### **Grays Athletic History**

The roots of the modern day Grays Athletic can be traced back as far as 1888, although 1890 has become the de facto established formation date. The reasons for this disparity are almost certainly lost in the mists of time. Grays Athletic therefore celebrated their centenary in 1990, played at The Recreation Ground, Bridge Road from 1906 to 2010, and became members of the Athenian League in 1912. Grays became very strong after the Second World War, winning the Essex Senior Cup in 1945 and winning the Corinthian League and Cup in 1946. They rejoined the Athenian League in 1958 where they remained until 1983.

In 1981 the Club Patron Mr Ron Billings purchased the ground and the Club was reformed as a Limited Company in 1982 under the guidance of Jeff and Fred Saxton. In 1983 a fire destroyed the 400-seater stand which included the dressing and kit rooms. Ron Billings came to the rescue by building the Ball Court Complex which included dressing rooms, club room and bar. Grays went on to become Division 2 Champions in 1985. The 1987/88 season saw the club promoted to the then Vauxhall Opel Premier League after amassing 100 points. They then won the Essex Senior Cup and the Essex Thameside Trophy. A great FA Cup run in 1988/89 ended in the First Round proper, losing 2-0 away at Bath City. Grays won the League Cup, defeating Enfield in 1991/92.

In 1993/94 and 1994/95 the club won the Essex Senior Cup by defeating Billericay Town on both occasions. Relegated to Division One in 1997, they returned to the Premier Division in 1999/00. The FA Cup campaign in 2000/01 ended with defeat in the First Round proper for the third time, losing 4-0 away at Reading. This signalled the start of changes with Mike Woodward installed as Director of Football, Craig Edwards as Manager and the departure of Jeff and Fred Saxton after 30 years of loyal service.

Season 2002/03 started poorly and saw Edwards depart, being replaced by Mark Stimson as player manager who appointed Scott Barrett as his assistant. Ahead of the 2003/04 season, the club made the bold decision to turn most of the players into full time professionals, with the majority of players in their early twenties.

Despite being knocked out of the FA Cup in the second qualifying round, 2004/05 became the most successful in the club's history. Stimson and his players won a number of manager and player of the month awards, with three players being called into the England National XI squad: Stuart Thurgood, Mitchell Cole and Dennis Oli. The ultimate success being crowned League Champions of the Nationwide Conference South and winning the FA Trophy; beating Hucknall Town on penalties at Villa Park. Additionally, the Recreation Ground had been upgraded sufficiently to allow for promotion into the Nationwide Conference for season 2005/06. Mark Stimson's philosophy of entertaining the crowds proved to be very successful with a blend of youthful exuberance and the outstanding quality of the more experienced players. Having equalled the Conference record of Kettering Town and going unbeaten in the first 15 fixtures of the season, both manager and players alike won several monthly awards. A contentious

3-0 defeat at the hands of Mansfield Town in the FA Cup was put to one side as the team turned their attention to the FA Trophy and the league. The club's first season in the top flight of non-league ended in disappointment as they finished 3rd in the league, and went on to lose 5-4 on aggregate to Halifax Town in the playoffs. The team put the loss behind them as they won a second successive FA Trophy, this time winning 2-0 against Woking at Upton Park in front of more than 8,000 of their own fans.

Following Mark Stimson's resignation, the club appointed former European Cup winner Frank Gray to manage the side in the summer of 2006. Despite the pre-season expectations, Gray only lasted 18 matches before both Jamie Stuart and Mick Woodward had short spells in charge of the first team. Andy King was appointed manager, but his spell was short-lived and he left shortly afterwards, taking control of just seven matches. Justin Edinburgh was the club's 4th manager of the season, and under his leadership the club reached the FA Trophy semifinals where they lost to eventual winners Stevenage Borough. Survival in the league went to the last day of the season and despite losing 1-0 to Morecambe, the club stayed up courtesy of other results going their way.

An extremely indifferent 2007/08 campaign ultimately led to the Edinburgh's departure, before once again Mick Woodward took the reins with Gary Phillips as his assistant. With only three defeats in the final 17 games, Grays only ended 11 points outside the playoffs.

The management led the side into the following season, but Mick Woodward stepped down, and replaced himself with Wayne Burnett who stayed in the job for four months before leaving the club. Gary Phillips was promoted from assistant manager for the remainder of the season and the club finished in 19th position.

2009/10 turned out to be the fifth and final in the Conference Premier as both John Moncur (Chairman) and Andy Swallow (Chief Executive) joined the club. Julian Dicks was brought in to replace Gary Phillips in September 2009, and Kenny Brown was soon appointed his assistant after resigning from his position as manager of CD Javea in Spain.

