WEEKEND REVIEW

Premier Division champions Dover Athletic were nearly embarrassed at relegation threatened Heybridge Swifts but escaped with a 1-1 draw. Their nearest rivals Staines Town, also drew, 0–0 at home to Tooting & Mitcham-United, but third-placed Tonbridge Angels made no ÷ mistake, hammering Hendon 5-1. Sutton United remained fourth after a solitary-goal victory over Dartford at Gander Green Lane, their near neighbours Carshalton Athletic are back in the playoff positions after an identical victory at Canvey Island. Ramsgate fate is almost confirmed after they lost 2-1 at home to Harlow Town, who climbed to 15th with the victory. Margate, however remain deep in trouble following their 3-2 loss at Harrow Borough, who are now almost safe. Boreham Wood's 2-2 draw at Horsham lifted them out of the drop zone at the expense of Hendon, but only seven points separate Hendon from 11th spot. Billericay Town and Ashford Town (Middlesex) are in that group of nine clubs and it was the former who beat the latter, 2-0, at New Lodge. Hastings United surprised AFC Hornchurch 2-1 at Bridge Avenue, while Wealdstone were knocked out of the playoff spots by Maidstone United, 2-1 at the Bourne

East Thurrock United returned to the top of Division One North, their late equaliser at home to Concord Rangers being their 100th League goal of the season, the first club to reach that mark this season. Aveley fell to second after losing 3-1 at home to third-placed Brentwood Town, but nine points still separate the top two and the field. Waltham Abbey beat Ware 3-0 and Northwood went two better at home to Witham Town and they round out the top five. Redbridge and Wingate & Finchley still have playoff hopes although they both slipped up 1-0, the former at Chatham Town, the latter at home to Leyton. The bottom two are almost guaranteed after llford moved 12 points clear of Witham Town with their 1-0 defeat of already doorned Hillingdon Borough at Cricklefield Stadium, Immediately above the Foxes, Waltham Forest moved to within a point of Potters Bar Town after beating them 2-0 away. Maldon Town won 3-0 at Cheshunt, while Great Wakering Rovers got a late winner to see off Enfield Town 2-1. The other match, at Thamesmead Town, where Tilbary were the visitors, ended goalless

Kingstonian now appear favourites for automatic promotion from Division One South after they won 2–0 at Folkestone Invicta. They are level on points with Cray Wanderers - 4–1 victors at home to Corinthian Casualstwo clear of Fleet Town, 2–0 winners at Chipstead, and nix points up on both Metropolitan Police and Worthing. The Blues were held to a 1–1 draw by Sittinghourne at Imber Court, while the Rebels slipped up 2–0 at Ashford Town. The Brickies are still four points behind Worthing and they both have four games to play. Merstham remain seventh despite losing 3–1 at Walton Casuals. At the bottom, Crowborough Athletic suffered their 31st League defeat, 5–1 at Dulwich Hamlet, but Burgess Hill Town moved above Chipstead after they beat Whyteleafe 2–0 at Leylands Park. And there were away wins for Croydon Athletic, 2–1 at Godalming Town, Eastbourne Town, 1–0 at Leatherhead, Walton & Hersham, 2–1 at Whitstable Town.

Based at the school, the Centre will also become the home of the Academy, which will offer full-time football scholarships to talented male and female players aged between 16 and 18 years. The Centre will also have a strong international dimension through close links with a French excellence scheme based in Lens. There are 22 male and 15 female scholarships available to candidates, who can undertake 1, 2 or 3 year combined football and academic programmes. Ramsgate are thrilled that Gary Owen will be the Centre Director, Gary spent several years coaching in the Chelsea FC Academy working with young players including Chelsea and England under-21, Michael Mancienne. Gary has also managed to persuade a former Chelsea coaching colleague to join him at the Centre. Ramsgate Chairman Richard Lawson confirmed "This is an excellent way to help players realise their football potential at the same time as obtaining non-football qualifications, and even a route into higher education."

