with open arms earning excellent reports while on loan at Boston and then Darlington.

He told of the moment about which thousands of non-league

players can only dream. "I had just got back from holiday and played in a friendly for Bury against Ipswich at Ram Meadow.

"Jim Magilton spoke to me in the bar afterwards and, to my amazement, said he wanted to see me in training the following Monday.

"It was incredible and I have been pinching myself ever since." Miller, who had been lecturing at West Suffolk College, had an eight-week trial and played a number of reserve games, before he

signed his first professional contract in September. Miller has a degree in sport, health and exercise and Magilton has already confirmed the defender, who played in the Ridgeons League with Bury last season, will figure in his first team at some store in the final seven games

stage in the final seven games. "The manager and coaching staff would not throw me in if they didn't think I could do a job at this level," added Miller, who lives at Marks Tey.

"If they feel the time is right to play me - be it tomorrow or the last day of the season - they know I will be ready and raring to go. "I can't wait, and I have always said I have come to this club to give my all and make a go of it - not just wallow in the reserves."

Over 2,200 attended the Stewart Vaughan benefit match to pay tribute to Stewart, who recently received news that he is suffering from terminal cancer.

Stewart was able to play for a few minutes at the start of the game, having made an emotional entrance to the ground through a swathe of children from Brockham Badgers FC, St Martins FC and Dorking Girls, who had formed a guard of honour for the teams, and Stewart in particular.

Portsmouth were wonderful in all respects - in the build up to the game, in the team they put out and in the way they treated the game with a seriousness unusually seen in friendlies of this nature. At least 12 first team players for Pompey played a full part in the game, with the likes of England international Glen Johnson playing for all 90 minutes of the match. Portsmouth produced some great attacking football and led 5-0 at the interval. Goals from Todorov (3), LuaLua, Benjani, Matt Taylor and Douala gave Pompey a 7-0 win.

Chairman Mick Browning said: "We've applied but not been accepted as yet, I don't think there will be any problems.

"The committee took the general view that we wanted to push the club forward right the way through."

Ashford Town Football Club was formed in 1964 and first competed in the Hounslow & District League. With a very young team, the Club rapidly advanced through the various divisions of that League, absorbing Staines Youth Club F.C. on the way. Several individuals from that era have remained with the Club and now form the backbone of the Committee, including the Chairman and Secretary.

The Club were elected to the Surrey Intermediate League (Western) in 1967 and after a season of consolidation, soon worked their way through to the Premier Division, winning an assortment of League and Cup honours on the way. In 1976, Ashford enjoyed their best season under the managership of ex-Fulham player Frank Reid, winning the League by a substantial margin.

Although the championship eluded the Club in following seasons, it usually finished in the top four and prior to season 1982-83 an invitation was extended by Surrey County F.A. to become founder members of the Surrey County Premier League. The invitation was readily accepted and Ashford played their first match in the new league on 4 September 1982, drawing 0-0 away to Farleigh Rovers.

Almost from its foundation, the Club had aspirations to acquire its own ground and after one or two disappointments, this was achieved in August 1985, when a long lease was signed with Spelthorne Borough Council, enabling the Club to move to its present home at Short Lane, Stanwell. From what was nothing more than a field, the facilities were quickly developed, with the first match at Short Lane taking place in February 1986, following two postponements for snow.

The Club now possesses a modern clubhouse and bar, kitchen facilities and boardroom. Floodlights were erected in September 1995, whilst the pitch is railed all round and partly walled, with standing covered accommodation for 300 people, plus a purpose built 150-seater stand, built in 1998.

For both geographical and historical reasons, Ashford affiliate to both Middlesex and Surrey F.A.'s and in 1989-90, their last season as an Intermediate Club, they reached the final of both Counties Premier Cup competitions, beating Farnham Town in the Surrey version but losing to Willesden Hawkeye in the Middlesex final. Runners-up spot in the League was also secured and with it the opportunity to enter senior football, as members of the Combined Counties League, senior status having been granted in May 1990.

During its ten year membership of the Combined Counties, the Club never finished below sixth place, and after finishing 3rd and 2nd in seasons 92-93 and 93-94, it went on to win the League Championship for four successive seasons. It was a relative disappointment to only come 4th in 98-99, even though the Club won the League Cup but a 5th championship in just six seasons was secured in 99-00, along with the Middlesex Charity Cup, the first ever senior county cup honour. With the ground up to the required standard, Ashford took their place in the Ryman League for season 2000-2001 and by finishing in 3rd place, secured promotion to Division 2 at the first attempt.

The first season in Division 2 did not the Club making sufficient progress and after a series of indifferent results, long serving manager Dave Kent left the Club on 28 March. His replacement was Nathan Wharf, an ex long serving player, who stepped up from Reserve Team management.