The team struggled throughout the season, winning just five league matches, and losing in their opening rounds of both the FA Cup and FA Trophy. The Blues did however manage to end the season on a high, winning two of their final three fixtures – the first of those away at AFC Wimbledon. In doing so, they recorded their first away league win for 16 months.

The final day of the season was a sad affair for the club, as they said farewell to the Recreation Ground after 114 years. Both the team and the fans did their part, as the team came back to beat Forest Green Rovers 2-1 with Allseny Cissoko scoring the last goal at the ground. Following relegation from the Premier League, the club resigned from the Conference, deciding they would be unable to field a competitive team in the Conference South due to budget constraints. Following talks with both the

FA and the Ryman League, the club were placed in the Ryman. League Division One North.

The end of that season saw the expiry of the lease at the Recreation Ground, and without a home, the club agreed a two-year deal to play at Rookery Hill, home of near neighbours East Thurrock United. The 2011/12 season was our first at this level for ten years, and despite having a solid start to the league campaign, a lack of consistency was evident throughout the remainder of the season which meant the team came up short in several matches, finally finishing in tenth position. Following the disappointing campaign Julian Dicks and Kenny Brown left the club by mutual consent, and the one-time Football League player and ex-Thurrock manager Hakan Heyrettin was appointed as manager with his assistance Hassan Oktay. With Hakan appointed, the remit was to challenge for a playoff place, and despite a few below par performances, the club secured their playoff place on the penultimate weekend, meeting Enfield Town in the semi-final. Trailing 2-0 with ten minutes left, the team managed to force extra time with two late penalties. Unfortunately, with the match still level after extra time it was decided on penalties, with Grays losing 3-1.

The 2012/13 season was a successful one for the club. It started with a move to another temporary home, in Rush Green, Romford in partnership with West Ham United, the ground and its facilities were improved, with the Premier League side responsible for the maintenance of the pitch. With just 4 league defeats, and a run of form in the second half of the season which brought with it 18 successive league wins, the club won the league with three matches to spare, finishing with a club record of 102 points. Two days after the title was secured, the side had the chance to complete the double, however they fell just short in the Essex Senior Cup final, losing 2-1 to Conference South side AFC Hornchurch.

The summer of 2013 saw two big changes for the club in a few short weeks. The stay at Rush Green was brought to an abrupt end, with near-neighbours Aveley stepping in with an offer of a ground share at the last minute. Everyone at the club is grateful to the Aveley Board for this. A short time after it was announced that Hakan Heyrettin would be leaving to join Luton Town. Experienced central defender Ryan Kirby took on the role, assisted by his father Steve Kirby and club captain Lee Flynn. The club are still determined to find a permanent home within the next couple of years, as close as possible to the old stadium. We are working closely with Thurrock Council on their long term sports and leisure strategy as we strive to provide a new community-based facility that would be available to all residents in the area.

Season 2013/14 started with a great run of four straight victories including two against highly fancied teams and we led the League at the end of August. A solid start, but we all knew that to stay in that position would be a tough ask and so it proved, with only four wins in the next nine games. Joao

Carlos and Jack West were scoring freely but the team was leaking goals and by the end of September we were lying in mid-table. A return to the team of fans' favourite Danny Bunce lifted the spirits of the supporters but the results still kept slipping away. A run of only five wins from October to the end of February saw Grays slip towards the relegation zone and a run of postponements due to heavy rain saw the mood within the camp at a low ebb. Even a run to the semi-finals of the League Cup couldn't lift the gloom. Everything changed when prolific scorer Leroy Griffiths returned to the Club almost ten years since leaving. His enthusiasm and character changed the Club's fortunes and with several other new signings the team found their confidence and fought their way back up the table with wins at regular intervals with Carlos, Dagenham & Redbridge loanee Joel Nouble and new signing Chris Benjamin scoring plenty of goals.

It took until the middle of April to catch up with the fixture backlog and the team had to play two or even three games a week, within which time they settled into a mid-table position very commendable when you consider players have jobs outside. football. The last game of the season saw the team lying in a safe position with a trip to high-flying Maidstone. Two coach loads of supporters and many more going by car meant that 150 fans travelled to Kent to cheer on the Blues. Although we lost a competitive game 2-1 everybody enjoyed the trip and gave the players a standing ovation at the final whistle, a great tribute to the thirty-odd players who had pulled on the shirt for our first season back in the Ryman Premier League in 10 years. We are now in the close season but every fan is proud of the team's achievement after an uncertain period and we are looking forward to another season at Step 3 of the Non-League Pyramid.

