

It gives me great pleasure to present the first of three books on the Spartan Football League, which was formed in 1907 and lasted until 1975 when it merged with the Metropolitan-London League. This first volume covers the period from 1907 to 1930 with volumes 2 and 3 covering seasons 1930/50 and 1950/75 respectively, which will complete the history of the Spartan Football League.

The Spartan League over the years has provided some good achievements by clubs in FA competitions as well as numerous County Cup competitions.

The research conducted in obtaining all of the league results was like looking for the proverbial needle in the haystack particularly when league tables are published incorrectly, although I did enjoy researching the club directory section. More importantly the potted history, results and league tables are now recorded.

Finally, I hope this book will be a good reference guide and I would be grateful to receive any 'addenda', which can be used as feedback in volume 2.

The Spartan League A Short History 1907/1930

The close season of 1907 saw the establishment of the Spartan League, but the principal event in amateur circles that summer was the 'split'. This was about the government of amateur football, and to many concerned the administration of amateur players who received nothing for their endeavours, those who in effect paid to play. Up to this time the Football Association controlled all football, both amateur and professional. Some Clubs, notably Old Boys clubs, wished to break away from the parent body and form an association for amateur clubs only. A 'split' therefore took place.

R.R. ("Dick") Schumacher is credited with the idea of forming a Spartan League, a competition formed under the auspices of the Football Association and thus only open to affiliated clubs. The 'split' wrought drastic changes to the membership of the Isthmian League, a competition that was only two seasons old.

Dick Schumacher was a schoolmaster, and represented St Marks College on the London Football Association. He became vice-president of the Association in 1905 and was an Isthmian League official from 1909 onwards. He shared with others of the time zeal in organising sporting competitions. His own interests stretched to cricket and bowls.

Credited, was the co-founder of the Spartan League Thomas H Kirkup. He was from County Durham, but came to London in his teens. In 1895 he was honorary secretary of the South Essex League and became a member of the Essex County F.A. Executive in 1896. He later joined the London F.A. and became Secretary in 1903. Also appointed to the Council of the Football Association, he was one of the founders of the Isthmian League in 1905 and assisted in forming the Football Combination in 1915.

The League's first chairman was Thomas Kyle, the chairman of the Berks and Bucks F.A.Council.

New Competition's first season Notable Cup run by Shepherds Bush

The Spartan League kicked off with six Clubs. Three had been in the Southern Suburban League Division One - 1906/07 had seen the six-club table finish with Nunhead as champions followed by West Norwood, Bromley, Croydon, Woolwich Polytechnic and Lee - the top three were all Spartan League founder members. Dulwich Hamlet came from the same competition's senior division and, with West Norwood, also competed in the Isthmian League in the Spartan's inaugural campaign. They were to finish respectively 5th and 6th in the Isthmian League. Shepherds Bush came from West London and were Great Western Suburban League winners, three points ahead of runners-up Brentford Reserves in an eleven-club table. Leytonstone from Essex made up the compliment.

Bromley were first League champions with 16 points and they also won the Kent Amateur Cup that season, beating Rochester in a replay. They were, however, knocked out of the London Senior Cup by eventual Isthmian League champions, London Caledonians who went on to beat Dulwich Hamlet in the final.

In the F.A. Cup Preliminary Round, Leytonstone beat South Weald 8-2, Bromley beat Northfleet United 6-0, Nunhead beat Croydon Common, the Southern League side making their debut in the competition, 3-1. In the First Qualifying Round, Leytonstone lost 4-0 to Ilford who were one point away from Isthmian League champions at the end of the season; Nunhead beat Summerstown 2-0, Shepherds Bush beat Wycombe Wanderers of Southern League Second Division in a replay, and Bromley beat Faversham.

The Second Qualifying Round included three Spartan League teams from the six club competition - two survived, Shepherds Bush needing a replay to beat Windsor and Eton, with Bromley beating Depot Battalion Royal Engineers (who went on to win the F.A. Amateur Cup that season) 1-0. In the Third Qualifying Round, the Divisional final, Shepherds Bush won at Maidenhead Norfolkians but Bromley lost 6-2 at Maidstone United. Shepherds Bush continued to win, next beating Finchley 4-2, but in the last qualifying round, the sixth, they lost to Southern Leaguers New Brompton 6-0.

All six of the Spartan League's members appeared in the First Round proper of the season's F.A. Amateur Cup. Four lost. Nunhead and Bromley (who had beaten West Norwood in the first round) lost in the Second Round (a round of 16 ties), to Depford Invicta, that season's London League Division One winners, and 1st Royal Scots Guards respectively.

The strength of the Spartan League competition was demonstrated in its F.A Cup and other successes. But it was all to change.

Second Season ... and completely new membership

The Isthmian League expanded its membership and thus its League programme the following season. Ten clubs gave an 18-match programme and all the Spartan League teams left to compete in the Isthmian League. 1908/09 thus saw a complete change in Spartan League membership with metropolitan, suburban and provincial clubs joining the competition, which was split in two groups, an Eastern Section of five clubs and Western Section of six.

The Eastern Section had a good representation from the South Essex League (where J.T. Clark was Hon. Secretary). That League had seen South Weald as champions in 1907. In 1907/08 they finished third in an eight club table with Walthamstow Grange 4th and Chelmsford 6th. South Weald had also reached the Walthamstow Charity Cup Final. These three clubs all joined the Spartan League for its second season.