Looking to the future Gary added, "It's fantastic to have Ramsgate FC working with us because we have a shared purpose and vision that involves developing youth. There are other similar achemes about but what we are offering is unique. We are not in the business of selling the myth that professional foothall is an option, for most players that's not the reality so why even talk about it. Our purpose is to identify good players and place them in a technical and educational programme designed to maximise their football ability and their personal development. If students want to study at university, play semi-professionally or take-up coaching and travel abroad, we can provide them with opportunities to do so. One thing for sure is that expectations and standards will be help"

STAINES TOWN FC

Steve Cordery was quick to send Staines Town's congratulations to Dover Athletic after the Kent club clinched the championship last Saturday. The Whites' thumping 6-0 win over Sutton paired with the Swans 1-1 draw at Hastings United meant there was no way they could be overhauled at the top. And manager Cordery made sure he was quick off the mark to say well done as the champagne started to flow at the Crabble.

introducing ...

Roxonian FC was founded in the summer of 1933. The Club spent their first season in the Harrow and District League (playing their home games at a ground on Northolt Road), finishing runners-up in Division 1. They were accepted into the Spartan League, which coincided with the move to Earlsmead.

1938 saw Roxonian finish runners-up in Division 2 (West) but they had to wait for promotion until the following season, as only the champions went up. This was achieved under the new name of Harrow Town. War intervened though the Club continued to play in, first, the West Middlesex Combination, then the Middlesex Senior League. Peace brought a return to the Spartan League until 1958 when runners-up spot enabled the Club to move to the Delphian League. 5 seasons were spent here, until mergers saw Town accepted into Division 2 of the Athenian League in 1963.

In their first season at this level they finished runners-up, denied the championship only by goal difference. However, only 3 seasons were spent in Division 1, whence a name change to Harrow Borough coincided with relegation in 1967. 8 seasons were played as occupants of Division 2, during which it seemed that the club might withdraw from senior football, and only the efforts of a few hardy individuals kept the Club alive.

Negotiations with the local council saw the Club sell its second pitch, now the site of a school, and build a new clubhouse, floodlights and terracing. This progress was matched on the field; Boro' were elected to the Isthmian League in 1975 after having to wait a year for the complex to be completed. 4 years later they won promotion to the Premier Division as runners-up.

The early 1980s saw the Club's most successful spell so far. The Middlesex Charity Cup was won in 1980, the Middlesex Senior Cup three years later. Also in 1983 Harrow Borough reached the semi-finals of the FA Trophy, losing to the eventual winners, Telford United, over two legs.

A year later, the Club's Golden Jubilee was celebrated with a drawn match against Manchester United, Harrow's best FA Cup run so far, losing to Newport County (then of the old Football League Division 3) in the 2nd Round Proper and best of all, winning the Isthmian League Premier Division championship by a staggering 17 point margin.

Under astute manager Micky Tomkys, Harrow had enjoyed continuous success but his retirement in 1986 saw a gradual decline in the Club's fortunes. On three occasions a win in the final game of the season has been required to enable the club to retain their treasured Premier Division status.

1992/93, however, saw a dramatic improvement, with both the Middlesex Senior Cup and Middlesex Charity Cup returning to Earlsmead. The semi-final of the latter saw Chelsea defeated 4-1. A league placing of 8th was also their best for 6 seasons. This form continued over the next three seasons under the management team of Harry Manoe, with the Club finishing 9th in 1993-94, 10th 1994-95 and 9th again in 1996-97. A dip in the Club's fortunes saw his departure, to be followed by a succession of managers.

A disastrous run of form during the 1999/00 season saw the Club avoid relegation by just a single goal.

Despite an encouraging start to the season to the 2000/01 season, which saw Boro' reach the 1st Round Proper of the FA Challenge Cup for only the second time (losing 0-3 at Wycombe Wanderers), a poor run of performances after Christmas saw the Club finish 4th from bottom again with just 2 points to spare.