By the time the players got together for their first training session for the 2014/15 season on 28 June, we already had another new manager in place. A few days earlier Ryan Kirby had announced his resignation with family and business reasons leading to his decision. It shows once again the time required to manage a Club at our level. The Club acted quickly to interview candidates for his replacement and selected 35 yearold Jody Brown, who had stepped into the breach at Heybridge Swifts in December 2013 when their management duo left to take over at Chelmsford City. Jody moved quickly to assess the strength of the squad at his disposal and introduce a number of new players to assist the club in its plans to improve on and off the field.

At the end of December 2014 Jody Brown departed to take over the manager's role at Conference National side Welling FC. Mark Bentley was installed as assistant manager to Andy Swallow, before taking over the role of caretaker manager in January 2015. In February 2015 the club announced that Mark had been appointed permanent manager for the remainder of the 2014/15 season.

## Grays Athletic Player Profiles

#### Mark Bentley - Midfield Player/Manager. Aged 37.

Joined Grays Athletic in August 2014. He started his career at Enfield in 1998. later moving to Aldershot Town, Gravesend & Northfleet, where he won Player of the Year for 2002/03 and Dagenham & Redbridge. He stepped up to the Football League with Southend United in 2004 where he made 93 appearances and was involved in two consecutive promotions. He moved to Gillingham in 2006 and he was runner up for their 2006/07 and 2009/10 Player of the Year award. He also represented Cambridge United, Haves & Yeading, Boreham Wood and was a member of Wealdstone's Ryman League Championship winning squad last season. In December 2014 Mark became assistant manager to Andy Swallow, taking over the role of Caretaker Manager in early January 2015. On 7 February 2015 it was announced that Mark would retain the manager role on a permanent basis for the remainder of the 2014/15 season. He has had a galvanising influence on the squad, improving our League position and helping the Club reach our second League Cup Final after beating Enfield 3-1 in 1992.

#### David Raven - Coach/Scout. Age 46.

Retired from playing in 1999 after a career that included spells at Wigan Athletic, Slough Town and Didcot Town. David joined the staff in 2011. A former Kilmarnock coach and Grays reserve team manager. Previously a youth coach and assistant manager for the Capital League side at Redbridge before joining Grays Athletic in 2011 as assistant manager for the reserves. His role was expanded to include scouting opponents and potential signings. He continues in his dual coaching/scouting role working on fitness & rehabilitation and working closer with the U21 and U18 coaching staff to identify players to develop through into the first team.

#### Conor Gough - Goalkeeper. Age 21.

He started his football career with Charlton Athletic, signing his first professional contract in 2011 after spending two years as a scholar at the Club. After being told his contract would not be renewed, he signed a two-year deal with Bristol Rovers. Shortly after it was announced that he had joined Rovers, he was loaned to them as Rovers had no fit keeper and made his debut in the final game of the 2011–12 season. He joined Grays in August 2014 after impressing in a pre-season friendly at Chatham Town where he kept a clean sheet.

#### Lamar Johnson – Goalkeeper. Age 22.

He joined Grays in 2011 after spells at Romford and Aveley. In his early career, he was part of the Charlton Athletic youth setup and also played for Thurrock's under 18's and their reserve side, before switching to Canvey-based Concord Rangers in 2010.

#### Aaron Best - Right Back. Age 25.

He joined in August 2014 having recovered from a long-term injury. He came through Colchester United's youth system and has also played for Stansted, Redbridge and Maldon & Tiptree. He can also play at left back.

### Jay Leader - Centre Half. Age 24.

A product of the Dagenham & Redbridge youth set up he has progressed through the non-league ranks playing for Bethnal Green in the Essex Senior League before moving to Aveley where he was made captain in his first season. He joined the Blues in August 2014 from The Millers where he was voted Fans' and Players' Player of the Year last season.

#### Manny Parry – Centre Half. Age 21.

The former Stoke City young professional has gained a lot of valuable experience of non-league football through loan spells with Nuneaton

Town, Maidenhead United and Weston-Super-Mare. Signed for Harrow Borough after his release from Stoke City and joined Grays Athletic in August 2014.

### Sean Cronin - Centre Half. Age 28.

Joined on loan from Wealdstone in March 2015. Signed for Wealdstone in August 2010 having previously played for Neath FC in the Welsh premier League. He has also played for Cardiff City and represented Wales at Under 18, Under 19 and semi-professional Under 23 level. Made over 170 starts for the Stones.

### Jey Siva – Left Back. Age 27.

Joined from Wealdstone in August 2014 where he was part of their Championship winning squad in 2013/14. He was at Enfield from 2010 until 2013 and previously played for Hillingdon Borough, Indian Gymkhana and Newbury Forest. He has coaching experience at a number of English Clubs and in the USA. He achieved a sports science degree at Brunel University where he made the England University side.