While Shepherds Bush had been on their Cup run, the clubs who joined the League for 1908/09 had seen little success the previous season: Only Clapham had reached the Divisional final, but there they had lost to Woking. South Weald, Summerstown and Marlow had all been First Round casualties in the F.A. Amateur Cup.

Some clubs competed in other Leagues for 1908/09 - Walthamstow Grange finished sixth of nine in the London League Division One, while Clapham won the seven club Division Two. St Albans City won the Western Section of the Herts County League.

In the F.A.Cup that season Preliminary Round ties saw Luton Clarence beat Biggleswade and District, 2nd Coldstream Guards beat West Hampstead, Walthamstow Grange beat Woodford(5-0), and Summerstown beat Wimbledon. In the First Qualifying Round Luton Clarence beat Wellingborough Redwell Stars, Aylesbury won at Yieswley, and Summerstown beat Woking. Only the Luton side made further progresses beating Kettering St Mary's in a replay before losing to Kettering 3-0 in the Third Qualifying Round, the divisional final.

In the F.A. Amateur Cup Chelmsford, Newportonians, and Luton Clarence were all beaten in the First Round proper, the last 64 in a competition the final of which was won 6-0 by Isthmian League side Clapton.

The League Championship was decided by a play-off in the competition's second season with Western Section winners Aylesbury United, who equalled Bromley's points record with 16, beating their Eastern Section counterparts Luton Clarence, with nine points from eight games, one point covering all bar one other club.

Third Season, 1909/10 - more reorganisation

A huge variety of clubs passed through in this period. In the seven campaigns following the first, seven clubs were in membership for just one season, while a further five were in membership for two seasons only. 1909/10 saw the clubs reorganised into a Division A and a Division B, with a single table competition in place for the remaining seasons up to the Great War.

Five clubs did not resume in the competition for 1909/10, while there were seven newcomers. 2nd Coldstream Guards won Division A with a record 19 points while St Albans City, who the previous season had finished bottom of the western section and were the first Club to have points deducted, won Division B. The military side won the championship match 1-0.

Among the new clubs were Redhill who had played in the previous season in Division Two of the South Eastern League, Sutton Court from Hounslow, Wimbledon from the West Surrey League and Chesham Generals who were South Eastern League Division Two champions (with Watford Reserves as runners-up), and who continued in that competition for one more season.

In the 1909/10 F.A.Cup Preliminary Round there were wins for St Albans and Wimbledon. The First Qualifying Round saw only Luton Clarence (8-0 v Kettering Working Mens'), make progresses, but Kettering were to defeat them again in the next round.

Consolidation into one Division

The turnover in clubs continued and the competition consolidated into one division for the remaining pre-war seasons.

1910/11 finished with eleven clubs, Marlow dropping out mid-season. Of these eleven, ten had been in the competition in 1909/10. The F.A.Cup Preliminary Round ties saw wins for Chesham Generals, St Albans City and League newcomers, Tufnell Park.

Tufnell Park had been Formation in 1907 and immediately became a senior amateur Club, joining the London League where they finished third in Division one in their debut season. They switched to the Middlesex League for the next season in which they won the championship without losing a match. In 1909/10 they were back in the London League finishing runners-up to Wood Green in Division One 'B'. In 1910/11 they participated in both the Spartan and London Leagues finishing as runners-up in the Spartan and fifth of eight in the Premier Division 'B' of the London League, the four teams above them all being the Reserve sides of Football League or Southern League professional clubs.

In the First Qualifying Round of the F.A.Cup 3rd Grenadier Guards, Tufnell Park, and St Albans City were all winners. Tufnell Park and St Albans met each other for a place in the divisional final and Tufnell Park emerged as 3-1 replay winners. The army side lost 5-1 to Ilford. London League Enfield beat Tufnell Park 4-0 in the Third Qualifying Round.

In winning the 1911 championship 2nd Coldstream Guards broke the points record again with 31 from 18 matches.

1911/12 saw thirteen clubs participate, four of whom were new to the competition: 1912/13 saw two drop outs and two newcomers; and 1913/14 saw a reduction down to twelve participants, two new to the competition. May 1912 saw the first Spartan League representative game, a 4-3 defeat by the Isthmian League at Aylesbury. At the start of the following season there was a re-match, this time the Isthmians winning 6-1 at St Albans. There were to be no further inter-League games until 1921.

Hitchin Town did not re-appear after the 1910/11 season, their second in the competition. Hitchin FC had played in the very first F.A.Cup competition, and Hitchin townspeople were among those who contributed to the purchase of the first trophy. The club was one of the strongest in Hertfordshire and won the Senior Cup twice before the turn of the century. In the early years of the new century Hitchin Town played in Division One of the South Eastern League, but dropped out after finishing bottom of the 18-club competition (which was won by Woolwich Arsenal Reserves). The Club reverted to amateur status and joined the Spartan League, but 1911 saw them finish bottom, lose their grandstand to fire and close down.

The 1911/12 F.A.Cup saw a Spartan League side in the Extra Preliminary Round for the first time. Defending champions 2nd Coldstream Guards were taken to a replay by Grays Athletic before they made progresses, although they lost to Leytonstone in the next round. There were, however, First Qualifying Round wins for Tufnell Park, St Albans City and for League newcomers 1st Grenadier Guards. While St Albans lost to Ilford and the army side lost to Barnet Alston, Tufnell Park took Enfield to a replay before losing to the Barnet team in the Divisional Final.

St Albans City were Champions in 1911/12 with 43 points, easily the highest total so far, although by now this was from a 24-match programme.