2001-02 saw the club commence a longterm plan, targeting youth dcvclopment. As well as fielding a young side, which managed to retain Premier Division status once more, close partnerships were formed with local youth football clubs. The summer of 2004 saw the formation of an Allied Counties under 18's squad, designed to bridge the gap between youth and senior football.

Under the stewardship of manager David Howell Boro' have continued their youth and community development and they now have links with a number of local youth football clubs and schools.

Season 2006/07 saw Boro' finish in a relegation position only for their Premier Division place to be saved by Lancaster City whose financial difficulties saw them being relegated instead.

On a pleasanter note season 2005-06 saw Boro' win the Middlesex Senior Charity Cup for the 3rd time with a 2-0 success over Enfield Town. Season 2006-07 saw the feat replicated with victory over Brook House 5-4 on penalties following a 0-0 scoreline with that game being played at Staines Town FC.

Enforced cost cutting during the summer saw the Club resigning its membership of the Allied Counties Youth League for the current season, though it is hoped this will only be a temporary measure for one season only.

introducing ...

Tilbury FC was formed in January 1900, they joined the Grays & District League in 1901/2 and were immediately Champions, a feat they repeated in each of the next 4 season.

In 1903/4 Tilbury reached the Essex Junior Cup Final but had to wait until 1908/9 before winning the competition by defeating the County's oldest club, Saffron Walden Town, in the final. However, with most local fans going a couple of miles down the road to watch professional, Southern League, football in the shape of the now defunct Grays Thurrock United, finances were perilous, when the Club also lost its home ground, at the end of 1911/12, the Committee suspended playing activities until a new ground and a sounder financial base could be established.

Returning to action in 1919/20, in the South Essex League, Tilbury were immediately successful, winning successive Championships and, in 1924/5, the Essex Junior Cup for the second time. 1925/6 saw Tilbury accept the Essex F.A.'s invitation to enter the Essex Senior Cup, and established two County records. First, they became the only Junior Club ever to reach Round 2, and then the first ever to defeat Senior opposition by beating Walthamstow Avenue 3-2. At the end of the season, Essex F.A. granted Tilbury their Senior Status.

Tilbury joined the Kent League in 1927, after several other applications had been rejected. They stayed for 4 seasons before the impracticalities of continually crossing the Thames forced them to leave, The start of the 1931/2 season saw the Club line up as members of the London League, where they remained until the outbreak of the 2nd World War in 1939. One season in the War-Time South Essex Combination was played, but then the ground was commandeered as an Anti-aircraft Gun site, and the Club disbanded for the duration.

Moving on to their present ground in 1946/7, Tilbury resumed in the London League. In 3 of the next 4 seasons Tilbury were runners-up, and reached consecutive Essex Senior Cup Finals in 1946 and 1947, going down to Leytonstone and Romford respectively. Both games, played at Ilford F.C. Ground, draw crowds in excess of 15,000. Also in 46/7, Tilbury reached the Quarter Finals of the F.A. Amateur Cup, losing away to winners Wimbledon.

In 1949/50, Tilbury fought through to the 1st round proper of the F.A. Cup. More than 28,000 fans saw a 0-4 defeat at Notts. County, who were skippered by the legendary Tommy Lawton. In the previous round, the 5,500 fans that turned up at St. Chad's Road for the replay with Gorleston still constitutes the official ground record.

In 1950/1 Tilbury joined the Corinthian League. Apart from a League Cup Final appearance in 1955/6, it was an unsuccessful 7 year stay before, in 1957/8, they rejoined the London League. They finished 3rd in that season, but in each of the next 4 were runaway Champions, and 3 times achieved the League and League Cup double. However, during this spell pride of place went to their first ever Easex Senior Cup triumph in 1960/1.

Once again at the Ilford F.C. ground, Tilbury faced mighty Walthamstow Avenue. Prior to kick-off, they were forced to watch as Avenue paraded the F.A. Amateur Cup won at Wembley 3 weeks earlier. If this was meant to intimidate however, it failed. Tilbury went on to win 4 - 1 after extra time.