Further major improvements were made to the ground to enable the Club to be granted a B-grade and to take its place in the newly regionalised Division One of the Ryman League. A poor start saw the Club in the bottom echelons of the table but a number of new signings saw a significant improvement and a 17th place finish, which was an excellent performance after winning just one of the opening 16 league matches.

Further progress was made in 2003-04 as the Club finished 12th in Div 1 South. In the close season prior to 2004-05, the pitch has been completely re-laid to include both irrigation and drainage systems, at a cost of around £50,000, mostly financed by the Football Stadia Improvement Fund. Further medium term plans include new changing accommodation adjacent to the pitch, which will allow enlargement of the present clubhouse, and a hard surface floodlit training area.

The Club embarked upon new adventures in season 2004-05 in the Southern League for the first time, having been transferred over as a result of the FA Re-structure. The 4th Qualifying Round of the FA Cup was reached for the first time and Mark Butler, renowned goal scorer in his day with Aldershot Town, Staines Town etc, was promoted from Assistant Manager to Manager following the resignation of Nathan Wharf in December 2004. The play-offs were reached but resulted in a narrow defeat at Evesham United after extra time.

In 2005-06, Ashford went one better, finishing second in Division One West of the Southern League, to secure promotion to Step 3. This has brought about a return to the Ryman League and sees Ashford competing at their highest ever level.

Meet the players ... Paul Burgess - Goalkeeper, signed from Ruislip Manor in the summer of 1990. Has been a model of consistency for the Club

and has now completed nearly 600 games for the club. Ashford's first ever contract player with full County honours to his name. Aged 37

Tony Wells - Experienced Ryman League goalkeeper signed in 2002 from Uxbridge. Has previously played, amongst others, for Hendon, Staines Town, Walton & Hersham and Chertsey Town. Tall and

commanding, aged 32 Ben Lauder-Dykes - Young goalkeeper signed this season from Aldershot Town. Aged 21

Danny Cox - Goalkeeper, aged 19 and the son of ex-Hayes keeper Alan Cox. Has progressed well through the youth ranks, making his 1st team debut in this current season

Josh Richardson - 17 year old keeper who came into the Under-18 side at the age of 16 last season and for whom he is still playing this campaign. Has also appeared regularly for the Reserves Vince O'Sullivan - Aged 24 and very

much an established player for the Club, approaching 400 1st team matches. Plays in midfield or defence with a maturity beyond his years. Player of the Year for three seasons. Was with both Chelsea and Tottenham Hotspur as a schoolboy, and a regular representative player for both Middlesex and West London. Has also represented Kensington and Chelsea in athletics and played for Chelsea in the International Umbro Tournament in Berlin

Russell Canderton - Defender aged 26 who joined four seasons ago from Staines Town making himself a regular 1st Team selection. He started his career with Staines making his full debut in January 1999 but has since established himself at Ashford and has now made nearly 300 appearances for the Club.

Scott Harris - 20 year old striker, who enjoyed an excellent scoring record in both the Reserves and the Youth team. He has been a member of the 1st Team squad for two seasons.

Paul Johnson - Midfield, aged 24. Signed for Ashford in December 2003 after spending two years with Staines Town, for whom he signed in November 2001 after a very brief spell with Edgware Town. He had spent the previous year with Hendon. He made several 1st XI appearances for Wycombe Wanderers, and began in junior soccer with Wimbledon, Chelsea, and QPR, as well as representing Middlesex Youth. Although previously a defender, Paul became a potent force going forward from midfield, either centrally or on the left. Spent November 2003 on loan at Chertsey Town.

Steve Battams - 30 year old highly experienced central defender who was a prize capture from Staines Town in the summer of 2004. Played over 300 games for

Staines and has also played for Carshalton Athletic. Has now played in excess of 100 matches for Ashford.

Lee Passmore - Experienced midfield player, aged 27, signed 2004 from Chertsey Town. Previously with AFC Wimbledon. Scott Todd - Burst into Ashford's 1st

Scott Todd - Burst into Ashford's 1st Team in season 2000-01 from the Juniors, scoring 26 goals. Was transferred to Carshalton Athletic at the end of the following season where he was a crowd favourite before moving onto Croydon Athletic during season 2003-04. Returned to Ashford for the start of season 04-05. Was voted the national "Step 4 Player of the Year" last season. Age 23.

Anthony Joseph - 24 year old speedy flank player, signed in September 2004 from Chertsey Town. His appearances this season have been restricted by a troublesome injury problem.

Ricky Wellard - Skilful midfield player aged just 18. Last season was his first as a regular 1st Team squad member and he would appear to have a bright future. Has recently committed himself to the Club to the end of season 2007-08.

Leon Canning - Defender, 24, who returned to Ashford for the 2005-06 season after being away at University, when he played for Evesham United and Bishops Cleeve. Has also played for Leatherhead.