In the 1912/13 F.A.Cup First Qualifying Round St Albans City were the only Spartan winners, but they lost to Enfield in the next round.

In the 1913/14 competition Watford Orient appeared in the Extra Preliminary Round and lost 3-2 at Apsley, only for the hosts to be disqualified. It was not a successful year for the Spartan League. Preliminary Round Results included Luton Amateur 6 Watford Orient 0; Luton Clarence 4 Tufnell Park Spartans 0; St Albans City 1 Page Green Old Boys 2; Maidenhead Norfolkians 3 Polytechnic 1. In the First Qualifying Round, which had just one Spartan League club, and one which did not appear in the preliminary rounds saw, Tunbridge Wells, who were to finish bottom of the League, beat Littlehampton but lose in the next round, in a replay, to Eastbourne St Mary.

Pre Great War period Amateur Cup exploits

Few Spartan Leaguers reached the competition proper of the F.A. Amateur Cup early in this period. With four rounds before the semi-finals, the country's strongest 64 clubs made up the First Round Proper and it was there that Spartan Leaguers who had survived the qualifying competition usually fell. In 1908/09 South Weald went out to Custom House; in 1909/10 Newportonians and Luton Clarence went out at the First Round stage while Redhill, in their only Spartan League season, received a bye - they won 3-0 at Kingston-upon-Thames in the next round losing to Custom House to a single penalty goal in a replay in the last 16.

In 1910/11 St.Albans City, 2nd Coldstream Guards and Tufnell Park were First Round winners while Aylesbury United had the unhappy experience of going down 10-1 against 1st Kings Royal Rifles. 2nd Coldstream Guards beat Royal Engineers (Aldershot) to become the only Spartans in the last 16 where they beat Redhill. A 3-2 win at Wycombe Wanderers put them into the semi-finals. There they took eventual winners, and defending Isthmian League champions, Bromley, to a replay, both games being held at Redhill. 2nd Coldstream Guards went on to become Spartan League champions.

St Albans were champions in 1911/12, but were beaten finalists in that season's Amateur Cup First Round proper along with defending champions, 2nd Coldstream Guards. Tufnell Park, however, beat former Spartans Luton Clarence in a first round replay, and Walthamstow Grange in Round Two. Basford United and then mighty Isthmians Dulwich Hamlet were beaten en route to put Tufnell Park into the semi-final, the second successive season that a Spartan League club had reached that stage.

The long trek to Stockton to play Eston United, the 1909-Cup finalists, saw Tufnell Park lose to a first half goal. Eston lost to Stockton in the final. Tufnell Park finished bottom of the League that season and did not resume the following season, becoming founder members of the Athenian League along with, former Spartans Chelmsford. Another former Spartan League team, Luton Clarence, became Athenians in 1913. Tufnell Park also reached the Middlesex Senior Cup semi-final in 1912 and again finished 5th in Premier Division B of the London League, trailing four Football League and Southern League Reserve sides.

The next Amateur Cup campaign, 1912/13, failed to produce a hat trick of Spartan semi-final appearances. Defending League champions St Albans got to the last eight by way of competition proper wins over Shepherds Bush, Tufnell Park and Cup holders Stockton in a replay. In the fourth round though Bromley were too strong for them, the now Kent League side winning 4-1. Chesham Generals were the only other Spartan League side in the competition proper and they went out in the First Round. St Albans won the Herts Charity Shield in 1913.

The 1913/14 competition saw an all northern final. Defending Spartan League champions 2nd Coldstream Guards beat Aylesbury United 5-0 in an all-Spartan First Round clash. Chesham Generals, who were champions that season, lost by the same scoreline to Isthmians London Caledonians. St Albans were also a First Round casualty, while the Guards team fell at the next round, 2-1 to Barnet & Alston. League newcomers, Tunbridge Wells were First Round winners, beating West Norwood in a replay, before a Second Round defeat 4-1 at Metrogas. Tunbridge Wells had been Isthmian League members in the two previous seasons, finishing last and one off the bottom in a 20 match programme in those two campaigns.

On the County Cup scene in this period, while in Spartan League membership Luton Clarence won the Bedfordshire Senior Cup, Aylesbury United won the Berks and Buck Senior Cup, St Albans City won the Herts Charity Cup twice, Shepherd's Bush won the London Charity Cup, and Nunhead won the Surrey Senior Cup.

After the Great War

There was no Spartan League competition for the 1914/15 season or throughout the War, with the League resuming in 1919 with eleven clubs. Of these St Albans, 2nd Coldstream Guards Newportonians and Aylesbury United continued their unbroken membership since 1908 and Polytechnic and Tufnell Spartans their unbroken membership since 1911. Chesham United (a 1919 amalgamation of Chesham Generals, Spartan Leaguers since 1909, and Chesham Town) were also in membership together with four new clubs.

Newcomer's Wycombe Wanderers won the championship in their first season, but were unsuccessful in their application to join the Isthmian League. Wycombe's Loakes Park ground was selected but not used as the venue for a possible F.A. Amateur Cup final replay that season.

Many clubs played football in Wycombe and Wycombe Wanderers, formed in 1887, emerged as the premier club. They had vast experience playing in the Southern League Division Two from 1896/87 until 1907/08 and then in the Great Western Suburban League. They had reached the Third Round Proper of the Amateur Cup in 1898, and the Fourth Round in 1909/10 - in this season they also reached the Final Qualifying Round of the F.A.Cup for the second time.