1962/3 saw Tilbury in the Delphian League, a season decimated by the Big Freeze of that winter. By the time 1963/4 started, this had become Division Two of the expanded Athenian League. Tilbury celebrated by winning the Championship and the Essex Senior Cup. Having just missed promotion from Division One in 1967/8, they went one step better 12 months later by winning the Championship.

Tilbury spent 4 seasons in the Athenian Premier, improving their final position each time, eventually coming 3rd in 1972/3. The 1973/4 campaign saw Tilbury lining up as members of the new Isthmian league Division Two (now Division One). In 1974/5, Tilbury finished 3rd in this Division, just missing out on promotion, but were partially compensated by winning both Essex Senior and Mithras Cups. 12 months later, promotion was achieved. Tilbury won the Division One Championship with a then record 102 points, 4 clear of runners-up, Croydon, who were to remarkably complete their League games undefeated. They also retained both the Essex Senior and Mithras Cups, the full Southend United side being comfortably thrashed 3-0 in the Final of the former, and Cheshunt beaten over two legs in the latter.

Tilbury recovered from a disastrous start to their Premier Division career, and finished in 5th place, still their highest Isthmian placing. Also in that 1976/7 season, they enjoyed two Anglo Italian Barrassi Cup meetings with U.S. Soresina, the trophy being won by the Italians on penalties, after two 1-1 draws, the 2nd leg in Italy also comprising extra time.

In 1977/8 Tilbury achieved their proudest moment to date when, after starting in the Extra Preliminary Round, they reached the 3rd round proper of the F.A. Cup, eventually going down 0-4 to a Stoke City side that included Howard Kendall, Garth Crooks, Denis Smith, Viv Busby and Alec Lindsay, in front of 16,000 plus fans, including almost 2,500 from Thurrock.

A last, to date, appearance in the Essex Senior Cup Final came in 1978/9 but 12 months alter the Chub was relegated back to Division One amid a financial crisis so severe that it almost died. However, a new committee was formed and after several years of surviving on a day-to-day basis the late 1980's saw the club back on a sound footing. Sadly though, this could not be achieved before further relegation, to Division Two North, in the 1986/7. Tilbury almost made an immediate climb back, but that was to prove a brief respite. At the end of the 1990/1 season they could not achieve the top half finish that would have kept them up, and so dropped into the new Division Three.

This time, Tilbury did bounce back immediately, finishing in 3rd position in Division Three in 1991/2. At the time of promotion, Tilbury were forced to face the realities of the Ground Grading Regulations, and the fact that St. Chad's Road had become run down and dilapidated arena. The club decided that all resources would have to be directed towards the necessary ground improvements, and gambled that they would be able to hang on in Division Two. That gamble almost paid off. Tilbury hung on until 1997/8, and it was ironic that they should succumb to relegation just when the renovations were almost complete and the burden easing. After finishing 7th in Division Three in 1998/9, Tilbury appointed a former player, Tony Cross as Manager, hoping that the remarkable successes enjoyed by Cross at Intermediate and Essex Senior level could translate into Isthmian success. That hope was to prove well founded. Cross led the side to promotion with a 3rd place finish, and also brought the Club's best ever run in the F.A. Vase. Excellent victories were achieved over Bury Town and Falmouth Town, before a disappointing 4th round defeat away to Cowes Sports.

Tilbury though takes great pride in their off-field progress. Having established themselves in a new and thriving clubhouse in November 1994, the spectacular transformation of St. Chad's Road into a modern, well equipped Stadium has given great pleasure, and brought widespread recognition.

A new 200 seater grandstand has been constructed on the far side of the ground, and this is flanked by two new covered terraces. New pitch and outer perimeter walls have been built and 5 turnstiles entrances incorporated. New concrete standing areas have been laid on the near side of the ground and terracing built behind the Chadwell End Goal, part of which will eventually comprise a covered seating area.