### Luis Morrison-Derbyshire – Defender. Age 20.

Luis is a former Arsenal and Stevenage Borough trainee before moving to Scandinavia where he played professionally in Sweden and Finland before joining Farnborough for the remainder of the 2013-14 season last January. He signed for Conference South side Maidenhead United at the start of the current campaign before joining Hampton & Richmond Borough in late October. Before dropping into non-league football Luis also spent time on trial at Leeds United and Wrexham. He has been patient waiting for his chance in the first team at Grays since he joined in December 2014, but has earned a regular place in to the side recently, at centre half or right back.

### Sam Ling – Defender. Age 18.

Mark Bentley used his connections at Leyton Orient to secure the loan signing of right back Sam Ling. Sam is a tenacious, combative right back, who has an excellent balance of attacking and defending qualities. He is equally at home at midfield and has very good aerial provess; a real modern day right wingback who is developing year after year. He was a consistent member of Leyton Orient's youth team despite still being a schoolboy and signed his scholarship with the Club at the beginning of the 2013/14 season. During this current season, Sam was made captain of Leyton Orient's youth side and has made regular appearances for the reserve team, as well as featuring in a call up with the first team as a substitute. Suffered an injury for Leyton Orient just before his planned loan to Grays and has not yet made an appearance for us.

### Harry Agombar - Midfield. Age 22.

He left Grays in 2012 after making 75 appearances to join Macclesfield Town. After a brief loan spell back with the Blues, he moved to Maltese side, Floriana F.C. in January 2013. In July 2013, Swindon Town signed him on a two year contract. Although he is yet to make his League debut for the Robins, he has been a regular in the Professional Development Squad/Reserve side and has made the first team squad on a number of occasions. He returned to the Blues on loan in March 2015 to help with the congested run-in and scored with a sublime free-kick in the recent win over Tonbridge Angels.

### Akwasi Marfo – Wide Midfield. Age 22.

Joined in August 2014 from Dulwich Hamlet where a broken foot restricted his appearances. Has previously played for Slough and can play up front. He scored a match-winning goal in a pre-season win at Chatham Town to earn his place in this season's squad.

### **Grays Athletic Player Profiles**

#### Joao Carlos - Wide Midfield. Age 26.

He joined in the pre-season of 2011. The Portuguese winger started his career at Clapton before moving on to Brentwood Town and then Aveley. He went on to sign for Football League side Dagenham & Redbridge in November 2009, where he made one appearance as a substitute. He rejoined Brentwood Town in August 2010, before a move to Thurrock. He was voted the Player of the Year in 2011/12 and the Supporters' Player of the Year 2013/14. He was also the top scorer in both seasons. On 7th February 2015 Joao made his 200th appearance for the Club.

### Jordan Wilson - Midfield. Age 25.

Started his career at Fulham as a sixteen year old. Moved to Histon in 2009. Had a brief spell at Grays Athletic in 2009/10, before moving on to Tooting & Mitcham and then Carshalton Athletic. Rejoined Grays in March 2014. Scored his debut goal against last season's champions, Wealdstone in a 1-1 draw in April 2014.

### Kenny Beaney – Midfield. Age 28.

This season's Club captain. He made two appearances for Grays Athletic in October 2008 before being released. He started his career at Dulwich Hamlet and had a loan spell at Wealdstone before joining Fisher Athletic in 2007. He also had a short spell with Beckenham Town and then moved on to Thurrock in December 2008. Rejoining Grays Athletic in 2011, he has made one of the midfield spots his own. Over 50 appearances this season and approaching his 200th game.

### James Stevens – Midfield. Age 22.

James came through Southend United's youth system, making his professional debut on 26 March 2011, starting in their 2–1 away loss to Stockport County in League Two. In August 2011, he joined Isthmian League Division One North club Great Wakering Rovers on Ioan. On 18 May 2012, Stevens was one of eleven players to be released at the end of their contract. In August 2012, Stevens signed for Isthmian League side Witham Town on a free transfer, signing for the Blues in December 2014.

### Glen Little – Midfield. Age 39.

A vastly experienced player. He joined in August 2014 from last season's Ryman League Champions, Wealdstone. He was born in Wimbledon. He played previously for Burnley, Derry City, Glentoran, Crystal Palace, Sheffield United, Wrexham and Aldershot Town. He has also appeared in the Premier League for Bolton Wanderers, Reading and Portsmouth. He is the scorer of some classic goals, with either foot and the maker of many more, as 'You Tube' will testify! Glen rejoined the Club in March 2015 after a short spell as coach at Welling United, with former Blues manager, Jody Brown.

### Nathan Ferguson – Midfield. Age 19.

Nathan started his career at Norwich City in their youth academy and has played for Chelmsford City, St Albans City, Folkestone Invicta, Dagenham & Redbridge and Billericay Town. Scored his debut goal in the away win at Bognor on 14 March.