Wycombe were Berks & Bucks Senior Cup winners in 1902, 1909, 1910 and 1913. During the 1914 close season Wycombe were accepted into the Spartan League but continued in membership of the Great Western Suburban League with the intention of fielding teams of equal strength in each. In the event War broke out and competitive fixtures were stopped.

They started their second Spartan League season with ten straight wins which, added to a run of eleven at the end of the previous campaign, gave a run of 21 consecutive League wins! In the 1920/21 F.A.Cup they reached the penultimate Qualifying Round, loosing at Kettering Town 2-1 in front of a 6,000 crowd. The Berks & Bucks Senior Cup was also won that second season, a 5-2 victory being recorded in front of nearly 10,000 fans against Slough at Reading. A good season all round, the F.A. Amateur Cup quarter finals were reached, Loftus Albion of the North Riding hosting the match which they won 2-0.

Membership of the Isthmian League was secured for the 1921/22 season.

Another newcomer for the first post-war season, GER Romford, were runners-up in the first post war season. In March 1919 the Great Eastern Railway team's Committee reported the wish to build up a strong enough team to enter the Isthmian League in 1919/20. No effort was to be spared to obtain the services of the best players in the company's employ to this end.

Railwaymen. 'Works' sides were quite common at this level of football around this time. In the event GER (Romford) participated in the Spartan League, along with another railway side, Great Western Railway. While the Essex-based side did well in finishing as runners-up in the first post-war season, GWR came tenth and dropped out at the end of the season. GER Romford stayed in the League until 1931 winning a championship and being second on two more occasions.

GWR returned as a Division Two side for the 1921/22 season, but dropped out again in 1924, only to return a season later, their final campaign being in 1930/31. Railway Clearing House had a four season spell in the League finishing one off bottom in their first season, 1921/22, and thereafter finishing in the bottom half of Division Two. LMS had two Second Division seasons in the mid-1920s, while Metropolitan Railway had just one season of membership, 1925/26.

Another newcomer was Essex Club Hoffman Athletic, but they failed to see out the season and dropped out of the League.

In the 1919/20 F.A. Cup First Qualifying Round Chesham won 1-0 at Enfield, St Albans City beat Barnet 4-0 and Wycombe beat Maidenhead United. In the Second Qualifying Round both Chesham, 2-0 winners at Leavesden MH, and Wycombe, 5-4 replay winners at Slough, were successful. Chesham beat Luton Clarence 3-1 away, the conquerors of St Albans, in the Divisional final with Wycombe losing to Hampstead Town. In the 4th Qualifying Round, London Caledonian beat the Spartan survivors 3-1.

Chesham also made their mark on the F.A. Amateur Cup, beating Aylesbury Town in the First Round proper before losing 5-0 at Bromley. St Albans City were also in the First Round but there they again found Luton Clarence too much for them, losing by the odd goal in seven. Wycombe Wanderers also lost heavily at the same stage, 6-2 at Tufnell Park.

Second Post-war season - Second Division introduced

The second post war season saw the re-introduction of a Second Division again. 2nd Coldstream Guards and GWR left along with St Albans City. St Albans, 3rd in the first post-war season moved to the Athenian League. This was the first of many similar moves by the Spartan League's better teams. Tufnell Spartans, originally formed as a breakaway from Tufnell Park, changed their name to Wood Green. Slough, Leavesden Mental Hospital (Herts Senior Cup holders and runners-up in the County Charity Cup the previous season too) and Ist Welsh Guards were newcomers to the top division. Slough joined as Berks and Buck Senior Cup holders.

While the new Division Two saw new clubs Cubitts Recreation Club and RAF Uxbridge join, the balance of the division was made up of six Division One Reserve sides, including those of newcomers Slough and Wycombe whose second string carried off the championship to record a 'double' repeated by Chesham United the following season.

There were five new clubs to the competition, all in Division One the following season, three of which brought their Reserves to Division Two, Finchley, Walthamstow Avenue and Leyland Motors. Hertford Town, Herts Charity Shield winners in the two previous seasons, were another Club new to Division One in 1921/22 and the only club of the 1921 intake that were still in the competition by the 1930s.

1920 saw <u>Finchley</u> not yet restarted after the Great War owing to the Council being unable to supply a ground and several players joining other local clubs. Eventually a meeting was held on 17th June 1921 for the purpose of restarting the Club and this was achieved. Over 1,400 spectators saw trial games at the beginning of the season, and League gates averaged over 800 during the first Spartan League season when the final of the Middlesex Junior Cup was reached, opponents Hounslow Ivydene winning 3-1. The original Club could trace its origins back to 1874 and were F.A.Cup entrants in 1878/79. They had been Athenian League founder members in 1912 finishing 6th in the competition's two pre-War seasons and 7th of eight in the 1914-15 London League Amateur section.

Inspired by having their own ground, Walthamstow Avenue was successful in their first application to join the Spartan League. The ground at Green Pond Farm had been acquired for £625 freehold following the accumulation of loan and donations. The Club had been reformed in 1919 and took part in the South Essex League as well as a handful of local Cup competitions. In the Club's first Spartan League game 2,000 people saw them lose 3-1 to Slough. The new ground was used for the first time in the December of the first season. The original club was established in the 1890s from former Pretoria Avenue School players, playing as Pretoria Avenue Old Boys in Old Boys competition. In 1901 they moved to the Walthamstow and District League as Avenue United. The final name change came during the 1902/03 season

In the 1920/21 F.A.Cup First Qualifying Round GER beat Clapton 1-0, Wycombe and Slough both won and all three won their Second Qualifying Round ties. Wycombe and Slough came together in the Divisional final, the latter winning the replay 7-2, while GER beat Barking 5-2, also in a replay. The two Spartan League sides were drawn together in the Fourth Qualifying Round, the Buckinghamshire side winning by the odd goal in five in front of a 5,000 crowd. Wycombe then lost 2-1 in the Fifth Qualifying Round at Kettering watched by 6,000.