Gavin Smith - Recruited in October

2005 from Bracknell Town, where he was leading scorer in season 04-05. 29 year old who is currently Ashford's leading scorer this season

Jason Chewins - A significant signing for the Club in 2005-06, from Havant & Waterlooville, who he joined from Aldershot Town, for whom he played some 500 matches and received a testimonial. 36 year old defender and captain who leads by example.

Matt Baxter - 37 goals last season for the Reserves and Under-18's has seen Matt elevated to the 1st Team squad. Powerful and fast and a natural goal scorer, and at 19 he looks to have a good future. Has scored 29 goals for the Reserves this season plus six in the 1st Team in just 11 appearances.

Micky Cook - Ball playing defender who joined Ashford from Burnham at the start of the season and who has forces his way into the 1st Team. Aged 22.

Jon Palmer - Another new signing for season 06-07 who arrived at Ashford from Bracknell Town. A front runner who has also scen service with Kings Lynn and Lewes FC's

Gavin Bamford - Experienced 29 year old midfield player who signed for Ashford early in 2007, along with brother Stuart, from Wealdstone. Prior to Wealdstone played over 300 matches for Uxbridge. Stuart Bamford - elder 31 year old brother of Gavin. Defender with similar experience to his brother.

Scott Weight - 19 year old midfield player recently pressed into service as an emergency full back. Possessing plenty of skill, he joined the Club from Hampton.

Manager - Mark Butler - Mark came to Ashford from Chertsey Town, as Assistant to Nathan Wharf, after enjoying a long and successful career as a striker with Staines Town and Aldershot Town amongst others. He made an excellent impression and upon Wharf's resignation in December 2004, was immediately appointed manager and led the Club to promotion last season.

Assistant Manager - Rory Gleeson -Appointed by Mark Butler, Rory was previously manager of Chertsey Town. As a player he appeared for numerous clubs and is well remembered as a dogged and difficult defender.

Coach - Gary Ross - In his third season with the Club, Gary arrived after coaching Reading's youth team and is the possessor of a UEFA B coaching badge.

Goalkeeper Coach & Match Day Physio - Pat Munns - Pat is another long time servant of the Club, first appearing in the 70's earning a reputation as an excellent goalkeeper. Only loyalty prevented him playing at a far higher level. As goalkeeper coach now, his expertise is widely acknowledged.

Dover Athletic F.C. was formed by a group of local businessmen in the summer of 1983 to replace Dover F.C., which had folded that May.

The new Club was able to replace the old one in the Southern League Southern Division. The new Club's first competitive match was at home to Crawley Town on August 20th., 1983, and it ended goalless. The first win did not come until mid-October (2-0 against Thanet), and by the end of the season, Dover Athletic had risen to 13th. in the table. The first manager was Allan Jones, who had been a prolific goalscorer with Dover F.C. in the early 1960s, but after a poor start to the 1984-85 season, his services were dispensed with. Steve McRaye took over, but defeat after defeat followed, and at the end of that season only Erith & Belvedere were below us in the League table. The playing staff was considerably strengthened for the following season, but we still under-achieved until full-back Chris Kinnear took over as manager. We challenged for promotion going into the last month of the season, but finished fourth. We beat Dartford of the Gola League (now the Conference) 2-0 away in the Kent Senior Cup semi-final, but lost 2-0 to Premier Division champions Welling in the final at Gillingham. 1986-87 saw us again going for promotion, but a crowded fixture list saw us run out of steam towards the end, and we finished fifth. We reached the Eastern Floodlight Cup final, but lost 3-2 on aggregate to Chelmsford. We did gain promotion to the Premier Division in 1987-88, finishing as Southern Division champions, and we also won the Knight Floodlight Competition, beating Harlow 2-0 in the final at home.

Up in the Premier Division for season 1988-89, we topped the table for a while, but fixture congestion - we played 75 competitive games that season - again took its toll, and we finished sixth. We again won the Knight Floodlight Competition, winning 2-1 at Saffron Walden in the final. We made no mistake the following season, winning the first ten, some in between, and the last eleven Premier Division games to top the table with 102 points, a Southern League record that still stands. However, the deserved promotion to what is now the Conference was denied, due to strict and unflexible ground-grading regulations. We had it all to do again, but fixture congestion again hit us in the 1990-91 season, and we finished fourth. We did win the Kent Senior Cup, beating Gravesend 1-0 in the final at Gillingham, and also the Premier Inter-League Cup, beating Southport 3-2 in a marvellous final at Avlesbury - the Cup still resides in the Crabble boardroom, as it hasn't been played for since.