### Jordan Sidhu – Midfield. Age 19.

Young midfielder joined in January 2015 on loan from the Dagenham & Redbridge Academy. Jordan's previous clubs include Southend United and Buckhurst Hill. He has already made an impact in our Under 21 squad.

### Troy Williams – Midfield. Age 19.

Previous Clubs: Tooting & Mitcham, Merstham. Cousin of Jordan Wilson, he joined in August 2014. He was previously with Tooting & Mitcham who he rejoined from Merstham last season. A technically talented midfield player who performs well in a holding role. Has been spending most of this season on loan at Ryman Division One level to gain first team experience.

### Correy Davidson – Winger/Striker. Age 21.

He hails from Dublin and has previously played for Carrick Rangers, Bohemians FC and most recently AFC Sudbury. Last year he represented Ireland in the World University games finishing Ireland's top scorer and represented Northern Ireland amateurs in the 'Umbro cup in Limerick. He has made a big impact at Grays since joining in February 2015 with his pace and commitment.

### Dumebi GB-Dumaka – Striker. Age 22.

Signed in August 2014. Affectionately known as 'DD', the young striker was impressive in training and pre-season friendlies. He was previously with Heybridge Swifts and Barking, for whom he performed well against us in an Essex Senior Cup tie in 2013. Has worked hard at his game and scored some important goals this season.

### Bradley Fortnam–Tomlinson – Striker. Age 20.

He was snapped up at the age of 11 by Leicester City before moving to Sheffield Wednesday at the age of 18. Before his release in 2013, he featured twice for Northern Ireland Under 19s and signed his first professional contract for St Johnstone in Scotland in September 2013. He returned to England in the summer of 2014, joining Hereford United on a six-month deal. He joined the Blues in January 2015 and scored in our 5-2 win at Peacehaven. Based in Leicester, he moved to Ilkeston in the Northern Premier League, but rejoined us again for the run-in on 26 March 2015.

### Brian Moses – Striker. Age 20.

Returned to the Club in February 2015, after a spell at Redbridge. He became a popular player in his previous spell and scored an important goal against Concord Rangers to the help the Blues through to the Essex Senior Cup Final in 2013. Recently impressed as part of the successful Under 21 squad who are pushing to win this season.

### Ibby Akanbi – Striker. Age 17.

The former Crystal Palace youngster joined the Blues on 26 March 2015. With the Blues chasing the Ryman Under 21 League title and having seven games still to play between 4 and 27 April 2015, he is a very good addition to the squad for the last stage of the season.

### Sean Cronin – Centre Back. Age 28.

ON 24 March 2015, Sean joined the Blues on loan from Wealdstone. He signed for Wealdstone in August 2010 having previously played for Neath FC in the Welsh Premier League. Sean has also played for Cardiff City and represented Wales at Under 18, Under 19 and semi-pro Under 23 level, and has made over 170 starts for the Stones.

### Chris Benjamin – Striker. Age 21.

The club are pleased to announce that striker Chris Benjamin has rejoined Grays Athletic. Chris left Grays last year to join fellow Ryman Premier outfit Billericay Town. In a last minute deadline day deal, Chris will now join up with Bentley's young squad and is available for selection for Wednesday night's game against Wingate & Finchley. Welcome back Chris.

### Meet the Officials

#### Referee – Wade Norcott

Wade started refereeing in Harlow, Essex on the Harlow and District Football League as a Level 7 between 1997 and 2003. He was then promoted to Level 6 between 2003 and 2004, officiating on Harlow and District Football League and Essex Senior League as an assistant referee. Wade was promoted to Level 4 in 2004 and officiated for one season on Isthmian Division Two, a season on the Essex Senior League as a referee and was on the National List of Assistant Referees Contributory Leagues. In 2006 he was promoted to Level 3 and spent the two years as an assistant referee on the Panel (Conference Premier) before being promoted to the Football League in 2008. Wade has other interests outside of football. He coaches and plays cricket for Harlow Town Cricket Club and enjoys watching American Football while following the St Louis Rams.

### Assistant Referee - Michael Ryan

Michael qualified as a referee in 2008 and began his officiating career refereeing on the Worthing & District Football League. After securing successive promotions from 2010 to 2013 elevating from a Level 7 to a Level 4 match official, he has since officiated on the Sussex County Football League for the past two seasons. The highlights of his refereeing career to date have included representing the Football Association at three international youth tournaments in Europe. He is a keen supporter of his local Worthing RA and since joining in 2008 he now sits as a committee member assisting with its future sustainability. Apart from his work as an active match official, he also operates as a referee coach within the Sussex County FA Primary Development Group to assist with the development of young referees throughout Sussex. Aside from his refereing, he works full-time as a College & Community Football Coordinator at the Sussex County Football Association. He also sit as a Regional Officer as part of The FA's National Game Youth Council assisting with the development of young people in London, Surrey, Middlesex, Sussex and Wiltshire. His aspirations as a referee are to one day operate in the Premier League and officiate the FA Cup Final.