Chesham were again First Round winners in the F.A. Amateur Cup beating fellow Spartan Leaguers Leavesden Mental Hospital 3-2. Wycombe also made progress beating Signal Services by the same score. Cheetah lost to Tufnell Park in the next round, but Wycombe beat Barnet at Loakes Park 4-3. In the last 16 Wycombe visited Chesham's conquerors and beat them 4-3, but found Loftus Albion too strong in the quarter finals, going down 2-1.

The 1921/22 F.A.Cup First Qualifying Round Slough beat Isthmians Wycombe Wanderers to join Aylesbury and Chesham in the second round. All three Spartan survivors were in the same Cup division and while Aylesbury beat Reading Amateurs 7-0 to reach the divisional final, the other two had to play each other, Slough, the hosts, winning 2-0. A 1-1 draw at Slough was followed by a 2-1 replay win for hosts Aylesbury in the divisional final. In the Fourth Qualifying Round Aylesbury drew 0-0 with Metrogas, but lost the replay 5-0.

Slough were the League's sole representatives in the First Round Proper of the 1921/22 F.A. Amateur Cup but lost in a replay to Botwell Mission, Great Western Suburban League Champions that season. Chesham United won the Berks and Bucks Senior Cup. This season also saw the first post Great War inter-League match, the Isthmians beating the Spartans 6-2.

More new Clubs

There were a further three new clubs added to the top flight in 1922, Wealdstone, Maidenhead United and Old Lyonians, with four others joining Division Two. Leyland Motors were among the clubs that had left the League, following their only season in the competition: They became founder members of the Surrey Senior League. Chesham United retained the championship in 1922/23 to repeat Wycombe's feat in the two postwar seasons.

In 1922/23 the F.A.Cup First Qualifying Round saw GER beat Walthamstow Grange, Botwell Mission beat Maidenhead, Leavesden won 2-0 at Luton Amateur, Chesham beat Southall 5-3, Slough beat Henley 8-0. Chesham beat Botwell Mission 6-0 in the Second Qualifying Round to meet Slough, 2-0 winners at Wycombe, in the divisional final. It was hosts Chesham who moved on, recording a 5-1 win. In the next Qualifying Round Chesham, who were champions that season, beat Oxford City 5-2, only to lose 6-1 at Ilford in the fifth and penultimate round of the qualifying competition.

While Leavesden recorded a magnificent 2-0 win at Dulwich Hamlet in the First Round proper of the Amateur Cup in 1922/23, Slough had the misfortune to have to visit London Caledonians, the eventual winners - they lost 10-2. Leavesden beat Grays Athletic 1-0 to reach the last 16, but lost 2-1 away to Northampton Nomads. Maidenhead United were runners-up in the Berks & Bucks Senior Cup in their first Spartan League season, going down 4-0 to Wycombe Wanderers at Slough in front of a 11,500 crowd.

For the 1923/24 season Finchley returned to the London League but RAF Uxbridge rejoined going into the top division having spent a single season in Division Two three years earlier. There were no other changes to the top flight (except that Sutton Court were renamed Old Latymerians), with two new clubs in Division Two, one of which, Leighton United, were also Bedfordshire County League founder members that season.

1923/24, saw F.A.Cup preliminary round wins for Hertford Town, Wealdstone, and Slough (13-0 v Henley Comrades). Wealdstone and Hertford came together in the next round, Wealdstone winning the replay 5-3, with Slough being the only other Spartan success. Slough went on to beat Southall to reach the divisional final where they lost 3-0 to Botwell Mission.

In the Amateur Cup First Round proper Aylesbury United beat Leavesden in a replay only to fall 10-1 to Northampton Nomads in the Second Round. Slough was a First Round loser, going down 5-3 at Erith & Belvedere. Slough won the Berks and Bucks Senior Cup.

1924/25 saw the addition of Botwell Mission and Staines Lagonda to Division One to replace champions Leavesden and Old Lyonians. There were two new clubs in the lower division too.

Botwell Mission had been formed as boys' club in 1909 and they soon won the Middlesex Minor Cup. They became a senior club immediately after the Great War and were runners up to Maidenhead United in the twelve-club Great Western Suburban League in 1919/20, ahead of third placed Slough on goal average. They dominated the competition for the next four seasons, being champions on each occasion and won the Middlesex Senior Cup in both 1920 and 1921. In 1921/22 they reached the Second Round of the F.A. Amateur Cup, then Round Four, in 1923/24 where they lost to eventual finalists Erith & Belvedere.

Staines Lagonda were also prominent in the Great Western Suburban League, finishing as runners-up to Botwell Mission in both 1923 and 1924. In 1924 they reached the last 16 of the F.A. Amateur Cup where they were beaten at home by Wycombe Wanderers 2-1 in front of a 3,125 gate.