Tony Cross returned to Chadfields following spells at Billericay Town and Great Wakering Rovers and a one-season spell in the Essex Senior League was followed by promotion in the May to the current Ryman League Division 1 North. Last season they finished 18th and Tony Cross departed with ex-Hornchurch treble-winning manager John Lawrence now taking charge along side Paul Marler as his assistant. The season proved tough for the duo and only just escaped relegation with a 3 point win last game of the season.

The men from Tilbury ...

Graham Chester (Manager) - Appointed Manager of Tilbury Football Club in July 2008, taking over from John Lawrence and Asst Manager Paul Marler after only one season in the job. Previous Club saw Chester win Silverware at Essex Senior Club Eton Manor during 2007/2008 Season, finished 4th in the League, and Runners-up in the Gordon Brasted Memorial Trophy plus League Cup Winners beating Essex Senior League Champions Concord Rangers in the Final by 3-2 in April 2008.

Tony Leary (Assistant Manager) - Appointed Assistant Manager in the Summer of 2008. Previously Assistant Manager at Eton Manor Football Club, Leary played a Major role in the success at Eton Manor during the 2007/2008 Season. Leary has played Non League football for many years, gathering much knowledge of the game and is an able backup and support man to Graham Chester.

Andy Hall (Goalkeeper) - Played his Debut for the Dockers on the 16th August 2008 against Witham

Town in a Ryman League Fixture, the Dockers Winning 1-3. Previously played for Enfield Town, Cheshunt and Eton Manor before coming to Tilbury. Vastly experienced keeper. Previous Club Honours with Enfield Town, ESL Champions and League Cup Medal Winner plus Eton Manor PC 2008 ESL League Cup Winners Medal.

Oliver Gee-Howes (Goalkeeper) - Gee-Howes coming through the new Tilbury Youth Academy, A promising young keeper with much potential for the later.

Nick Wilson (Goalkeeper) - An experienced keeper. Wilson is a great short stopper combined with a healthy attitude towards the game. Previous to the pinning Tilbury he was a regular for Essex Senior League Club Eton Manor.

Daniel Smith (Defender) - A creative defender with loads of pace. Smith likes to attack down the right flank, has been a creator of many goals this second spell at the Dockers in Sept 08 for his second spell at the Club. Nicknamed "Smudger" is a work horse in defence often the unsung hero of many pares. Smith looks to have settled into this new look Tilbury side this season.

Joe Keith (Defender) - Joined Tilbury at the start at the 2008/2009 Spason, Started his career at West. Ham United as a trainee, but failed to make a senior appearance. He joined Colchester in 1999 and went on to make over 200 appearances for the club in six seasons. After a brief loan spell with Bristol City, Keith joined Leyton Orient in 2005 and made over fifty appearances in his eighteen months there. Keith signed for Brentford in January 2007, linking up with Sormer Colchester team-mate and then Brentford Manager Scott Fitzgerald, He made his debut in a 1-0 defeat against AFC Bournemouth in January, 2007. He played 18 games for Brentford, scoring twice, before being released on May 16th 2007. In the summer of 2007, Keith signed for Isthmian League Premier Division club A.F.C. Hornchurch, Before signing for the Dockers in August 2008.

Courtney Mclean (Defender) - Re-Joined Tilbury for his second spell at the Club in August 2008. Mclean was part of the Eton Manor Cup winning side in the 2007/2008 Season. Mclean spent most of this season in recovery from injury and is now working his way back to full fitness.

Rickie Hayles (Defender) - Joined Tilbury in November 2008 from Brentwood Town, Previously played for Ilford, Waltham Forest & Eton Manor. Consistent form combined with his physical domination at the back has made him a regular since joining the Club.

Junior Baker (Defender) - Joined Tilbury in September 2008 from Ryman League Club Thamesmead. Barker nicknamed "Mr 100%" Great team player' who gives his all. Big Character off as well as on the field. Great presence in the air and always involved with set-pieces.