#### Assistant Referee - Jamie Gilham

Jamie began his refereeing career in Hampshire in 2007 and was fortunate enough to be selected for the academy programme with Portsmouth FC which assisted him in his early years in developing as both a referee and assistant referee. His successful promotions to date have provided him with the opportunity of officiating as a Contributory League Assistant Referee whilst operating in the Sussex County Football League as a referee for the past two seasons. He has also been a member of the senior referee development groups for both Hampshire FA and Sussex FA. Following successful nominations by both his previous parent counties, he has been a proud member of the South East Regional Development Group (SERDG) for two years. That has provided him with a number of great experiences and significant opportunities with those at the top of the refereeing profession. His highlights this season have included being appointed to the third qualifying round in the FA Cup and the preliminary rounds of the FA Vase. Tonight's appointment to the Isthmian League Cup Final is the culmination of another successful and enjoyable campaign.

### Fourth Official - Harry Lennard

Harry qualified as a referee in March 1997 before climbing up through the ranks in Surrey and Leeds (whilst at university) before becoming a Contributory League Referee for the 2004/05 season. He has remained at that level since then but made good progress as an assistant referee since then making it onto the Conference, Football League and Premier League Assistant Referees lists in 2005/06, 2007/08 and 2012/13 respectively. In 2011/12 he was appointed as assistant referee to the League One Play-off Final. In 2013 he was appointed to the FA Trophy Final while in 2014 he was appointed as reserve assistant referee for the Capital One Cup Final and also acted as assistant referee on the FA Cup Semi-Final. At the start of the 2013/14 he was chosen to represent the FA for UEFA's Centre of Refereeing Excellence programme at their HQ in Geneva and at the start of the current season he was appointed to the Community Shield as reserve assistant referee.

### Hendon FC History

Hendon are now into their fifth season under the ownership of its . supporters, following their takeover of the club in the summer of 2010. This is the 52nd consecutive season that the club has played in the top division of the Isthmian League, having been members since the 1963-64 season.

Gary McCann and the squad are very keen to build on the very positive last two seasons where they have finished 10th and 7th respectively.

The club has an illustrious and proud history, and the club was formed in 1908, beginning its existence as Christchurch Hampstead. In the very first season, the club finished as Champions of the Finchley & District League Third Division. There was regular success in the early years, but not before the first of four name changes!

Ahead of the 1909-10 season, the club renamed itself as Hampstead Town, and immediately won the Second Division title, and the First Division title followed a year later. Further successes followed as the club entered sides in both the London and Middlesex Leagues, and on the back of this, the club was elected into the Athenian League in 1914, reaching the top end of the amateur game just 6 years into the club's existence.

Just 2 games were played in the 1914-15 season due to the outbreak of war, but in their eventual debut season in 1919-20, the club finished a highly creditable fourth. The club finished runners-up in 1929, 1933, 1948, 1949 and 1952, before eventually winning the title in 1953. Further titles followed in 1956 and 1961.

The second renaming of the club came in 1926, when the suffix Town was dropped and the club was simply called Hampstead, followed by a change of name to Golders Green in 1933. The final name change came in 1946 when the club became known as Hendon.

There was a previous club called Hendon that reached the quarter finals of the FA Cup in 1883, and in 1932 the old Hendon club met Hampstead in two friendlies, the second of which was to raise funds for the old Hendon club, which sadly ceased to exist a few years later.

In 1963, the club were accepted into the Isthmian League and this is where the club has stayed ever since, always playing in the top division. Success continued as they finished runners-up in their first season, followed by the first of two Championships a year later. A further title followed in 1973, with 1966 and 1974 seeing the club finish second. Indeed, in their first 11 seasons in the Isthmian League, Hendon never finished lower than 6th. Since the the club has had both good and bad seasons in the league, and in 2006 the club was reprieved from relegation due to Canvey Island taking a voluntary relegation of three levels from Conference National.

During the amateur era, the club reached the final of the FA Amateur Cup no less than 5 times, winning the final in 1960 (against Kingstonian), 1965 (against Whitley Bay) and 1972 (against Enfield) and losing in 1955 (against Bishop Auckland) and 1966 (against Wealdstone).

FA Cup success has been enjoyed by the club throughout its history. As well as 21 appearances in the first round (most recently at Aldershot Town in 2012), there have been 6 appearances in the second round (most recently in 1999-2000 at Blackpool) and one appearance in the third round in January 1974 which saw the Greens draw 1-1 at Newcastle United before losing the replay 4-0 at Vicarage Road (the home ground of Watford FC).