There were F.A.Cup Preliminary Round wins for Chesham, Wealdstone, newcomers Botwell Mission, Maidenhead United, Wood Green and Slough in 1924/25. Only Chesham made further progress at the expense of Maidenhead, then beat Hounslow 3-1 but lost 5-0 to Southall in the Third Qualifying Round. Chesham and Botwell Mission lost in the First Round proper of the F.A. Amateur Cup to leave Staines Lagonda, 4-2 winners over club Leighton United, as the Spartan League's only representative in the Second Round. There they lost to two late goals at Barnet.

Further expansion - Division Two sectionalised, 1925/26

Cup exploits 1925/1930

There was just one new club to Division One for the 1925/26 season.

Colchester Town came with an extensive history. Formation as Colchester in October 1873, they were founder members of the Essex FA in September 1882 and winners of the very first Essex Senior Cup final, beating Braintree 3-1. In September 1890 the Club merged with Excelsior to become Colchester Town. In 1910 the Club occupied the ground at Layer Road for the first time. In 1913 they were champions of the South Essex League, the Essex and Suffolk Border League, and the East Anglian League. After the Great War, seeking progress, the Club tried, but failed, to gain entry to the Athenian League and spent some time in the Middlesex League. Of the 1925 intake, they were the only Club to be placed in Division One, a reflection of their status at the time.

The 1925 Division Two intake of eleven clubs included two long-established clubs from the Lea Valley, Hoddesdon Town and Ware. Their quest for more senior football followed a familiar pattern in the Home Counties as Clubs sought a higher standard of competition and this is well reflected in the progress made in East Hertfordshire by these two clubs.

Hoddesdon Football Club was formed in 1879 and had its origins in the Working Men's Club in the town. The club's first players were mainly former public schoolboys and university men and they were Herts Senior Cup entrants in the inaugural season, one of eleven clubs, reaching the final where they met Watford Rovers at Balls Park, Hertford. Two down at half-time and with barely twenty minutes to go, the side from the cast of the County scored five times to overwhelm their opponents and receive the Cup from the owner of Balls Park. They were finalists four consecutive seasons between 1887 and 1890, winning the competition three times, twice beating Watford Rovers and once beating St Albans. They were runners-up again in 1923/24.

At a meeting at the Old Town Hall in October 1892 Ware Town was formed, the town having already hosted a Herts County Cup final, even though it was not represented in the competition. At the first AGM, in August 1893, it was agreed to change the name to Ware Football Club. Ware officials were among those responsible for the formation of the East Herts League in 1896, the competition's participants being from towns strung along the railway lines from Broxbourne to Hertford and Bishops Stortford.

Burnt Mill were the first champions with Ware runners-up. Bishop's Stortford (who eventually joined the Spartan League in 1929) and Hoddesdon Town were also among the six participants in that first season. Three championships followed in three seasons before Ware looked to friendlies list to increase the quality of the opposition rather than League fare. The policy did not work and they returned to the League in 1902 and four championships in five seasons. They were Herts County League Eastern Division champions in 1908/09.

The immediate pre-war seasons saw Ware on the move and in the County League they came into contact with several Clubs which were later to join the Spartan League. Among the early participants were Hertford Town, having grown out of a number of different sides in the town, in particular Hertford Blue Cross and Hertford Rovers. Hertford were Eastern Division runners-up in 1909 with Hoddesdon among the participants. Playing off against the other divisions' winners, Ware won the competition by beating Welwyn and drawing 4-4 with another new Club, St Albans City who were also Spartan League members that season.

In 1910 Ware again qualified for the League championship 'play-off', but this time St Albans were victorious, with Leavesden Asylum winning the 1913-championship play-off with Ware bottom of the three participants. The last pre-war season saw Hertford Town win the East Herts League from Hoddesdon second, with the places reversed in the contemporaneous Eastern Division of the Herts County League.

In the post war period prior to joining the Spartan League Ware, Letchworth Town, Bishop's Stortford, Hoddesdon Town were all in Herts County League competition. Ware won the North and Eastern section championship in 1922 with Letchworth as runners-up, the positions being reversed the following season. Hoddesdon and Ware final County League placings before joining the Spartan League were 5th and 6th respectively in an eleven-club table headed up by Welwyn.

The F.A.Cup 1925/26, saw eventual Spartan League champions GER beaten in a First Qualifying Round replay by Grays Athletic. There were wins, however, for newcomers Colchester Town who beat Kings Lynn 1-0, and Botwell Mission, 6-2 victors at Slough. There were some big defeats though -Wood Green lost 10-1 to Isthmians Leytonstone, while Berkhamsted Town went down 8-1 to Hampstead Town. Colchester recorded a 9-0 win in the next round at home to Norwich Priory Athletic, while Botwell Mission won at Newbury Town. Both were Divisional final losers - Botwell Mission lost 5-3 to Windsor and Eton, while it was Colchester's turn to concede nine, going down with just one goal to show for their efforts to Southern Amateur League side Cambridge Town.

That same season Chesham and Botwell Mission were F.A. Amateur Cup First Round losers, but GER beat Northampton Nomads 3-1 before taking mighty London Caledonians to a replay in Round 2.

Division Two Section A side Apsley beat Cheshunt 3-1 in the Herts Senior Cup Final and they also won the Herts Charity Shield beating newcomers Ware. Chesham United won the Berks and Bucks Senior Cup. Botwell Mission won both the Middlesex Senior Cup and the county's Charity Cup.