Season 1991-92 saw us again challenging for promotion, but we lost out to Bromsgrove in the last few weeks of the season. The 2-2 draw at Crabble between the clubs that April attracted a then record attendance for Dover Athletic of 4,035. We did win the Southern League Cup, beating Dorchester 4-0 on aggregate in the final. We won the Premier Division title again in 1992-93, finishing 13 points ahead of runners-up Cheltenham. This time there were no problems with the ground, and we took up our rightful position in the Conference. Still under the managership of Chris Kinnear, we showed up well in our first season at the top level of the non-League game, and finished eighth. We struggled the following season, and in the January it was decided that a change of manager was needed. John Ryan took over, and at the end of that season we were 16th. in the table.

A dreadful start to season 1995-96 saw the departure of John Ryan, and Peter Taylor took over. We finished that season 20th., and were only spared relegation because no club was promoted from the Northern Premier League. With Peter Taylor leaving to take over as manager of the England Under-21 team, his newlyappointed assistant, Joe O'Sullivan, was quickly promoted. We struggled through to January 1997, when O'Sullivan resigned, and manager Bill Williams and coach Clive Walker were appointed. We finished that season 17th. 1997-98 proved to be a better season, as we were placed 13th. in the Conference, and were within a whisker of reaching Wembley in the F.A. Trophy, losing 4-3 on aggregate to Cheltenham in the semi-finals. In 1998-99, we were third in the table in February, but then dropped down to finish eleventh. It was the same the season after; we were challenging at the top in February, but eventually came sixth - our best Conference final placing. Season 2000-01 saw us come 15th., but Bill Williams left in the summer, and Gary Bellamy was appointed manager. November 2001 saw a cash crisis at the Club, and Bellamy was sacked. Neville Southall took over in the hot seat, but he was shown the door in March. Clive Walker was then appointed manager, but it was too late to save the Club from relegation, and we finished bottom of the Conference. The money problems led to many changes at boardroom level, and now with a Supporters' Trust firmly established, and a new set of directors, the Club now has a firm base on which to build for the future. Money is very scarce still, but a number of successful fund-raising initiatives and a good supporter base give us cause for optimism.

In the 2002-03 season, history was made

when Dover Athletic reached the First Round Proper of the F.A. Cup for the first time, losing to Third Division Oxford United by the only goal of the game at Crabble. A new Dover Athletic record attendance was present at this match, when 4,186 fans went through the turnstiles. The end of the season saw us finish third in the Dr.Martens Premier Division, and but we finished fourth from bottom in the 2003-04 season, and with the Pyramid re-organisation, we were "relegated" to the Isthmian Premier Division. In season 2004-05 we struggled both financially and on the pitch. Four managers and three chairmen came and went, and the season finished with us next to bottom and relegated to Division One. Results had improved drastically on the return of manager Clive Walker, and hopes were high for an immediate return to the Premier Division at the end of 2005-06. Despite topping the table early on, we were hit by a catalogue of injuries, and we eventually finished fifth. We won 1-0 at Metropolitan Police in the promotion play off semi-final, but lost 3-2 at Tonbridge Angels in the final.

Meet the players ... DANNY CHAPMAN - Aged 32 -Former Millwall and Leyton Orient midfield player, he is now in his third spell at Dover. Strong midfield player having signed in summer 2001 from near neighbours Folkestone Invicta. He played for Eastbourne Borough in 2004-05, but returned to Crabble in the summer of 2005.

NICKY HUMPHREY - Aged 26 Centre Back - signed in summer 2002 from Tonbridge Angels, where for two years he was voted "Player of the Year". He has the potential to do well. He returned to Tonbridge in October 2004, but came back to Dover in the following March.

TONY BROWNE - Aged 29 - An ex West Ham & Brighton right sided/wing back player. He has been a consistently reliable performer for the "Whites" over the past seasons. Tony moved to Welling United in the summer of 2004, but returned to Crabble in the summer of 2005.

DEAN READINGS - Aged 25 - A product of the youth policy, he is a centre back that the Club had high hopes for, but having suffered his third broken leg, in a friendly in July 2006, he is now thinking about giving up the game.

LEE SPILLER - Aged 28 - Signed from Chesham United. Former Gillingham, Margate and Gravesend player who works tirelessly in midfield. He also moved to Welling in the summer of 2004, and returned to Dover a year later.

CRAIG CLOKE - Aged 22 - Another of Dover's players coming through the youth

programme at the Club. A centre back who looks to have a good future, he is also regularly on the scoresheet. .

CRAIG WILKINS - Aged 32 - Signed for Dover in the summer of 2003, Craig's previous clubs include Tonbridge Angels and Gravesend & Northfleet. He is a prolific scorer at all levels but can also play at the back when required.

TOMMY TYNE is a strong forward who started his career at Millwall. He played for Welling(on loan), Fisher(on loan), and Slade Green, before signing for Dover in the summer of 2001. He left for Welling United in March 2004, but returned to Crabble in the summer of 2005.