The club has also seen plenty of success in county cups, winning the Middlesex Senior Cup no less than 15 times out of 27 final appearances, as well as winning the Middlesex Charity Cup 14 times. The London Senior Cup has been won on four occasions, with a further 11 appearances as losing finalists.

The club moved into its famous Claremont Road ground in 1926, with the first game being an FA Cup tie against Berkhamsted Town that took place on 18th September with Hendon winning 4-3. The final game was played 82 years later, almost to the day, on 20th September 2008 when local rivals Wealdstone were the visitors, and the Stones ran out 4-1 winners.

Since leaving Claremont Road, the club spent four years groundsharing with Wembley FC, and from the beginning of the 2013/14 season are now groundsharing at Harrow Borough's Earlsmead ground, where the club has been made very welcome.

The club have relaunched their youth section this season, with 15 sides taking the field, and the hope is that over the coming years some of these youngsters will progress into the first team.

Plans are in place for the club to move to Silver Jubilee Park in Kingsbury, the former home of Kingsbury Town, where a FIFA accredited all weather pitch was installed and certified in October 2014. The plan is for the club to move in once the ground has been brought up to the required standard. The intention is for this to become the club's new permanent home and it will be shared with the recently reformed Edgware Town. Assuming all the necessary work is done, the club hope to be at Silver Jubilee Park within the next two years.

Did you know that .....

- 100,000 watched Hendon against northern giants Bishop Auckland in the 1955 Amateur Cup Final at Wembley.

 Following an invitation from the F.A. to test the system Hendon were the first club to play under floodlights at Wembley Stadium.

 In the early 1950s, Hendon became the first team in Britain to win a floodlit cup tie when they won a London Challenge Cup match against Arsenal at Highbury.

- Hendon won on all of their last three visits to Highbury, probably a unique record (the other two came in the 1964/65 season when Arsenal were beaten 4-3 in a London Challenge Cup tie after the Gunners were 3-0 ahead and Finchley were downed 4-1 in an FA Amateur Cup semi-final.

 The club's original colours were blue. In 1997/98 when Hendon ditched their now traditional green and brought back the original blue there was a huge outcry by supporters and the green was duly restored two seasons later!

England's three highest capped Amateur Internationals since the war were all Hendon players. Rod Haider (65 caps), John Swannell (61) and Mike Pinner (52) lead the way with Peter Deadman (40) and Laurie Topp (32) making it 5 Hendon players in the top ten of England cap winners.
Hendon have progressed through the round in which they entered the FA Cup in each of the last 29 seasons. The last defeat in their opening round came in 1985 at the hands of Ruislip Manor.

 Leon Smith equalled an 89 year old club record when he scored in 8 consecutive games during the 2014-15 season. The record was set by Oscar Reinke in 1925. Leon is only the fourth player in the club's history to score in 7 or more consecutive games, and the first post-war player to score in 6 in a row.

### Hendon FC Player Profiles

#### **GARY McCANN (Manager)**

Now in his tenth full season as manager, having taken over in February 2005, Gary is the club's longest serving manager, having taken charge of over 500 games. Originally joined the club as ā goalkeeper in March 1997 as Frank Murphy's first signing, and went on to make 196 appearances between the sticks. Was a popular figure with the supporters during his time as a player, and his popularity has continued in his managerial role.

#### FREDDIE HYATT (Assistant Manager)

Joined Gary McCann as his assistant in February 2006. Freddie originally joined the Greens in August 1997, and was a talented midfielder whose skill on the ball was legendary, as those who saw his outrageous piece of skill at Heybridge in his final appearance will testify. Made 163 appearances, scoring 18 goals. Freddie is a great asset to Gary and a charismatic influence within the club, both in the dressing room, and with the supporters.

### SCOTT COUSINS (Coach)

Defender with a wealth of experience who rejoined Hendon in October 2009 from Carshalton Athletic, and was appointed as a coach in May 2014. Scott originally came to the club more than 7 years ago, when he signed at the beginning of the 2003/2004 season from Chelsea, where he had made 27 Reserve Team appearances. Scott's debut for Hendon came in a 4-1 win over Basingstoke Town in August 2003 at The Camrose. During his first term with Hendon he completed 51 apps, scoring 8 goals before leaving to join St. Albans City (where he spent the next 5 seasons) just before the start of the 2004/2005 season. Has made a total of 237 appearances for the club so far, scoring 14 goals.

### MARK FINDLEY (Sports Therapist)

Mark arrived at Hendon in February 2007 having performed in a similar role at North Greenford United and also in Rugby. Mark does a superb job in maintaining the fitness of the playing squad, and working hard with the players as and when injuries do occur to ensure that time spent unavailable is kept to a minimum.