1926 saw three newcomers, all to Division Two, although two of them lasted only one season. That season saw F.A.Cup First Qualifying Round wins for Colchester, GER, Wealdstone, and eventual champions Maidenhead (7-1 v Hounslow), while Slough beat Isthmians Wycombe Wanderers 9-0. Maidenhead entertained Slough in the next round but lost 4-1. Only Colchester Town made progress: They played Cambridge Town, who had recorded ten goals in an earlier round, and won, to go into the divisional finals where they lost to Lowestoft Town. Slough meantime won again, their 4-1 win over Newbury Town. Barnet hosted Slough in the Fourth Qualifying Round and won 3-1.

Botwell Mission beat Chesham by the odd goal in seven in the Amateur Cup First Round while Maidenhead beat Slough in another all-Spartan tie. Walthamstow Avenue and GER were First Round losers. Botwell Mission fell to Dulwich Hamlet in the next round but Maidenhead made progress beating Bromley before going down to eventual winners, Athenian Leaguers Barking Town.

Berkhamstead Town beat Ware at Apsley in the Division Two play-off for a Division One place in front of a 2,000 crowd. Newcomers Watford Old Boys of Division Two Section A beat Section B Champions Ware in the Herts Senior Cup Final at St Albans in front of a 3,000 crowd. Ware, however, won the county's Charity Shield. Slough won the Berks and Bucks Senior Cup. Leighton United also of Division Two Section A, won the Bedfordshire Senior Cup.

For 1927/28 there were four new clubs, including Welwyn Garden City from the Beds and District County League

There were a large number of F.A.Cup Preliminary Round wins 1927/28 with Colchester scoring seven and Maidenhead nine. In the First Qualifying Round Colchester, Chesham, Maidenhead (who beat Slough) were all winners, with eventual League champions Botwell Mission beating Newbury Town 12-1. In the next round, for the third consecutive season Colchester came up against Cambridge Town, but this time they lost in a replay watched by nearly 3,000 people. Botwell Mission won at Hounslow by the odd goal in nine, while Maidenhead beat Cowley who had also scored twelve in the previous round. Maidenhead hosted their Divisional final tie, but visitors Botwell Mission won 6-1.

Botwell Mission then beat Grays Athletic to become the first Spartan League side to reach the competition proper. This was the first season where Football League Division One and Division Two clubs were exempt until the Third Round proper and, therefore, the Qualifying competition survivors went into the draw with just the League Division Three sides. It was, none the less, a significant achievement for the Spartan League. Peterborough & Fletton United came down to London for the tie and went home with a 4-3 victory.

In the Amateur Cup that season there were no survivors of the First Round Proper, Maidenhead and Chesham being the League's only representatives. Watford Old Boy retained the Herts Senior Cup by beating Baldock Town in the final. Newcomer's Welwyn Garden City beat Hoddesdon Town in the Herts Charity Shield Final. Maidenhead United won the Berks and Bucks Senior Cup, beating Wycombe Wanderers at Slough 1-0 at which there was a 8,000 plus attendance, to make it a hat-trick of Spartan League wins, each of the triumph being achieved by different clubs.

Return to regional divisions

For the 1928/29 campaign there were fifteen new clubs, one bringing their Reserve team with them, with the competition split into an Eastern Section and a Western Section each of two divisions. Longer-standing members Maidenhead United also brought in their Reserve team. Wealdstone, 4th in 1927/28 left to join the Athenian League, taking their Reserves with them. Metropolitan Police, the Middlesex Senior Cup holders, won the Eastern Section championship at the first attempt (and overall League champions) while their Reserves won the Eastern Section Division Two. 1928 had seen Old Latymerians, who since their name change for 1922/23 had never improved upon their 11th position achieved that season. The Reserve sides of neither Wood Green nor GER Romford reappeared for the new season.

Among the new clubs were Leagrave and District, who had been Bedfordshire and District League runners up to Waterlows Athletic in 1926 and champions in 1927. They had been Bedfordshire Senior Cup winners in 1926 but in the season before joining the Spartan League had played in the Northamptonshire League Division One only to finish bottom of the table.

Other new clubs included Crittall Athletic from Braintree who were Essex and Suffolk Border League runners-up in the previous season. Founded in 1898 as Manor Works they became Crittall Athletic in 1921 when they were North Essex League members. Moved to Cressing Road in 1923, they played there throughout their Spartan League membership and beat Ipswich Town in the F.A. Amateur Cup qualifying competition in 1927/28 as well as reaching the Essex Senior Cup semi-finals. Brentwood & Warley were another newcomer and were runners-up to Shoeburyness Garrison in the South Essex League in 1928 and third in the Romford League Premier Division. From the Great Western Suburban League came Cowley who had won the Oxfordshire Senior Cup five times since the Great War.

1928/29, saw a F.A.Cup second Qualifying Round draw between Wood Green and Chesham, but Slough won the replay 9-0. Walthamstow Avenue also won in their Second Qualifying Round tie putting two Spartan Clubs into the Divisional finals. Walthamstow needed a replay and extra time to beat Grays Athletic. Chesham United needed a second replay to beat Finchley. The Fourth Qualifying Round saw both Spartans fall, Avenue, 5-0 in a replay against Ilford, and Chesham at Southall.

Chesham also did well in the F.A. Amateur Cup in 1928/29. In the competition proper they beat St Albans City before going out to Southwick. Colchester Town meantime lost 7-1 to Barnet, while Aylesbury lost at Wycombe Wanderers in front of 4,000, with Maidenhead United losing 4-2 to Hampstead Town. Isthmian League Ilford were competition winners that season.