Jamie Wallace (Midfield) - Joined Tilbury in August 2008 from Eton Manor Football Club, where Wallace was instrumental in their Cup winning success during the 2007/2008 season. Wallace continues to impress at Ryman League Level, this Season entrusted with the Captains Armband' plus a constant source of motivation and inspiration on the pitch from this versatile and talented Football player,

Greg Cohen (Midfield) - Joined Tilbury in August 2008 from East Thurrock United. Cohen having a good season for the Dockers. His tricky runs and flair down the left combined with great balance' enables him to create so many chances for himself and the team.

Lucien Ntolla (Midfield) - Joined Tilbury in February 2009. Previously played for Eton Manor and Southend United. A 6ft 4" central midfielder has got much presence, but as yet hasn't managed to asset himself as a regular in the Tilbury side.

Jason Fontaine (Midfield) - Joined Tilbury in the Summer of 2008, Had a spell at Arlesey Town before joining the Dockers in July 2008, Fontaine is a lightening speed Midfielder with a fabulous touch and great ball control. Fontaine is a regular during the 2008/2009 season has a great attitude and appetite for the game.

Michael Black (Midfield) - Former England Schoolboy Black started his career at Arsenal, joining as a trainee in 1993, later to be joined by his brother Tommy. He won the 1994 FA Youth Cup with Arsenal and made a single appearance for the first team in a UEFA Champions League group match against Panathinaikos in 1998. He also had loan spells at Brentford and Millwall before moving to Tranmere Rovers in July 1999 on a free transfer. He played sporadically for Tranmere Rovers, including an unused substitute in the 2000 Football League Cup Final against Leicester City at Wembley, before moving to Southend United in December 2000 on loan, making the deal fully permanent the following month. He left Southend in the summer of 2001 on a free transfer. Black also played for Boreham Wood, Cheshunt, Barking and East Ham United, Bishop's Stortford, Billericay before joining the Dockers in August 2008.

Dean Stannard (Midfield) - Played his first game for the Dockers when he came on as a late substitute in January 2009 against Cheshunt. Useful utility player working his way back to full match fitness.

Zubair Haleem (Midfield) - Came on as a substitute and scored on his Debut for the Dockers on the 6th Dec 2008 against Potters Bar, scored the 4th goal of the game which sealed an emphatic 4-1 win for the Dockers.

Rashid Kamara (Forward) - Joined Tilbury in the Autumn of 2008 from Waltham Forest, Previous Clubs was Harrow Borough, Haringey Borough, Arsenal, Wycombe Wanderers, Millwall and Charlton Athletic. Also played for Crystal Palace Reserves and a short spell at Scottish League Division One Greenock Morton FC. A talented and quick Sierra Leone international Striker with a natural eye for goal. Previously played out-wide on the right, however, enjoying his central striker's role and playing some of his best Football so far.

Cheis Stowe (Forward) - Young talented striker had a spell at Billericay before playing for Hornchurch in the Conference South in 2004/2005 Season. Joined the Dockers in 2006, Stowe is a bustling Centre Forward who is a maker as well as a scorer of Goals. Up until Dec 2008 Stowe scored 15 Competitive Goals for the Dockers with plenty more in store!

Manlee Brown (Forward) - Joined Tilbury in December 2008 from Enfield 1893. Brown previously played for Eton Manor and enjoyed Cup Success with the Essex Senior League outfit with a League Cup Winners medal in the 2007/2008 Season. Brown scored his first goal for the Dockers against Great Wakering Rovers mid December 2008. The Dockers went on to win the game by 2-1.

Michael Begg (Forward) - Joined Tilbury in March 2009, played his first game for the Dockers against Wingate & Finchley. Previous Clubs were, Stansted and more recently he was a regular in the Concord Rangers side that achieved Cup and League double success in the 2007/2008 season.

Umaru Turay (Forward) - A lively youngster with spirit and a will to win. Made his debut for the Dockers in March 2009 and scored with his first touch of the ball. Played only one game for Waltham forest before he was snatched up by the Dockers. A to watch for the future.

Joe Tousent (Forward) – A young promising 16 year old player from the Tilbury Youth academy. Tousent just breaking through to the first team and will be one to watch for the future.