#### **BELAL AITE-OUAKRIM**

Exciting forward who rejoined the club for his fourth spell in September 2014. Originally joined in August 2005 scoring on his debut in the memorable 5-4 win over Wealdstone. Left in the summer of 2008 to join AFC Wimbledon, before returning to Hendon in February 2010. Left again in the summer of 2011 to join Staines Town, before returning later that year. Spent the 2013-14 season with Hampton & Richmond Borough. Scored his 50th goal on his 150th appearance at Enfield Town in November 2012.

### **ELLIOTT BRATHWAITE**

Strong defender who joined the club in July 2011 after putting in some impressive performances in friendlies. Began his career in the youth academy at Wycombe Wanderers, before spells at Ashford Town and, most recently, Hampton & Richmond Borough. Recently returned to action after two serious injuries over the past two years.

### LEWIS CLARK

Young defender signed on work experience terms from Dagenham & Redbridge in October 2014.

### ANDRE DA COSTA

Portuguese midfielder who signed in July 2014. Andre was with both Bishop's Stortford and Kingstonian last season, and has previously appeared for AFC Bournemouth and Macclesfield Town as well has having spells in both Malta and Cyprus. Made his debut as a substitute on the opening day against Bury Town. First goal was a superb curling effort in the FA Cup against Leiston.

### PETER DEAN

Forward who rejoined in the summer of 2014 from Wealdstone, where he was an important member of their title winning squad last season. Originally signed from Bishop's Stortford in January 2009, leaving at the end of the following season.

### DAVE DIEDHIOU

Defender/midfielder who joined in the summer of 2008 from Middlesex County League side, Willesden Constantine. Dave originates from French speaking Senegal in West Africa. (Diedhiou is pronounced "Deejoo"). Made his debut from the subs bench in the away league fixture at Sutton United in August 2008 and scored his first goal for the club in the home league fixture against Wealdstone in Sept 2008. Dave is now very much an important member of the squad and can slot into a number of positions.

### JAMES FISHER

An experienced campaigner who is equally at home in defence or midfield, James joined the club in June 2011 having spent three years with St Albans City where he made over 130 appearances. Began his career at Chelsea as a youngster, before having spells with Wembley, Wealdstone and Northwood. Made his debut as a substitute in the win at Margate in September 2011.

### SAM FLEGG

Defender who signed from Thatcham Town in December 2012. Has previously played for Loughborough University and Reading Town. Made his debut in the London Senior Cup tie at Croydon. Career Appearances : 66 Goals : 3

### CHARLIE GOODE

Young defender who signed in November 2014 from AFC Hayes having come through the youth set up at Harefield United. Has also played for Hadley.

### **BRENDAN HAZLETT**

Goalkeeper signed from Loughborough University in August 2014. Has also appeared for Stratford Town, Southam United and Atherstone United. Currently dual registered with Concord Rangers.

Experienced striker who signed in July 2014 from Basingstoke Town. Scored on his debut against Bury Town on the opening day of the season.

### CASEY MACLAREN

Talented defender/midfielder who signed in the summer of 2007 having impressed in the pre-season friendlies. Casey's debut for Hendon was from the bench in the home league win against Leyton in August 2007. Previously with AFC Wimbledon. Unfortunately, injury kept him out of the team for most of season 2008/09, but fighter that he is, Casey overcame his problems and is once again an integral part of the team.

### **KEVIN MACLAREN**

Club captain who is the younger brother of Casey, who joined Hendon from Walton Casuals prior to the start of the 2008/09 season. Kevin, who has proved himself adept to slot in where required in defence or midfield, made his debut in the 3-0 win over Dartford at Claremont Road in the first league game of 08/09. His exceptional workrate has made him a crowd favourite.

### MAX McCANN

Young midfielder who is the second of manager Gary McCann's four sons, signed from Boreham Wood in March 2013. Will be hoping to break into the side on a regular basis this season.

### BEN McNAMARA

Goalkeeper signed in September 2014. Previously with Northampton Town, and has also appeared for Bonnyrig in Australia.

### DANIEL McNICHOLAS

Teenage keeper who signed from Northwood towards the end of last season, making his debut at Bognor Regis Town in the penultimate game of the season. Currently dual registered with Northwood.

### AARON MORGAN

Exciting, hard working striker, who returned to the club in July 2013 from North Greenford United. Originally signed just before the start of the 2010/11 season from Hillingdon Borough. Scored 2 goals on his debut for Hendon against Tooting & Mitcham on his debut at Imperial Fields, and became a regular in the first team squad. Has previously played for Bedfont.