Apsley were Herts Senior Cup runners-up while League newcomers Hitchin Town beat Letchworth Town in the county's Charity Shield. Chesham United won the Berks & Bucks Senior Cup and Botwell Mission lifted the Middlesex Charity Cup.

For 1929/30 there was further re-structuring with the establishment of a Premier Division for the first time. This comprised 14 clubs all of whom were existing Spartan League members. In the competition as a whole there were six new clubs, with four longer-standing members bringing in their Reserve teams. Three of the previous season's newcomers dropped out after that one season, including the Metropolitan Police Reserve side.

Finchley Reserves ended a four season association with the League, their membership being unusual in that they were the only club ever to have their Reserve team in membership while the first team were not in the League, Finchley being in the London League. In 1929 Finchley joined the Athenian League as did Walthamstow Avenue whose Reserves also left the Spartan League. Botwell Mission changed their name to Hayes for 1929/30 season and their Reserves came into the League for the first time.

Among the newcomers were Letchworth Town from the Bedfordshire & District League, a competition which was renamed the South Midland League for the 1929/30 season. Letchworth had been founder members of that competition in 1922 (Luton Clarence were among fellow founders).

1929/30 saw F.A.Cup First Qualifying Round wins for Colchester Town, Chesham United, Maidenhead United, and newcomers Eastbourne Old Comrades. Maidenhead, 6-1 winners over Witney Town, were the only survivors of the next round and in the Divisional final they beat Hampstead Town 6-0. Nunhead beat them 3-0 in the Fourth Qualifying Round.

Chesham did well in the F.A. Amateur Cup again, beating Kings Lynn and Nunhead before going out in the last sixteen, 2-0 at Dulwich Hamlet. Nunhead had already beaten the only other Spartan League side in the competition proper, Berkhamsted Town 10-0. Eventual champions Metropolitan Police, also reached the last 16, beating Bromley and Enfield before losing at Wimbledon 2-1.

Division One side Apsley was Herts Senior Cup finalists for the second consecutive season. Maidenhead United won the Bucks Senior Cup to make it five Spartan League winners on the trot.

Metropolitan Police retained the championship in 1929/30, which ends the period under review. Hayes were elected to the Athenian League during the close season which marked the start of a very successful period for them including reaching the Amateur Cup semi-finals in 1931 and being Athenian League runners-up in 1932.

THOMAS H. KIRKUP

Joint Spartan League founder - 1907

Thomas H. Kirkup was born in Durham in 1864. He was Honorary Secretary of the South Essex League, and was elected a member of the Essex County FA Executive the following year.

At the end of 1896 he was co-opted as a member of Division 3 of the London FA. Later after helping co found the Essex Branch Referees Association, he was elected to the Council of the London FA, and in 1898 resigned from the Essex County FA on being appointed as Divisional Secretary, London FA.

He became a clerk with Charles Squire (then London FA Secretary), and succeeded him as Secretary of the London FA in 1903. In May 1904 he was appointed to the Council of the Football Association.

He was also one of the founders of the Isthmian League in 1905, and assisted in the formation of the Football Combination in 1915, remaining as Secretary.

THOMAS KYLE

Chairman

1907

Thomas Kyle of Aylesbury was a member of the Football association for 23 years and a member of the Berks & Bucks FA Council for 25 years, during the course which he was Chairman from 1899 to 1919 and, Hon. Treasurer in 1924.

He was the first Chairman of Aylesbury United FC, and a Vice-President of the Aylesbury & District League. Thomas Kyle was a referee, was Chairman of the Bucks Charity Cup committee, and served on the Committee of the Bucks Playing Fields Association. He was closely associated with the Vale of Aylesbury Athletic Club.

J.R. "DICK" SCHUMACHER

Joint Spartan League founder - 1907

Hon. Secretary & Treasurer - 1907-1922

Vice Chairman - 1927

Dick Schumacher was a schoolmaster, and represented St.Marks College on the London FA Council. He was elected to the Council in 1897, and was the first Referees Secretary from 1900-1905. From 1905 to the First World War he was a Vice President of the London FA. He was Referees and Fixture Secretary of the Isthmian League from 1909-1926, when he was created a life member. He was in charge of the FA Cup final, in 1911-12 between Barnsley and West Bromwich Albion at Crystal Palace, and in the replay at Bramall Lane, Sheffield when Barnsley won 1-0 in extra time. Dick Schumacher was President of the Walthamstow & District League and Chairman of the London Commercial League.

R.M. PRICE Hon. Secretary - 1927

W.J. "BILL" HERYET Hon. Secretary - 1927 Hon. Treasurer - 1928

Joint Hon. Match & Press Secretary - 1919-1929

"Bill Heryet" was associated with the League from 1909, firstly as Secretary of Tufnell Park, and later representing Tufnell Spartans (later Wood Green).

He was largely associated with the development of the League, and held office firstly as joint Match & Press Secretary from 1919, then as Secretary in 1927, and Treasurer the following year. He was elected to the Middlesex County FA in 1925, a member of the Football Association and a Director of Tottenham Hotspur FC.

L.P. MORRISON Hon. Referees Secretary - 1909-1922

W. GRAHAM Hon. Assistant Referees Secretary - 1924

R. DAVEY Joint Hon. Match & Press Secretary - 1919

REG F. WELLS

Joint Hon. Match & Press Secretary - 1929

Reg Wells commenced his association with the game as a referee, which he held until 1923. In 1921 he assisted in founding the Northern Suburban League, of which he was Hon. Registration Secretary.
